

**NORTH 1/4 CORNER SECTION 33, TOWNSHIP 15 SOUTH, RANGE 11 EAST**

- 1) ON PAGE 279 OF THE GLO ORIGINAL FIELD NOTES IN THE DRAFTING ROOM IN THE COUNTY ENGINEER'S OFFICE IT STATES THAT **THEY SET A LIMESTONE 16" X 8" X 3"** FOR THE 1/4 CORNER BETWEEN SECTIONS 28 & 33-15-11.  
THE GOVERNMENT SURVEY NOTES SHOW THE FOLLOWING INFORMATION:
  - 1) 39.96-1/2 CHAINS WEST TO THE 32" X 12" X 4" LIMESTONE THEY SET FOR THE CORNER TO SECTIONS 28, 29, 32 & 33-15-11
  - 2) 39.96-1/2 CHAINS EAST TO THE 36" X 14" X 3" LIMESTONE THEY SET FOR THE CORNER TO SECTIONS 27, 28, 33 & 34-15-11
  
- 2) ALVA J. SMITH, COUNTY SURVEYOR FROM 1900 THROUGH 1906, IN SURVEY NUMBER 137, A ROAD SURVEY RECORDED IN SURVEY BOOK "F" ON PAGE 218 DATED OCTOBER 10, 1905 FOR G. H. GILDNER, PRINCIPAL PETITIONER, FOR A 40 FOOT WIDE ROAD IN TOWNSHIP 15, RANGE 11, DID **NOT** MENTION FINDING THE STONE AT THE NORTH 1/4 OF SECTION 33-15-11 AS HE RAN THE SECTION LINES FROM THE STONE THAT HE FOUND AT THE NORTHWEST CORNER OF SECTION 32-15-11 TO BEGIN THIS ROAD SURVEY EAST TO THE STONE THAT HE FOUND AT THE NORTHEAST CORNER OF SECTION 34-15-11 TO END THIS ROAD SURVEY.
  
- 3) ALVA J. SMITH, COUNTY SURVEYOR FROM 1900 THROUGH 1906, IN A ROAD SURVEY RECORDED IN ROAD RECORD BOOK "D" ON PAGES 301 THROUGH 304 FOR ROAD NUMBER 608 BY A PETITION BY C. H. GILDNER [PACKET 740 IN THE VAULT IN THE COUNTY SURVEYOR'S OFFICE] DATED OCTOBER 1905, DID **NOT** MENTION FINDING THE STONE AT THE NORTH 1/4 OF SECTION 33-15-11 AS HE RAN THE SECTION LINES FROM THE STONE THAT HE FOUND AT THE NORTHWEST CORNER OF SECTION 32-15-11 TO BEGIN THIS ROAD SURVEY EAST TO THE STONE HE FOUND AT THE NORTHEAST CORNER OF SECTION 34-15-11 TO END THIS ROAD SURVEY.
