

WEST 1/4 CORNER SECTION 30, TOWNSHIP 15 SOUTH, RANGE 11 EAST

- 1) ON PAGE 28 OF THE GLO ORIGINAL FIELD NOTES IN THE DRAFTING ROOM IN THE COUNTY ENGINEER'S OFFICE IT STATES THAT **THEY SET A LIMESTONE 18" X 12" X 3"** FOR THE WEST 1/4 CORNER OF SECTION 30-15-11 ON THE WEST TOWNSHIP BOUNDARY.

THE GOVERNMENT SURVEY NOTES SHOW THE FOLLOWING INFORMATION:

- 1) 40.00 CHAINS NORTH ON THE WEST TOWNSHIP BOUNDARY TO THE 20" X 14" X 3" LIMESTONE THEY SET FOR THE CORNER TO SECTION 19 & 30-15-11
- 2) 40.00 CHAINS SOUTH TO THE 16" X 14" X 3" LIMESTONE THEY SET FOR THE CORNER TO SECTIONS 30 & 31-15-11

- 2) ROBERT MILLIKEN, COUNTY SURVEYOR FROM 1870 TO 1875 AND FROM 1882 TO 1883, IN A ROAD SURVEY RECORDED IN SURVEY BOOK "F" ON PAGE 50 MARCH 20, 1883 FOR A ROAD IN TOWNSHIP 15, RANGES 10 & 11 FOR THEODORE HOELLING, PRINCIPAL PETITIONER, SAID THAT **HE SET A STONE MARKED "R/IM"** AT THE WEST 1/4 CORNER OF SECTION 30-15-11 ON THE RANGE LINE ON THIS ROAD SURVEY. NO WIDTH WAS RECORDED ON THIS ROAD SURVEY.

HIS SURVEY NOTES SHOWS THE FOLLOWING INFORMATION:

- 1) THIS ROAD EXTENDS EAST ON THE 1/2 SECTION LINE TO THE STONE HE FOUND AT THE EAST 1/4 CORNER OF SECTION 30-15-11 TO BEGIN THIS ROAD SURVEY
- 2) THIS ROAD EXTENDS WEST ON THE SECTION LINE TO THE STONE HE FOUND AT THE WEST 1/4 CORNER OF SECTION 25-15-10 AT A TURN TO THE SOUTH ON THIS ROAD SURVEY

- 3) ROBERT MILLIKEN, COUNTY SURVEYOR FROM 1870 TO 1875 AND FROM 1882 TO 1883, IN A ROAD SURVEY FOR ROAD NUMBER 212 RECORDED IN ROAD RECORD BOOK "B" ON PAGES 434 TO 437 PETITIONED BY THEODORE HOELLING AND OTHERS FOR A COUNTY ROAD IN TOWNSHIPS 15-10 AND 15-11 [PACKET 450 IN THE VAULT IN THE COUNTY SURVEYOR'S OFFICE] THAT HE SURVEYED ON MARCH 20, 1883, AND WAS ESTABLISHED AS A 50 FOOT WIDE ROAD ON JULY 6, 1883 AS NOTED BY J. E. JONES, CHAIRMAN OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS AND ATTESTED TO BY WILLIAM F. EWING, COUNTY CLERK, SAID THAT **HE SET A STONE MARKED "R/IM"** AT THE 1/4 ON THE WEST BOUNDARY OF SECTION 30-15-11 ON THE RANGE LINE ON THIS ROAD SURVEY. **[NOTE:** ON PAGE 437 THERE WAS A PETITION BY HENRY ROMER AND OTHERS TO RESURVEY THE ROAD THROUGH THE CENTER OF SECTIONS 25-15-10 AND 30-15-11 TO MORE DEFINITELY LOCATE THE ROAD. THE VIEWERS FAVORED PLACING THE ROAD IN LINE WITH A PERMANENT SURVEY, AND ON JULY 15, 1885 THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS ORDERED THE CORRECTIONS – WARREN CHIP WOODS, L.S. 603, COUNTY SURVEYOR]

THE ORIGINAL SURVEY NOTES SHOWS THE FOLLOWING INFORMATION:

- 1) THE ORIGINAL ROAD EXTENDS EAST ON THE 1/2 SECTION LINE FOR 80 CHAINS TO THE STONE HE FOUND AT THE EAST 1/4 CORNER OF SECTION 30-15-11 TO COMMENCE THIS ROAD SURVEY
- 2) THIS ROAD EXTENDS WEST ON THE 1/2 SECTION LINE FOR 80.70 CHAINS TO THE STONE HE FOUND AT THE WEST 1/4 CORNER OF SECTION 25-15-10; THEN CONTINUES SOUTH ON THE SECTION LINES FOR 1/2 MILE TO THE STONE HE FOUND AT THE SOUTHEAST CORNER OF SECTION 26-15-10; THEN CONTINUES WEST ON THE SECTION LINES FOR 1 MILE TO THE STONE HE FOUND AT THE SOUTHWEST CORNER OF SECTION 26-15-10 AT THE TERMINUS OF THE ORIGINAL ROAD SURVEY

- 4) C. H. RICE, DEPUTY COUNTY SURVEYOR, IN AN **INFORMAL SURVEY** RECORDED IN SURVEY BOOK "D" ON PAGE 156 DATED MAY 29, 1883 AT THE REQUEST OF C. KELLNER TO ESTABLISH THE CENTER CORNER AND THE 1/8TH CORNERS ON THE NORTH AND SOUTH LINES OF THE SOUTHEAST 1/4 OF SECTION 25-15-10, SAID THAT **HE SET A STONE** FOR THE EAST 1/4 CORNER OF SECTION 25-15-10 ON THE RANGE LINE AT THE "PROPER CORRECTION" BETWEEN THE STONE THAT HE SET FOR THE SOUTHEAST CORNER OF SECTION 25-15-10 AND THE STONE THAT HE FOUND AT THE EAST 1/4 CORNER OF SECTION 24-15-10 ON THIS **INFORMAL SURVEY**. **HIS SURVEY NOTES SHOW THE FOLLOWING INFORMATION:**
- 1) 39.97-1/3 CHAINS SOUTH ON THE RANGE LINE TO THE STONE HE SET FOR THE SOUTHEAST CORNER OF SECTION 25-15-10
 - 2) 39.97-1/3 CHAINS NORTH ON THE RANGE LINE TO THE LOCATION FOR THE NORTHEAST CORNER OF SECTION 25-15-10
 - 3) 79.94-2/3 CHAINS NORTH ON THE RANGE LINE TO THE STONE HE FOUND AT THE EAST 1/4 CORNER OF SECTION 24-15-10
 - 4) 80.27 CHAINS WEST TO THE STONE HE FOUND AT THE WEST 1/4 CORNER OF SECTION 25-15-10
- 5) R. H. EDMISTON, COUNTY SURVEYOR FROM 1884 TO 1887, IN SURVEY NUMBER 28, A **PERMANENT SURVEY** RECORDED IN SURVEY BOOK "E" ON PAGE 28 DATED APRIL 29-MAY 1, 1884 AT THE ORDER OF CASPER KELLNER TO SURVEY THE SOUTHWEST 1/4 OF SECTION 25-15-10, SAID THAT **HE SET A STONE** FOR THE PERMANENT EAST 1/4 CORNER OF SECTION 25-15-10 ON THE RANGE LINE AND HALFWAY BETWEEN THE STONE THAT HE SET FOR THE PERMANENT NORTHEAST CORNER OF SECTION 25-15-10 AND THE STONE THAT HE SET FOR THE PERMANENT SOUTHEAST CORNER OF SECTION 25-15-10 ON THIS **PERMANENT SURVEY**. **HIS SURVEY NOTES/DRAWING SHOWS THE FOLLOWING INFORMATION:**
- 1) 2,643.5' NORTH ON THE RANGE LINE TO THE STONE HE SET FOR THE PERMANENT NORTHEAST CORNER OF SECTION 25-15-10
 - 2) 2,643.5' SOUTH ON THE RANGE LINE TO THE STONE HE SET FOR THE PERMANENT SOUTHEAST CORNER OF SECTION 25-15-10
 - 3) 1,321' WEST TO THE STONE HE SET FOR THE PERMANENT NORTH 1/4/4 CORNER OF THE SE1/4 OF SECTION 25-15-10
 - 4) 2,642' WEST TO THE STONE HE SET FOR THE PERMANENT CENTER CORNER OF SECTION 25-15-10
- 6) R. H. EDMISTON, COUNTY SURVEYOR FROM 1884 TO 1887, IN SURVEY NUMBER 100, A ROAD SURVEY RECORDED IN SURVEY BOOK "E" ON PAGE 100 DATED MAY 20, 1885 FOR HENRY ROMEN, PRINCIPAL PETITIONER, TO REVIEW A ROAD THROUGH SECTION 30-15-11 AND SECTION 25-15-10 FORMERLY LOCATED ON THE PETITION OF THEO HOELING, SAID THAT **HE FOUND THE STONE ON THE RANGE LINE** AT THE 1/4 CORNER BETWEEN SECTIONS 30-15-11 AND 25-15-10 ON THIS ROAD SURVEY. **HIS SURVEY NOTES/DRAWING SHOWS THE FOLLOWING INFORMATION:**
- 1) 5,284' WEST TO THE STONE HE FOUND AT THE WEST 1/4 CORNER OF SECTION 25-15-10
 - 2) 50' EAST TO A ROAD STONE MARKED "R/1" HE SET ON THIS ROAD SURVEY
 - 3) 5,311' EAST TO THE STONE HE FOUND AT THE EAST 1/4 CORNER OF SECTION 30-15-11
- 7) R. H. EDMISTON, COUNTY SURVEYOR FROM 1884 TO 1887, IN A ROAD SURVEY FOR ROAD 319 RECORDED IN ROAD RECORD BOOK "C" ON PAGES 226 TO 228 PETITIONED BY G. W. GORMAN AND OTHERS FOR THE VACATION AND LOCATION OF A COUNTY ROAD IN TOWNSHIPS 15-10 AND 15-11 [PACKET 580 IN THE VAULT IN THE COUNTY SURVEYOR'S OFFICE] THAT HE SURVEYED ON DECEMBER 2, 1885, APPARENTLY **FOUND THE STONE** AT THE WEST 1/4 CORNER OF SECTION 30-15-11

ON THE RANGE LINE ON THE ROAD PETITIONED TO BE VACATED ON THIS ROAD SURVEY. THE ROAD TO BE **VACATED** WAS PETITIONED AS COMMENCING AT THE EAST CENTER OF SECTION 30-15-11, THENCE RUNNING WEST TWO MILES TO THE CENTER OF THE WEST SIDE OF SECTION 25-15-10 KNOWN AS THE THEODORE HOELLING ROAD. A PENCIL NOTE UNDER THE DRAWING ON PAGE 227 NOTED: THE PORTION OF THE PETITION ASKING FOR THE VACATION OF THE ROAD IN THE CENTER OF SECTIONS 25-15-10 AND 30-15-11 WAS **REJECTED**. THE ROAD WAS **NOT** VACATED – SEE COMMISSIONERS JOURNAL NUMBER 4 DATED JANUARY 14, 1886.

- 8) MATTHEW BROWN, DEPUTY COUNTY SURVEYOR, FOR R. H. EDMISTON, COUNTY SURVEYOR FROM 1884 TO 1887, IN SURVEY NUMBER 72, AN **AGREEMENT SURVEY** FOR GEORGE MOSS AND GEORGE W, GORMAN TO SURVEY AND SUBDIVIDE PARTS OF SECTIONS 19, 20 30 & 31 IN TOWNSHIP 15, RANGE 11 RECORDED IN SURVEY BOOK “E” ON PAGE 72 BUT NOT DATED, SHOWS ON HIS SURVEY DRAWING THAT **HE FOUND THE STONE** AT THE WEST 1/4 CORNER OF SECTION 30-15-11 ON THE RANGE LINE ON THIS **AGREEMENT SURVEY**. THIS SURVEY WAS RECORDED IN MISCELLANEOUS VOLUME 41 ON PAGE 25 IN THE REGISTER OF DEEDS OFFICE ON JANUARY 27, 1887 WITH THE NOTATION THAT IT WAS SURVEYED OCTOBER 27 & 28 AND NOVEMBER 6-8, 1884, WITH A COPY OF THIS SURVEY FILED AS SURVEY F19001 IN THE SURVEY FILE FOR TOWNSHIP 15-11.
