

NORTH 1/4 CORNER SECTION 29, TOWNSHIP 15 SOUTH, RANGE 11 EAST

- 1) ON PAGES 282 & 283 OF THE GLO ORIGINAL FIELD NOTES IN THE DRAFTING ROOM IN THE COUNTY ENGINEER'S OFFICE IT STATES THAT **THEY SET A LIMESTONE 14" X 12" X 4"** FOR THE 1/4 CORNER BETWEEN SECTIONS 20 & 29-15-11 AT 40.00 CHAINS EAST OF THE NORTHWEST CORNER AND 10.40 CHAINS WEST OF THE STONE AT THE CORNER TO FRACTIONAL SECTIONS 28 & 29-15-11 ON THE KANSAS INDIAN RESERVE. [NOTE: THE STONE AT THE CORNER ON THE KANSAS INDIAN RESERVE IS A LIMESTONE 20" X 10" X 2-1/2" AND SET ON PAGE 280 OF THE FIELD NOTES.]

THE GOVERNMENT SURVEY NOTES SHOW THE FOLLOWING INFORMATION:

- 1) 10.40 CHAINS EAST TO THE 20" X 10" X 2-1/2" LIMESTONE THEY SET AT THE INTERSECTION OF THE EAST BOUNDARY OF THE KANSAS RESERVE
 - 2) 39.20 CHAINS EAST TO THE 20" X 8" X 2-1/2" LIMESTONE THEY SET FOR THE CORNER TO SECTIONS 20, 21, 28 & 29-15-11
 - 3) 40.00 CHAINS WEST TO THE 24" X 12" X 3" LIMESTONE THEY SET FOR THE CORNER TO SECTIONS 19, 20, 29 & 30-15-11
- 2) ALVA J. SMITH, COUNTY SURVEYOR FROM 1900 THROUGH 1906, IN SURVEY NUMBER 63, A **PERMANENT SURVEY** RECORDED IN SURVEY BOOK "F" ON PAGE 142 AND DATED JANUARY 6, 1903, ORDERED BY G. H. FILNER FOR THE PURPOSE OF LOCATING AND PERMANENTLY ESTABLISHING THE CORNERS AND BOUNDARIES AND SUBDIVISIONS OF SECTION 29 AND SECTION 32 IN TOWNSHIP 15, RANGE 11, AND RUN SUCH LINES AS MAY BE NECESSARY TO PROPERLY COMPLETE THE WORK, SAID THAT **HE SET A 14" X 10" X 3" STONE** FOR THE PERMANENT NORTH 1/4 CORNER OF SECTION 29-15-11 ON AN EXTENSION OF THE LINE FROM THE STONE THAT HE FOUND AT THE NORTHWEST CORNER OF SECTION 29-15-11 OVER THE STONE THAT HE FOUND AT THE NORTH 1/8TH CORNER OF THE NORTHWEST 1/4 OF SECTION 29-18-11, AND AT THE SAME DISTANCE AS BETWEEN THESE TWO STONES ON THIS **PERMANENT SURVEY**. SEE PACKET "M 137" IN MISCELLANEOUS DRAWER 7 IN THE VAULT IN THE COUNTY ENGINEER'S OFFICE FOR ADDITIONAL INFORMATION ON THIS **PERMANENT SURVEY**.

HIS SURVEY NOTES/DRAWING SHOWS THE FOLLOWING INFORMATION:

- 1) 20.01 CHAINS WEST TO THE STONE HE FOUND AT THE NORTH 1/8TH CORNER OF THE NW1/4 OF SECTION 29-15-11
 - 2) 40.02 CHAINS WEST TO THE STONE HE FOUND AT THE NORTHWEST CORNER OF SECTION 29-15-11
 - 3) 10.40 CHAINS EAST TO THE INTERSECTION OF THE SOUTH LINE OF SECTION 20-15-11 AND THE INDIAN RESERVE LINE AT THE NORTHWEST CORNER OF LOT 4 ON THE NORTH LINE OF THE NE1/4 OF SECTION 29-15-11 AND LOCATED 30 FEET SOUTH OF A STONE WALL – NO MONUMENT MENTIONED
- 3) **COMMISSIONER'S ROAD JOURNAL BOOK "A", PAGE 66**
ON MARCH 1, 1920 A PETITION SIGNED BY S. C. WHITE AND OTHERS FOR THE **VACATION** OF A ROAD IN TOWNSHIP 15-11 WAS PRESENTED TO THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS. THE ROAD WAS VIEWED ON MARCH 1, 1920, AND THE FINAL ORDER WAS ISSUED ON JULY, 1920 TO **VACATE** THE ROAD AS FOLLOWS:
1) BEGINNING ON THE SOUTH LINE OF SECTION 32-15-11 AT THE POINT WHERE THE PARALLEL ROAD BEGINS; THENCE NORTH TWO (2) MILES THROUGH SECTIONS 32 AND 29 AND TERMINATE AT THE NORTH LINE OF SECTION 29-15-11
- 4) IN A SURVEY RECORDED IN SURVEY BOOK "D" ON PAGE 188 DATED JUNE 23 TO 29, 1949, AND WITH "L. M. GOULD SURVEYOR" [LESLIE M. GOULD, L.S 142, COUNTY SURVEYOR FROM 1953 TO 1978] WRITTEN IN PENCIL, APPARENTLY DID **NOT** FIND THE STONE AT THE SOUTH 1/4 CORNER OF SECTION 20-15-11 AS HE RAN THE

SECTION LINES FROM THE "CENTER OF THE COUNTY ROAD AT THE SECTION CORNER" AT THE SOUTHWEST CORNER OF SECTION 20-15-11 EAST TO THE STONE HE FOUND AT THE NORTHWEST CORNER OF SECTION 26-15-11 ON THIS SURVEY.
