

NORTHWEST CORNER SECTION 05, TOWNSHIP 16 SOUTH, RANGE 11 EAST

- 1) ON PAGE 305 OF THE GLO ORIGINAL FIELD NOTES IN THE DRAFTING ROOM IN THE COUNTY ENGINEER'S OFFICE IT STATES THAT THEY INTERSECTED THE 3RD STANDARD PARALLEL AT 6 CHAINS WEST OF THE STANDARD CORNER TO SECTIONS 5 & 6 AND **THEY SET A LIMESTONE 18" X 10" X 5"** FOR THE **CLOSING CORNER** TO SECTIONS 5 & 6-16-11 ON MARCH 6, 1961.
THE GOVERNMENT SURVEY NOTES SHOWS THE FOLLOWING INFORMATION:
 - 1) 40.70 CHAINS SOUTH TO THE 18" X 12" X 4" LIMESTONE THEY SET FOR THE 1/4 CORNER BETWEEN SECTIONS 5 & 6-16-11
 - 2) 80.70 CHAINS SOUTH TO THE 18" X 14" X 5" LIMESTONE THEY SET FOR THE CORNER TO SECTIONS 5, 6, 7 & 8-16-11

- 2) MATTHEW BROWN, DEPUTY COUNTY SURVEYOR, IN SURVEY NUMBER 76 IN TOWNSHIP 16 AND 101 IN TOWNSHIP 15, A ROAD SURVEY IN TOWNSHIPS 16 & 16, RANGE 10 DATED FEBRUARY 23 & 24, 1886 FOR THE SECOND ROAD PETITIONED BY MANLY B. SMITH, SAID THAT **HE SET A 14" X 18" X 3" ROAD STONE MARKED "R" ON THE SOUTH FACE** AT THE NORTHEAST CORNER OF SECTION 6-16-11 ON THE 3RD STANDARD PARALLEL ON THIS ROAD SURVEY FOR A 50 FOOT WIDE ROAD.
HIS SURVEY NOTES SHOW THE FOLLOWING INFORMATION:
 - 1) 1,036' SOUTH TO THE 16" X 9" X 2" ROAD STONE MARKED "R" ON THE SOUTH FACE HE SET IN THE OLD SANTA FE TRAIL FOR THE BEGINNING OF THIS ROAD SURVEY
 - 2) 396' EAST ON THE 3RD STANDARD PARALLEL TO THE STANDARD CORNER AT THE SOUTHWEST CORNER OF SECTION 32-15-11

- 3) R. H. EDMISTON, COUNTY SURVEYOR FROM 1884 TO 1887, IN SURVEY NUMBER 141, A ROAD SURVEY RECORDED IN SURVEY BOOK "E" ON PAGE 141 FOR ROAD IN TOWNSHIP 16-11 FOR MANLY B. SMITH, PRINCIPAL PETITIONER, DATED SEPTEMBER 9 & 10, 1886, APPARENTLY **FOUND THE STONE** AT THE NORTHWEST CORNER OF SECTION 5-16-11 ON THE 3RD STANDARD PARALLEL ON THE SECOND ROAD ON THIS ROAD SURVEY.
HIS SURVEY NOTES SHOWS THE FOLLOWING INFORMATION:
 - 1) THE SECOND ROAD EXTENDS WEST ON THE 3RD STANDARD PARALLEL FOR 1 MILE TO THE STONE HE FOUND AT THE NORTHWEST CORNER OF SECTION 6-16-11 ON THE RANGE LINE TO BEGIN THE SECOND ROAD ON THIS ROAD SURVEY
 - 2) THE SECOND ROAD EXTENDS EAST ON THE 3RD STANDARD PARALLEL FOR 2 MILES TO THE STONE HE FOUND AT THE NORTHEAST CORNER OF SECTION 4-16-11 TO END THE SECOND ROAD ON THIS ROAD SURVEY

- 4) R. H. EDMISTON, COUNTY SURVEYOR FROM 1884 TO 1887, IN A ROAD SURVEY FOR ROAD NUMBER 339 RECORDED IN ROAD RECORD BOOK "C" ON PAGES 306 TO 308 PETITION BY MANLY B. SMITH AND OTHERS FOR THE VACATION OF PART OF THE SANTA FE TRAIL ROAD AND THE LOCATION OF A ROAD ON THE 3RD STANDARD PARALLEL BETWEEN TOWNSHIPS 15-11 AND 16-11 [PACKET 568 IN THE VAULT IN THE COUNTY SURVEYOR'S OFFICE] THAT HE SURVEYED ON SEPTEMBER 9, 1886, WAS ESTABLISHED AS A 60 FOOT WIDE ROAD ON OCTOBER 14, 1886 BY T. E. McMILLAN, CHAIRMAN OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS, AND RECORDED ON MARCH 9, 1887 BY ROLAND LAKIN, COUNTY CLERK, SAID THAT **HE FOUND THE STONE** AT THE NORTHWEST CORNER OF SECTION 5-16-11 ON THE 3RD STANDARD PARALLEL TO BEGIN THIS ROAD SURVEY ON THE 3RD STANDARD PARALLEL. THE ROAD VACATED COMMENCED AT THE POINT WHERE THE SANTA FE TRAIL CROSSES THE WEST LINE OF SECTION 6-16-11, THENCE EAST FOLLOWING SAID TRAIL THROUGH THE NORTH 1/2 OF SECTIONS 6, 5 AND 4 TO THE POINT

WHERE SAID TRAIL CROSSES THE EAST LINE OF SECTION 4-16-11 TO END THIS ROAD **VACATION**.

HIS SURVEY NOTES SHOWS THE FOLLOWING INFORMATION:

- 1) THIS LOCATED ROAD EXTENDS WEST ON THE 3RD STANDARD PARALLEL FOR 1 MILE TO THE STONE HE FOUND AT THE NORTHWEST CORNER OF SECTION 6-16-11 ON THE RANGE LINE TO BEGIN THIS ROAD LOCATION SURVEY
 - 2) THIS LOCATED ROAD EXTENDS EAST ON THE 3RD STANDARD PARALLEL FOR 2 MILES TO THE STONE HE FOUND AT THE NORTHEAST CORNER OF SECTION 4-16-11 TO END THIS ROAD LOCATION SURVEY
- 5) ALVA J. SMITH, COUNTY SURVEYOR FROM 1900 THROUGH 1906, IN SURVEY NUMBER 63, A **PERMANENT SURVEY** RECORDED IN SURVEY BOOK "F" ON PAGE 142 AND DATED JANUARY 6, 1903, ORDERED BY G. H. FILNER FOR THE PURPOSE OF LOCATING AND PERMANENTLY ESTABLISHING THE CORNERS AND BOUNDARIES AND SUBDIVISIONS OF SECTION 29 AND SECTION 32 IN TOWNSHIP 15, RANGE 11, AND RUN SUCH LINES AS MAY BE NECESSARY TO PROPERLY COMPLETE THE WORK, SAID THAT **HE FOUND THE STONE** AT THE CLOSING CORNER AT THE NORTHWEST CORNER OF SECTION 6-16-11 ON THE 3RD STANDARD PARALLEL. HE USED THIS STONE TO RESET THE ORIGINAL GOVERNMENT STONE THAT HE FOUND LOOSE ON THE GROUND AT THE SOUTHWEST CORNER OF SECTION 32-15-11 ON THIS **PERMANENT SURVEY** ON THE 3RD STANDARD PARALLEL. SEE PACKET "M 137" IN MISCELLANEOUS DRAWER 7 IN THE VAULT IN THE COUNTY ENGINEER'S OFFICE FOR ADDITIONAL INFORMATION ON THIS **PERMANENT SURVEY**.

HIS SURVEY NOTES/DRAWING SHOWS THE FOLLOWING INFORMATION:

- 1) 6.00 CHAINS EAST ON THE 3RD STANDARD PARALLEL TO THE ORIGINAL GOVERNMENT STONE HE FOUND AND **HE RESET** FOR THE PERMANENT SOUTHWEST CORNER OF SECTION 32-15-11
- 2) 26.06-1/2 CHAINS EAST ON THE 3RD STANDARD PARALLEL TO THE 14" X 12" X 4" STONE HE SET FOR THE PERMANENT SOUTH 1/8TH CORNER OF THE SW1/4 OF SECTION 32-15-11
- 3) 46.13 CHAINS EAST ON THE 3RD STANDARD PARALLEL TO THE STONE HE FOUND AT THE SOUTH 1/4 CORNER OF SECTION 32-15-11

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
