

NORTH 1/4 CORNER SECTION 25, TOWNSHIP 16 SOUTH, RANGE 10 EAST

- 1) ON PAGE 127 OF THE GLO ORIGINAL FIELD NOTES IN THE DRAFTING ROOM IN THE COUNTY ENGINEER'S OFFICE IT STATES THAT **THEY SET A LIMESTONE 16" X 14" X 3"** FOR THE 1/4 CORNER BETWEEN SECTIONS 24 & 25-16-10.
THE GOVERNMENT SURVEY NOTES SHOWS THE FOLLOWING INFORMATION:
 - 1) 40.17 CHAINS WEST TO THE 30" X 10" X 6" LIMESTONE THEY SET FOR THE CORNER TO SECTIONS 23, 24, 25 & 26-16-10
 - 2) 40.17 CHAINS EAST TO THE 22" X 12" X 3" LIMESTONE THEY SET FOR THE CORNER TO SECTIONS 24 & 25-16-10 ON THE EAST TOWNSHIP BOUNDARY

- 2) MATTHEW BROWN, COUNTY SURVEYOR FROM 1888 TO 1900, AND 1914, IN A SURVEY RECORDED IN SURVEY BOOK "F" ON PAGE 135 AND DATED JULY 1888, SAID THAT **HE FOUND THE STONE IN GOOD CONDITION** AT THE NORTH 1/4 CORNER OF SECTION 25-16-10.

- 3) ALVA J. SMITH, COUNTY SURVEYOR FROM 1900 THROUGH 1906, IN SURVEY NUMBER 155, A ROAD SURVEY FOR O. E. McLAHEY RECORDED IN SURVEY BOOK "F" ON PAGE 118 DATED OCTOBER 9, 1906 FOR A ROAD IN TOWNSHIP 16, RANGE 10 ALONG THE EAST SIDE OF BUSHONG, SAID THAT **HE FOUND THE STONE AT 20 FEET NORTH OF A HEDGE CORNER** AT THE SOUTHEAST CORNER OF THE SOUTHWEST 1/4 OF SECTION 24-16-10 TO BEGIN THIS ROAD SURVEY. THE ROAD WAS 40 FEET WIDE, 8 FEET ON THE EAST SIDE AND 32 FEET ON THE WEST SIDE OF THE SECTION LINE AS SURVEYED.
HIS SURVEY NOTES SHOWS THE FOLLOWING INFORMATION:
 - 1) 1,124' NORTH TO THE RAILROAD PIN HE FOUND IN PLACE AT THE SOUTH SIDE OF FIRST STREET IN BUSHONG
 - 2) 1,465' NORTH TO THE SOUTH SIDE OF SECOND STREET IN BUSHONG AND THERE ENDING

- 4) ALVA J. SMITH, COUNTY SURVEYOR FROM 1900 THROUGH 1906, IN A ROAD SURVEY FOR ROAD NUMBER 618 RECORDED IN ROAD RECORD BOOK "D" ON PAGES 341 THROUGH 344 PETITION BY O. E. McLAHEY AND OTHERS FOR A ROAD IN TOWNSHIP 16-10 [PACKET 755 IN THE VAULT IN THE COUNTY SURVEYOR'S OFFICE] THAT HE SURVEYED ON OCTOBER 9, 1906, WAS GRANTED AS A 40 FOOT WIDE ROAD, 8 FEET ON THE EAST SIDE AND 32 FEET ON THE WEST SIDE OF THE SECTION LINE, ON NOVEMBER 8, 1906 AS NOTED BY W. H. MAPES, CHAIRMAN OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS, AND RECORDED ON NOVEMBER 10, 1906 BY ALVA J. SMITH, COUNTY SURVEYOR, SAID THAT **HE FOUND THE STONE AT 20 FEET NORTH OF A HEDGE CORNER** AT THE SOUTHEAST CORNER OF THE SOUTHWEST CORNER OF SECTION 24-16-10 TO BEGIN THIS ROAD SURVEY EXTENDING NORTH TO THE NORTH LINE OF SECOND STREET IN THE TOWN OF BUSHONG.
HIS SURVEY NOTES SHOWS THE FOLLOWING INFORMATION:
 - 1) 1,124' NORTH TO THE RAILROAD PIN HE FOUND IN PLACE AT THE SOUTH SIDE OF FIRST STREET IN BUSHONG
 - 2) 1,465' NORTH TO THE SOUTH SIDE OF SECOND STREET IN BUSHONG AND THERE ENDING
