

WEST 1/4 CORNER SECTION 07, TOWNSHIP 16 SOUTH, RANGE 10 EAST

- 1) ON PAGE 38 OF THE GLO ORIGINAL FIELD NOTES IN THE DRAFTING ROOM IN THE COUNTY ENGINEER'S OFFICE IT STATES THAT **THEY SET A LIMESTONE 16" X 4" X 3"** FOR THE WEST 1/4 CORNER OF SECTION 7-16-10 ON THE WEST TOWNSHIP BOUNDARY AND THE COUNTY LINE ON DECEMBER 30, 1860.
THE GOVERNMENT SURVEY NOTES SHOW THE FOLLOWING INFORMATION:
 - 1) 40.00 CHAINS NORTH ON THE WEST TOWNSHIP BOUNDARY AND THE COUNTY LINE TO THE 20" X 10" X 4" LIMESTONE THEY SET FOR THE CORNER TO SECTIONS 6 & 7-16-10
 - 2) 40.00 CHAINS SOUTH ON THE WEST TOWNSHIP BOUNDARY AND THE COUNTY LINE TO THE 20" X 11" X 3" LIMESTONE THEY SET FOR THE CORNER TO SECTIONS 7 & 18-16-10

- 2) ALVA J. SMITH, COUNTY SURVEYOR FROM 1900 THROUGH 1906, IN SURVEY NUMBER 5, A **PERMANENT SURVEY** RECORDED IN SURVEY BOOK "E" ON PAGE 185 DATED APRIL 2-4 AND MAY 8-9, 1900 AT THE ORDER OF THE RICHARDS BROTHERS FOR A SURVEY OF THE SOUTHWEST 1/4 OF THE SOUTHWEST 1/4 OF SECTION 6-16-10, SAID THAT HE FOUND A STONE FENCE ON THE WEST LINE OF SECTION 7-16-10 ABOUT WHERE THE 1/4 STONE SHOULD BE, BUT HE DID **NOT** FIND THE STONE AT THE WEST 1/4 CORNER OF SECTION 7-16-10 ON THE RANGE LINE AND THE LYON AND MORRIS COUNTY LINE ON THIS **PERMANENT SURVEY**. THERE IS ADDITIONAL INFORMATION IN PACKET "M 50" IN MISCELLANEOUS DRAWER NUMBER 2 IN THE VAULT IN THE COUNTY ENGINEER'S OFFICE.
HIS SURVEY DRAWING SHOWS THE FOLLOWING INFORMATION:
 - 1) 52.27 CHAINS EAST TO THE STONE MARKED "1/8" HE FOUND ON THE SOUTH LINE OF THE NE1/4 OF SECTION 7-16-10
 - 2) 76.48' EAST TO THE MIDDLE OF THE ROAD ON THE EAST LINE OF SECTION 7-16-10, BUT HE DID **NOT** FIND THE STONE AT THE EAST 1/4 CORNER OF SECTION 7-16-10
