

WEST 1/4 CORNER SECTION 19, TOWNSHIP 15 SOUTH, RANGE 11 EAST

- 1) ON PAGE 28 OF THE GLO ORIGINAL FIELD NOTES IN THE DRAFTING ROOM IN THE COUNTY ENGINEER'S OFFICE IT STATES THAT **THEY SET A LIMESTONE 16" X 14" X 3"** FOR THE WEST 1/4 CORNER OF SECTION 19-15-11 ON THE WEST TOWNSHIP BOUNDARY.
THE GOVERNMENT SURVEY NOTES SHOW THE FOLLOWING INFORMATION:
 - 1) 40.00 CHAINS NORTH ON THE WEST TOWNSHIP BOUNDARY TO THE 18" X 12" X 3" LIMESTONE THEY SET FOR THE NORTHWEST CORNER OF SECTION 19-15-11 ON THE COUNTY LINE
 - 2) 40.00 CHAINS SOUTH ON THE WEST TOWNSHIP BOUNDARY TO THE 20" X 14" X 3" LIMESTONE THEY SET FOR THE CORNER TO SECTIONS 19 & 30-15-11

- 2) MATTHEW BROWN, DEPUTY COUNTY SURVEYOR, FOR R. H. EDMISTON, COUNTY SURVEYOR FROM 1884 TO 1887, IN SURVEY NUMBER 72, AN **AGREEMENT SURVEY** FOR GEORGE MOSS AND GEORGE W, GORMAN TO SURVEY AND SUBDIVIDE PARTS OF SECTIONS 19, 20 30 & 31 IN TOWNSHIP 15, RANGE 11 RECORDED IN SURVEY BOOK "E" ON PAGE 72 BUT NOT DATED, SAID THAT **HE FOUND THE STONE** AT THE EAST 1/4 CORNER OF SECTION 24-15-10 ON THE RANGE LINE ON THIS **AGREEMENT SURVEY**. THIS SURVEY WAS RECORDED IN MISCELLANEOUS VOLUME 41 ON PAGE 25 IN THE REGISTER OF DEEDS OFFICE ON JANUARY 27, 1887 WITH THE NOTATION THAT IT WAS SURVEYED OCTOBER 27 & 28 AND NOVEMBER 6-8, 1884, WITH A COPY OF THIS SURVEY FILED AS SURVEY F19001 IN THE SURVEY FILE FOR TOWNSHIP 15-11. HE USED THE STONE THAT HE FOUND AT THIS CORNER AND THE STONES THAT HE FOUND AT THE NORTHEAST CORNER OF SECTION 24-15-10, THE EAST 1/4 CORNER OF SECTION 25-15-10, AND HE SOUTHEAST CORNER OF SECTION 25-15-10 TO ESTABLISH THE RANGE LINE.

- 3) C. H. RICE, DEPUTY COUNTY SURVEYOR, IN AN **INFORMAL SURVEY** RECORDED IN SURVEY BOOK "D" ON PAGE 156 DATED MAY 29, 1883 AT THE REQUEST OF C. KELLNER TO ESTABLISH THE CENTER CORNER AND THE 1/8TH CORNERS ON THE NORTH AND SOUTH LINES OF THE SOUTHEAST 1/4 OF SECTION 25-15-10, SAID THAT **HE FOUND THE STONE** AT THE EAST 1/4 CORNER OF SECTION 24-15-10 ON THE RANGE LINE ON THIS **INFORMAL SURVEY**.
HIS SURVEY NOTES SHOW THE FOLLOWING INFORMATION:
 - 1) 39.97-1/3 CHAINS SOUTH ON THE RANGE LINE TO THE LOCATION FOR THE NORTHEAST CORNER OF SECTION 25-15-10
 - 2) 79.94-2/3 CHAINS SOUTH ON THE RANGE LINE TO THE STONE HE SET FOR THE EAST 1/4 CORNER OF SECTION 25-15-10
 - 3) 119.92 CHAINS SOUTH ON THE RANGE LINE TO THE STONE HE SET FOR THE SOUTHEAST CORNER OF SECTION 25-15-10

- 4) R. H. EDMISTON, COUNTY SURVEYOR FROM 1884 TO 1887, IN SURVEY NUMBER 28, A **PERMANENT SURVEY** RECORDED IN SURVEY BOOK "E" ON PAGE 28 DATED APRIL 29-MAY 1, 1884 AT THE ORDER OF CASPER KELLNER TO SURVEY THE SOUTHWEST 1/4 OF SECTION 25-15-10, SAID THAT **HE FOUND THE STONE** AT THE EAST 1/4 CORNER OF SECTION 24-15-10 ON THE RANGE LINE. HE USED THIS STONE AND THE STONE THAT HE FOUND AT THE NORTHEAST CORNER OF SECTION 24-15-10 ON THE RANGE LINE AND THE LYON AND WABAUNSEE COUNTY LINE TO SET A STONE FOR THE PERMANENT NORTHEAST CORNER OF SECTION 25-15-10 ON THE RANGE LINE ON THIS **PERMANENT SURVEY**.

- 5) ALVA J. SMITH, COUNTY SURVEYOR FROM 1900 THROUGH 1906, IN SURVEY NUMBER 117, A ROAD SURVEY RECORDED IN SURVEY BOOK "F" ON PAGE 198 DATED MAY 28, 1905 FOR L. N. NANCE, PRINCIPAL PETITIONER FOR A ROAD ON THE LYON AND WABAUNSEE COUNTY LINE IN TOWNSHIP 15, RANGES 10 & 11,

SAID THAT **HE AND WABAUNSEE COUNTY SURVEYOR W. S. WHITLOCK FOUND THE STONE UNDER A FENCE AND ABOUT 20 FEET WEST OF A FENCE CORNER** AT THE WEST 1/4 CORNER OF SECTION 19-15-11 ON THE RANGE LINE ON THIS ROAD SURVEY ON THE COUNTY LINE.

HIS SURVEY NOTES/DRAWING SHOWS THE FOLLOWING DISTANCES:

- 1) 40.17 CHAINS NORTH ON THE RANGE LINE TO THE 15" X 7" X 3" STONE THEY SET FOR THE NORTHWEST CORNER OF SECTION 19-15-11 ON THE LYON AND WABAUNSEE COUNTY LINE FOR THE ROAD EXTENDING EAST AND WEST ON THE COUNTY LINE
 - 2) 80.33 CHAINS NORTH ON THE RANGE LINE TO THE STONE THEY FOUND AT THE WEST 1/4 CORNER OF SECTION 18-15-11 IN WABAUNSEE COUNTY
 - 3) 120.49 CHAINS NORTH ON THE RANGE LINE TO THE STONE THEY FOUND AT THE NORTHWEST CORNER OF SECTION 18-15-11 IN WABAUNSEE COUNTY
- 6) ALVA J. SMITH, COUNTY SURVEYOR FROM 1900 THROUGH 1906, IN A ROAD SURVEY FOR ROAD NUMBER 597 RECORDED IN ROAD RECORD BOOK "D" ON PAGES 257 THROUGH 260 PETITIONED BY L. N. NANCE AND OTHERS FOR A ROAD ON THE LYON AND WABAUNSEE COUNTY LINE IN TOWNSHIPS 15-10 AND 15-11 [PACKET 744 IN THE VAULT IN THE COUNTY SURVEYOR'S OFFICE] THAT HE SURVEYED ON MAY 28, 1905, WAS GRANTED AS A 50 FOOT WIDE ROAD, 25 FEET EACH SIDE OF THE COUNTY LINE, ON APRIL 6, 1905 AS NOTED BY W. H. MAPES, CHAIRMAN OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS, AND ATTESTED BY W. F. EGGERS, COUNTY CLERK, SAID THAT **HE AND WABAUNSEE COUNTY SURVEYOR W. S. WHITLOCK FOUND THE STONE UNDER A FENCE AND ABOUT 20 FEET WEST OF A FENCE CORNER** AT THE WEST 1/4 CORNER OF SECTION 19-15-11 ON THE RANGE LINE ON THIS ROAD SURVEY ON THE COUNTY LINE. THEY RAN THE RANGE LINE FROM THE STONE THAT THEY FOUND AT THIS CORNER NORTH TO THE STONE THAT THEY FOUND AT THE WEST 1/4 CORNER OF SECTION 18-15-11 AND THE STONE THAT THEY FOUND AT THE NORTHWEST CORNER OF SECTION 18-15-11 TO SET THE 15" X 7" X 3" STONE FOR THE NORTHWEST CORNER OF SECTION 19-15-11.

HIS SURVEY NOTES/DRAWING SHOWS THE FOLLOWING INFORMATION:

- 1) 40.17 CHAINS NORTH ON THE RANGE LINE TO THE 15" X 7" X 3" STONE THEY SET FOR THE NORTHWEST CORNER OF SECTION 19-15-11 ON THE LYON AND WABAUNSEE COUNTY LINE FOR THE ROAD EXTENDING EAST AND WEST ON THE COUNTY LINE
- 2) 80.33 CHAINS NORTH ON THE RANGE LINE TO THE STONE THEY FOUND AT THE WEST 1/4 CORNER OF SECTION 18-15-11 IN WABAUNSEE COUNTY
- 3) 120.49 CHAINS NORTH ON THE RANGE LINE TO THE STONE THEY FOUND AT THE NORTHWEST CORNER OF SECTION 18-15-11 IN WABAUNSEE COUNTY
