

NORTHWEST CORNER SECTION 19, TOWNSHIP 15 SOUTH, RANGE 10 EAST

- 1) ON PAGE 29 OF THE GLO ORIGINAL FIELD NOTES IN THE DRAFTING ROOM IN THE COUNTY ENGINEER'S OFFICE IT STATES THAT **THEY SET A LIMESTONE 20" X 12" X 4"** FOR THE NORTHWEST CORNER OF SECTION 19-15-10 WEST TOWNSHIP BOUNDARY AND ON THE WEST COUNTY LINE AND ON THE NORTH COUNTY LINE; FROM WHICH:
 - 1) A COTTONWOOD TREE 24" IN DIAMETER BEARS S. 85° W. AT 318 LINKS DISTANCE – THIS IS A LONE TREE NEAR THE HEAD OF A DRY CREEK

THE GOVERNMENT SURVEY NOTES SHOWS THE FOLLOWING INFORMATION:

 - 1) 38.61 CHAINS EAST ON THE COUNTY LINE TO THE 16" X 14" X 3" LIMESTONE THEY SET FOR THE 1/4 CORNER BETWEEN SECTIONS 18 & 19-15-10
 - 2) 78.61 CHAINS EAST ON THE COUNTY LINE TO THE 20" X 14" X 3" LIMESTONE THEY SET FOR THE CORNER TO SECTIONS 17, 18, 19 & 20-15-10
 - 3) 40.00 CHAINS SOUTH ON THE WEST TOWNSHIP BOUNDARY AND THE COUNTY LINE TO THE 12" X 12" X 4" LIMESTONE THEY SET FOR THE WEST 1/4 CORNER OF SECTION 19-15-10
 - 4) 80.00 CHAINS SOUTH ON THE WEST TOWNSHIP BOUNDARY AND THE COUNTY LINE TO THE 20" X 16" X 3" LIMESTONE THEY SET FOR THE CORNER TO SECTIONS 19 & 30-15-10

- 2) ALVA J. SMITH, COUNTY SURVEYOR FROM 1900 THROUGH 1906, IN SURVEY NUMBER 22, A **PERMANENT SURVEY** RECORDED IN SURVEY BOOK "E" ON PAGE 203 DATED MAY 2-3, 1901 GAVE NOTICE THAT A SURVEY WILL BE MADE IN SECTION 25, TOWNSHIP 15, RANGE 19 BY F. H. HANNAH, MORRIS COUNTY SURVEYOR, AND THAT HE WOULD ATTEND AND WITNESS THE SURVEY IN THE INTEREST OF THE RESIDENTS OF LYON COUNTY, SAID THAT HE DID **NOT** FIND THE STONE AT THE NORTHWEST CORNER OF SECTION 19-15-10 AT THE TOWNSHIP CORNER ON THE LYON, MORRIS, AND WABAUNSEE COUNTY LINE ON THIS **PERMANENT SURVEY**. THERE IS ADDITIONAL INFORMATION IN PACKET "M 52" IN MISCELLANEOUS DRAWER NUMBER 2 IN THE VAULT IN THE COUNTY ENGINEER'S OFFICE.

- 3) ALVA J. SMITH, COUNTY SURVEYOR FROM 1900 THROUGH 1906, IN SURVEY NUMBER 25, A **PERMANENT SURVEY** RECORDED IN SURVEY BOOK "E" ON PAGE 206 DATED AUGUST 1, 1901 TO PERMANENTLY ESTABLISH THE CORNERSTONE AT THE CORNER COMMON TO MORRIS, WABAUNSEE AND LYON COUNTY AT THE NORTHWEST CORNER OF SECTION 19-15-10, SAID THAT HE MET WITH THE COUNTY SURVEYORS OF WABAUNSEE AND MORRIS COUNTY, AND IN CONJUNCTION WITH THEM THEY RESET THIS CORNER ON THIS PERMANENT SURVEY. BY DIGGING THEY FOUND THE STUMP OF A COTTONWOOD WITNESS TREE REFERRED TO IN THE GOVERNMENT FIELD NOTES, FROM WHICH THEY RAN N 85° E A DISTANCE OF 3.18 CHAINS. **THEY SET A 24" X 11" X 5" LIMESTONE THAT IS MARKED "W C" ON THE NORTH FACE FOR WABAUNSEE COUNTY; "L C" ON THE EAST FACE FOR LYON COUNTY; AND "M C" ON THE WEST FACE FOR MORRIS COUNTY FOR THE PERMANENT NORTHWEST CORNER OF SECTION 19-15-10 AT THE TOWNSHIP CORNER ON THE LYON, MORRIS, AND WABAUNSEE COUNTY LINE ON THIS PERMANENT SURVEY**, FROM WHICH:
 - 1) A COTTONWOOD TREE 24" IN DIAMETER SAID TO BE A SPROUT FROM THE ORIGINAL WITNESS TREE BEARS S. 86° W. AT A DISTANCE OF 208 FEET
 - 2) AN ELM TREE 8" IN DIAMETER BEARS N. 32° W. AT A DISTANCE OF 55'-8"
 - 3) AN EAST-WEST FENCE IS 17' SOUTH

- 4) ALVA J. SMITH, COUNTY SURVEYOR FROM 1900 THROUGH 1906, IN SURVEY NUMBER 36, A JOINT **PERMANENT SURVEY** IN CONJUNCTION WITH THE WABAUNSEE COUNTY SURVEYOR RECORDED IN SURVEY BOOK "E" ON PAGE 217

DATED JANUARY 2, 1902 ORDERED BY D. C. HOUCK FOR A PERMANENT SURVEY IN SECTIONS 19 & 20 IN TOWNSHIP 15, RANGE 10, SAID THAT **HE FOUND THE STONE** AT THE NORTHWEST CORNER OF SECTION 19-15-10 AT THE TOWNSHIP CORNER ON THE LYON, MORRIS, AND WABAUNSEE COUNTY LINE ON THIS **PERMANENT SURVEY**.

HIS SURVEY DRAWING SHOWS THE FOLLOWING DISTANCES:

- 1) 2,525' EAST ON THE COUNTY LINE TO THE ORIGINAL GOVERNMENT STONE HE FOUND LOOSE ON THE GROUND AND **HE RESET** FOR THE PERMANENT NORTH 1/4 CORNER OF SECTION 19-15-10
- 2) 3,833' EAST ON THE COUNTY LINE TO THE 3" X 12" X 15" STONE HE SET FOR THE PERMANENT NORTHWEST CORNER OF THE E1/2 OF THE NE1/4 OF SECTION 19-15-10
- 3) 5,141' EAST ON THE COUNTY LINE TO THE ORIGINAL GOVERNMENT STONE HE FOUND LOOSE ON THE GROUND AND **HE RESET** FOR THE PERMANENT NORTHWEST CORNER OF SECTION 20-15-10
- 4) 7,732' EAST ON THE COUNTY LINE TO THE 9" X 12" X 15" STONE HE SET FOR THE PERMANENT NORTH 1/4 CORNER OF SECTION 20-15-10
- 5) 10,323' EAST ON THE COUNTY LINE TO THE GOVERNMENT STONE HE FOUND AT THE NORTHEAST CORNER OF SECTION 20-15-10
