

**NORTH 1/16 CORNER NORTHEAST 1/4 SECTION 34, TOWNSHIP 16 SOUTH, RANGE 10 EAST**

- 1) MATTHEW BROWN, COUNTY SURVEYOR FROM 1888 TO 1900, AND 1914, BY J. MAX YINGLING, DEPUTY COUNTY SURVEYOR, IN A ROAD SURVEY FOR ROAD 663 RECORDED IN PERMANENT SURVEY BOOK 1 ON PAGE 82 FOR H. C. SILFIES, PRINCIPAL PETITIONER, FOR THE SURVEY OF A ROAD TO BE LOCATED ON THE SECTION LINE BETWEEN SECTIONS 27 & 34, AND 28 & 33 IN TOWNSHIP 16, RANGE 10, AND THE VACATION OF A PORTION OF THE ROAD IN SECTIONS 27 & 28 OF THE ABOVE TOWNSHIP AND RANGE AS VIEWED BY THE COUNTY COMMISSIONERS ACTING AS VIEWERS AND THE COUNTY SURVEYOR ON SEPTEMBER 2, 1909 AND SURVEYED ON MARCH 29 & 21, 1910 AND ENTERED ON MARCH 31, 1910, SAID THAT **HE PLANTED A 2" 14" X 12" ROAD STONE MARKED "R" ON THE NORTH SIDE** ON THE SECTION LINE AT 1,317 FEET WEST OF THE ROAD STONE HE LOCATED FOR THE SOUTHEAST CORNER OF SECTION 27-16-10- ON THE FIRST ROAD FOR AN ANGLE ON THIS ROAD SURVEY. HE NOTED IN THE UPPER RIGHT CORNER THAT THIS ROAD SURVEY WAS RECORDED IN ROAD RECORD BOOK "E" ON PGE 20. **[NOTE: HE DID NOT CALL THIS ROAD STONE THE 1/16<sup>TH</sup> CORNER, BUT IT IS LISTED HERE TO SHOW THE ORIGIN OF THIS ROAD STONE – WARREN CHIP WOODS, L.S. 603, COUNTY SURVEYOR]**

**HIS SURVEY NOTES/DRAWING SHOWS THE FOLLOWING INFORMATION:**

- 1) THIS ROAD EXTENDS EAST ON THE SECTION LINE FOR 1,317 FEET TO THE 8" X 12" X 15" ROAD STONE MARKED "R" ON THE NORTH SIDE HE PLANTED FOR THE SOUTHEAST CORNER OF SECTION 27-16-10 FOR THE BEGINNING OF THE FIRST ROAD ON THIS ROAD SURVEY
- 2) THIS ROAD ANGLES TO THE NORTHEASTERLY AT N. 87°45' W. FOR 3,956 FEET TO INTERSECT THE SECTION LINE AT 152 FEET NORTH OF THE ESTABLISHED STONE HE FOUND AT THE SOUTHWEST CORNER OF SECTION 27-16-10 FOR THE TERMINUS OF THE SECOND ROAD ON THIS ROAD SURVEY
