

SOUTHWEST CORNER SECTION 31, TOWNSHIP 15 SOUTH, RANGE 10 EAST

- 1) ON PAGE 1 OF THE GLO ORIGINAL FIELD NOTES IN THE DRAFTING ROOM IN THE COUNTY ENGINEER'S OFFICE IT STATES THAT **THEY SET A LIMESTONE 28" X 9" X 5"** ON LEVEL PRAIRIE NEAR TIMBER FOR THE SOUTHWEST CORNER OF SECTION 31-15-10 ON THE 3RD STANDARD PARALLEL AND THE WEST COUNTY LINE ON OCTOBER 1, 1855, FROM WHICH:
 - 1) A BURR OAK TREE 9" IN DIAMETER BEARS N. 52 1/2° E. AT 43 LINKS DISTANCE
 - 2) A BURR OAK TREE 18" IN DIAMETER BEARS S. 77 1/2° E. AT 98 LINKS DISTANCE
 - 3) NO OTHER TREES CONVENIENT TO MARK

THE GOVERNMENT SURVEY NOTES SHOW THE FOLLOWING INFORMATION:

 - 1) 40.00 CHAINS EAST ON THE 3RD STANDARD PARALLEL TO THE 24" X 23" X 2" LIMESTONE THEY SET FOR THE SOUTH 1/4 CORNER OF SECTION 31-15-10
 - 2) 80.00 CHAINS EAST ON THE 3RD STANDARD PARALLEL TO THE 20" X 11" X 4" LIMESTONE THEY SET FOR THE CORNER TO SECTIONS 31 & 32-15-10

- 2) D. T. McAULEY, COUNTY SURVEYOR FROM 1867 TO 1870, IN SURVEY NUMBER 3 RECORDED IN SURVEY BOOK "A" ON PAGE 96 DATED JANUARY 1868 TO SURVEY PART OF R. McMILLAN'S LAND, BEING THE ASCERTAINING THAT THE 1/4 CORNER ON THE NORTH SIDE OF SECTION 31-15-10 WAS WHERE THE GOVERNMENT SURVEYORS PLACE IT, SAID THAT **HE FOUND THE STONE** AT THE SOUTHWEST CORNER OF SECTION 31-15-10 AT THE TOWNSHIP CORNER ON THE LYON AND MORRIS COUNTY LINE AND THE 3RD STANDARD PARALLEL ON THIS SURVEY.

HIS SURVEY NOTES/DRAWING SHOWS THE FOLLOWING INFORMATION:

 - 1) 40.00 CHAINS NORTH ON THE RANGE LINE AND COUNTY LINE TO THE STONE HE FOUND AT THE WEST 1/4 CORNER OF SECTION 31-15-10
 - 2) 80.00 CHAINS NORTH ON THE RANGE LINE AND COUNTY LINE TO THE STONE HE FOUND AT THE NORTHWEST CORNER OF SECTION 31-15-10
