

**WEST 1/4 CORNER SECTION 28, TOWNSHIP 15 SOUTH, RANGE 11 EAST**

- 1) ON PAGE 279 OF THE GLO ORIGINAL FIELD NOTES IN THE DRAFTING ROOM IN THE COUNTY ENGINEER'S OFFICE IT STATES THAT **THEY SET A LIMESTONE 16" X 12" X 3"** FOR THE 1/4 CORNER BETWEEN SECTIONS 28 & 29-15-11.
  
- 2) ALVA J. SMITH, COUNTY SURVEYOR FROM 1900 THROUGH 1906, IN SURVEY NUMBER 137, A ROAD SURVEY RECORDED IN SURVEY BOOK "F" ON PAGE 218 DATED OCTOBER 10, 1905 FOR G. H. GILDNER, PRINCIPAL PETITIONER, FOR A 40 FOOT WIDE ROAD IN TOWNSHIP 15, RANGE 11, SAID THAT HE FOUND A FENCE ON THIS ROAD SURVEY BUT HE DID **NOT** MENTION THAT HE FOUND A STONE AT THE EAST 1/4 CORNER OF SECTION 29-15-11.  
HIS SURVEY NOTES SHOWS THE FOLLOWING INFORMATION:
  - 1) 39.93 CHAINS NORTH TO THE STONE HE FOUND AT THE NORTHEAST CORNER OF SECTION 29-15-11, AT 30 FEET SOUTH OF A STONE WALL AND ON LINE WITH A FENCE TO THE SOUTH
  - 2) 40.02 CHAINS SOUTH TO THE STONE HE FOUND AT THE NORTHWEST CORNER OF SECTION 33-15-11
  - 3) 119.86 CHAINS SOUTH TO INTERSECT THE 3<sup>RD</sup> STANDARD PARALLEL – BUT HE DID **NOT** MENTION THAT HE FOUND A STONE AT THE SOUTHWEST CORNER OF SECTION 33-15-11 ON THE 3<sup>RD</sup> STANDARD PARALLEL
