

NORTHWEST CORNER SECTION 18, TOWNSHIP 16 SOUTH, RANGE 11 EAST

- 1) ON PAGE 58 OF THE GLO ORIGINAL FIELD NOTES IN THE DRAFTING ROOM IN THE COUNTY ENGINEER'S OFFICE IT STATES THAT **THEY SET A LIMESTONE 20" X 10" X 4"** FOR THE CORNER TO SECTIONS 7 & 18-16-11 ON THE WEST TOWNSHIP BOUNDARY.

THE GOVERNMENT SURVEY NOTES SHOWS THE FOLLOWING INFORMATION:

- 1) 35.33 CHAINS EAST TO THE 18" X 12" X 3" LIMESTONE THEY SET FOR THE 1/4 CORNER BETWEEN SECTIONS 7 & 18-16-11
 - 2) 75.33 CHAINS EAST TO THE 30" X 10" X 5" LIMESTONE THEY SET FOR THE CORNER TO SECTIONS 7, 8, 17 & 18-16-11
 - 3) 40.00 CHAINS SOUTH ON THE WEST TOWNSHIP BOUNDARY TO THE 16" X 12" X 3" LIMESTONE THEY SET FOR THE WEST 1/4 CORNER OF SECTION 18-16-11
 - 4) 80.00 CHAINS SOUTH ON THE WEST TOWNSHIP BOUNDARY TO THE 20" X 12" X 4" LIMESTONE THEY SET FOR THE CORNER TO SECTIONS 18 & 19-16-11
- 2) J. H. HIBBEN, COUNTY SURVEYOR FROM 1875 TO 1882, IN A ROAD SURVEY FOR ROAD NUMBER 28 RECORDED IN ROAD RECORD BOOK "A-1" ON PAGES 110 TO 112 PETITIONED BY W. R. COLGAN AND OTHERS FOR A COUNTY ROAD IN TOWNSHIPS 16-10 AND 17-10 [PACKET 116 IN THE VAULT IN THE COUNTY SURVEYOR'S OFFICE] THAT HE SURVEYED ON JUNE 13, 1879, WAS ESTABLISHED AS A 40 FOOT WIDE ROAD ON JULY 7, 1879, AND WAS RECORDED ON JULY 15, 1879 BY WILLIAM F. EWING, COUNTY CLERK, SAID THAT **HE FOUND THE STONE** AT THE NORTHEAST CORNER OF SECTION 13-16-10 ON THE RANGE LINE ON THIS ROAD SURVEY.

HIS SURVEY NOTES SHOWS THE FOLLOWING INFORMATION:

- 1) THIS ROAD EXTENDS NORTH ON THE RANGE LINE TO THE NORTHEAST CORNER OF SECTION 6-16-10 ON THE 3RD STANDARD PARALLEL TO COMMENCE THIS ROAD SURVEY
 - 2) THIS ROAD EXTENDS SOUTH ON THE RANGE LINE TO THE NORTHEAST CORNER OF SECTION 24-17-10 FOR THE TERMINUS OF THIS ROAD SURVEY
- 3) J. H. HIBBEN, COUNTY SURVEYOR FROM 1875 TO 1882, IN A ROAD SURVEY FOR ROAD NUMBER 79 RECORDED IN ROAD RECORD BOOK "A-1" ON PAGES 318 TO 320 PETITIONED BY JOHN T. HYDE AND OTHERS FOR TWO COUNTY ROADS IN TOWNSHIP 16-11 [PACKET 223 IN THE VAULT IN THE COUNTY SURVEYOR'S OFFICE] THAT HE SURVEYED ON SEPTEMBER 15, 1880, WAS ESTABLISHED AS 40 FOOT WIDE EAST-WEST ROADS AND 60 FOOT WIDE NORTH-SOUTH ROADS ON OCTOBER 5, 1880, AND WAS RECORDED ON OCTOBER 12, 1880 BY WILLIAM F. EWING, COUNTY CLERK, SAID THAT **HE FOUND THE STONE** AT THE NORTHWEST CORNER OF SECTION 18-16-11 ON THE RANGE LINE TO COMMENCE THE SECOND ROAD OF THIS ROAD SURVEY.

HIS SURVEY NOTES SHOWS THE FOLLOWING INFORMATION:

- 1) THE SECOND ROAD EXTENDS EAST ON THE SECTION LINES TO THE NORTHEAST CORNER OF SECTION 17-16-11 TO THE TERMINUS OF THE SECOND ROAD ON THIS ROAD SURVEY
- 4) R. H. EDMISTON, COUNTY SURVEYOR FROM 1884 TO 1887, BY MATTHEW BROWN, DEPUTY COUNTY SURVEYOR, IN SURVEY NUMBER 77 RECORDED IN SURVEY BOOK "F" ON PAGES 100 TO 103 DATED APRIL 26 THROUGH JUNE 22, 1886, TO SUBDIVIDE SECTIONS 7, 8, 17 & 18 AND THE SOUTH 1/2 OF SECTION 5, ALL IN TOWNSHIP 16, RANGE 10, SAID THAT **HE FOUND THE STONE IN GOOD CONDITION** AT THE SOUTHWEST CORNER OF SECTION 7-16-11 ON THE RANGE LINE ON THIS SURVEY.

 - 2) 80.21 CHAINS NORTH ON THE RANGE LINE TO THE STONE HE FOUND AT THE NORTHWEST CORNER OF SECTION 7-16-11
 - 3) 39.53 CHAINS SOUTH ON THE RANGE LINE TO THE STONE HE FOUND AT THE WEST 1/4 CORNER OF SECTION 18-16-11
 - 4) 79.81 CHAINS SOUTH ON THE RANGE LINE TO THE STONE HE FOUND AT THE SOUTHWEST CORNER OF SECTION 18-16-11
 - 5) 17.85 CHAINS EAST TO THE 15" X 8" X 6" STONE MARKED "1/8" ON THE SOUTH FACE HE SET FOR THE SOUTH 1/8TH CORNER OF THE SW1/4 OF SECTION 7-16-11
 - 6) 57.85 CHAINS EAST TO THE 20" X 10" X 6" STONE MARKED "1/8" HE SET FOR THE SOUTH 1/8TH CORNER OF THE SE1/4 OF SECTION 7-16-11
 - 7) 77.85 CHAINS EAST TO THE STAKE HE SET FOR THE SOUTHEAST CORNER OF SECTION 7-16-11
 - 8) 97.85 CHAINS EAST TO THE 16" X 10" X 4" STONE MARKED "1/8" ON THE SOUTH FACE HE SET FOR THE SOUTH 1/8TH CORNER OF THE SW1/4 OF SECTION 8-16-11
 - 9) 117.85 CHAINS EAST TO THE STAKE HE SET FOR THE SOUTH 1/4 CORNER OF SECTION 8-16-11
 - 10) 132.17 CHAINS EAST TO THE 19" X 8" X 5" STONE MARKED "RL" ON THE EAST FACE HE SET FOR THE SOUTHEAST CORNER OF GOVERNMENT LOT 8 IN THE SE1/4 OF SECTION 8-16-11
 - 11) 154.94 CHAINS EAST TO THE STAKE HE SET FOR THE SOUTHEAST CORNER OF SECTION 8-16-11
- 5) COMMISSIONER'S ROAD JOURNAL BOOK "B", PAGE 17
ON APRIL 14, 1942 A PETITION SIGNED BY H. A. WILSON AND OTHERS FOR THE **VACATION** OF A ROAD IN TOWNSHIP 16-11 WAS PRESENTED TO TED NEWCOMER, COUNTY CLERK. THE ROAD WAS VIEWED BY THE COUNTY COMMISSIONERS AND O. D. HENRY, COUNTY ENGINEER, ON MAY 7, 1942 AND THE FINAL ORDER OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS ON JUNE 3, 1942 **VACATED** THE FOLLOWING ROAD:
- 1) BEGINNING AT THE NORTH QUARTER CORNER OF SECTION 18-16-11 AND RUNNING WEST ON THE NORTH LINE OF SAID SECTION THREE-FOURTHS (3/4) OF A MILE TO THE NORTHWEST CORNER THEREOF AND ENDING THERE.
 - 2) SAID ROAD SHOULD BE **VACATED**. THE ROAD HEREIN PRAYED FOR IS FENCED OFF AND HAS NOT BEEN USED FOR PUBLIC TRAVEL FOR SOME TIME. ITS CONDITION WOULD INDICATE THAT MORE EXPENSE WOULD BE INVOLVED IN MAKING IT A SAFE TRAVELABLE ROAD THAN ITS UTILITY WOULD WARRANT. THERE WAS NO ONE APPEARED IN PROTEST OF THE PETITION, THEREFORE THE BOARD OF VIEWERS PROCEEDED TO CLOSE THE ROAD ACCORDING TO THE PETITION.
- 6) COMMISSIONER'S ROAD JOURNAL BOOK "B", PAGE 102
ON MARCH 28, 1957 A PETITION SIGNED BY CARL W. DITTMER AND OTHERS FOR THE **VACATION** OF A ROAD IN TOWNSHIP 16-10 WAS PRESENTED TO VESPER M. SHEELEY, JR., COUNTY CLERK. THE ROAD WAS VIEWED BY THE COUNTY COMMISSIONERS ON APRIL 19, 1957 AND THE FINAL ORDER OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS ON APRIL 20, 1957 **VACATED** THE FOLLOWING ROAD:
- 1) BEGINNING AT THE NORTHEAST CORNER OF SECTION 13-16-10, AND TERMINATING AT THE NORTHWEST CORNER OF SECTION 13-16-10.
