

CENTER 1/4 CORNER SECTION 20, TOWNSHIP 15 SOUTH, RANGE 10 EAST

- 1) ALVA J. SMITH, COUNTY SURVEYOR FROM 1900 THROUGH 1906, IN SURVEY NUMBER 36, A JOINT **PERMANENT SURVEY** IN CONJUNCTION WITH THE WABAUNSEE COUNTY SURVEYOR RECORDED IN SURVEY BOOK "E" ON PAGE 217 DATED JANUARY 2, 1902 ORDERED BY D. C. HOUCK FOR A PERMANENT SURVEY IN SECTIONS 19 & 20 IN TOWNSHIP 15, RANGE 10, SAID THAT **HE SET A 5" X 12" X 30" STONE** FOR THE PERMANENT CENTER 1/4 CORNER OF SECTION 20-15-10 AT THE INTERSECTION OF THE LINES FROM THE OPPOSITE 1/4 CORNERS ON THIS **PERMANENT SURVEY**. HE SAID THAT THE STONE STANDS ON A STEEP BANK, AND A 5" DIAMETER ELM TREE BEARS N. 45° E. AT FOUR FEET DISTANCE.
HIS SURVEY NOTES/DRAWING SHOWS THE FOLLOWING INFORMATION:
- 1) 1,300 FEET EAST TO THE 6" X 9" X 20" STONE HE SET FOR THE PERMANENT SOUTHEAST CORNER OF THE W1/2 OF THE NE1/4 OF SECTION 20-15-10
 - 2) 2,600' EAST TO THE STONE HE FOUND LOOSE ON THE GROUND AND **HE RESET** FOR THE PERMANENT EAST 1/4 CORNER OF SECTION 20-15-10
