

WEST 1/4 CORNER SECTION 28, TOWNSHIP 15 SOUTH, RANGE 13 EAST

- 1) ON PAGE 595 OF THE GLO ORIGINAL FIELD NOTES IN THE DRAFTING ROOM IN THE COUNTY ENGINEER'S OFFICE IT STATES THAT **THEY SET A LIMESTONE 18" X 16" X 2"** FOR THE 1/4 CORNER BETWEEN SECTIONS 21 & 28-15-13.

- 2) ROBERT MILLIKEN, COUNTY SURVEYOR FROM 1870 TO 1875 AND FROM 1882 TO 1883, IN A **PERMANENT SURVEY** RECORDED IN SURVEY BOOK "D" ON PAGE 162 DATED SEPTEMBER 12 & 13, 1883 BY THE ORDER OF J. W. RULISON TO HAVE SECTION 32-15-13 SUBDIVIDED AND THE NORTHEAST CORNER AND THE 1/4 CORNER ON THE NORTH LINE ESTABLISHED, SAID THAT **HE FOUND THE GOVERNMENT STONE** AT THE WEST 1/4 CORNER OF SECTION 28-15-13 ON THIS **PERMANENT SURVEY**.
HIS SURVEY NOTES/DRAWING SHOWS THE FOLLOWING INFORMATION:
 - 1) 40.04 CHAINS NORTH TO THE GOVERNMENT STONE HE FOUND AT THE NORTH-WEST CORNER OF SECTION 28-15-13
 - 2) 40.03 CHAINS SOUTH TO THE 16" X 12" X 6" STONE HE PROPERLY MARKED AND SET FOR THE PERMANENT SOUTHWEST CORNER OF SECTION 28-15-13
 - 3) 60.24-1/2 CHAINS SOUTH TO THE 15" X 8" X 4" STONE HE SET FOR THE PERMANENT EAST 1/8TH CORNER OF THE NE1/4 OF SECTION 32-15-13
 - 4) 85.84 CHAINS SOUTH TO THE PERMANENT STONE HE SET AT THE INTERSECTION OF THE SECTION LINE AND THE NORTH BOUNDARY OF THE SAC & FOX INDIAN RESERVATION, AT 20 LINKS WEST OF THE STONE HE FOUND ON THE RESERVATION LINE
 - 5) 120.89 CHAINS SOUTH TO THE GOVERNMENT STONE HE FOUND AT THE SOUTHEAST CORNER OF SECTION 32-15-13 ON THE 3RD STANDARD PARALLEL
