

NORTH 1/16 CORNER NORTHWEST 1/4 SECTION 31, TOWNSHIP 16 SOUTH, RANGE 10 EAST

- 1) J. H. HIBBEN, COUNTY SURVEYOR FROM 1875 TO 1882, IN A ROAD SURVEY FOR ROAD NUMBER 38 RECORDED IN ROAD RECORD BOOK "A-1" ON PAGES 154 TO 156 PETITION BY W. T KITCHEN AND OTHERS FOR THREE ROADS IN TOWNSHIPS 16-10 AND 17-10 [PACKET 134 IN THE VAULT IN THE COUNTY SURVEYOR'S OFFICE] THAT HE SURVEYED ON SEPTEMBER 2, 1879, WERE ESTABLISHED AT 60 FEET WIDE ON OCTOBER 6, 1879, AND WERE RECORDED ON OCTOBER 6, 1879 BY WILLIAM F. EWING, COUNTY CLERK, SAID THAT **HE FOUND THE STONE** AT THE SOUTHEAST CORNER OF THE SOUTHWEST 1/4 OF THE SOUTHWEST 1/4 OF SECTION 30-16-10 ON THE FIRST AND SECOND ROADS ON THIS ROAD SURVEY. **[NOTE:** AN ENTRY ON PAGE 157 STATES THAT THE PETITION OF C. HOOD TO VACATE THE ROAD FROM THE 1/4 CORNER ON THE COUNTY LINE ON THE WEST LINE OF SECTION 30-16-10 THENCE SOUTH TO THE NORTHWEST CORNER OF THE SOUTHWEST 1/4 OF SECTION 6-17-10, BEING A PART OF THE ROAD GRANTED ON PETITION OF W. T. KITCHEN WAS APPROVED ON APRIL 15, 1884 BY ORDER OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS SIGNED BY J. L. BUTLER, CHAIRMAN PROTEM AND ATTESTED TO BY ROLAND LARKIN, COUNTY CLERK – WARREN CHIP WOODS, LS. 603, COUNTY SURVEYOR]
HIS SURVEY NOTES SHOWS THE FOLLOWING INFORMATION:
 - 1) THE FIRST ROAD EXTENDS NORTHWESTERLY TO THE WEST 1/4 CORNER OF SECTION 30-16-10 ON THE RANGE LINE AND THE LYON AND MORRIS COUNTY LINE TO COMMENCE THE FIRST ROAD ON THIS ROAD SURVEY
 - 2) THE FIRST ROAD EXTENDS EAST ON THE SECTION LINE FOR 3,960' TO THE SOUTHEAST CORNER OF SECTION 30-16-10 AT A TURN TO THE SOUTH ON THE FIRST ROAD ON THIS ROAD SURVEY
 - 3) THE SECOND ROAD ON THIS ROAD SURVEY EXTENDS SOUTHERLY TO THE SOUTHEAST CORNER OF THE NW1/4 OF THE NW1/4 OF SECTION 6-17-10 AT A TURN TO THE SOUTH ON THE SECOND ROAD ON THIS ROAD SURVEY
- 2) R. H. EDMISTON, COUNTY SURVEYOR FROM 1884 TO 1887, IN SURVEY NUMBER 17 RECORDED IN SURVEY BOOK "E" ON PAGE 17 DATED MARCH 11, 1884 FOR A ROAD SURVEY IN TOWNSHIPS 16 & 17, RANGE 10 FOR CALVIN HOOD, PRINCIPAL PETITIONER, SAID THAT **FOUND THE STONE** AT THE SOUTHEAST CORNER OF THE SOUTHWEST 1/4 OF THE SOUTHWEST 1/4 OF SECTION 30-16-10 ON THIS ROAD SURVEY.
- 3) ROBERT MILLIKEN, COUNTY SURVEYOR FROM 1870 TO 1875 AND FROM 1882 TO 1883, IN A ROAD SURVEY FOR ROAD NUMBER 243 RECORDED IN ROAD RECORD BOOK "B" ON PAGES 558 TO 560 PETITIONED BY CALVIN HOOD AND OTHERS FOR THE LOCATION OF A COUNTY ROAD IN TOWNSHIPS 16-10 AND 17-10 [PACKET 505 IN THE VAULT IN THE COUNTY SURVEYOR'S OFFICE] THAT HE SURVEYED ON MARCH 10, 1884, SAID THAT **HE FOUND THE STONE** AT THE SOUTHEAST CORNER OF THE SOUTHWEST 1/4 OF THE SOUTHWEST 1/4 OF SECTION 30-16-10 ON THIS ROAD SURVEY. THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS ORDERED THAT THE ROAD AS PETITIONED BE VACATED AND THAT THE PARTIES BENEFITED BY THIS VACATION PAY TO LYON COUNTY THE COSTS OF THE VIEW, SURVEY, AND VACATION OF SAID ROAD ON APRIL 15, 1884 AS NOTED BY J. L. BUTLER, CHAIRMAN PROTEM OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS, AND RECORDED ON MAY 15, 1884 BY ROLAND LARKIN, COUNTY CLERK.
