

WEST 1/4 CORNER SECTION 06, TOWNSHIP 16 SOUTH, RANGE 12 EAST

- 1) ON PAGE 83 OF THE GLO ORIGINAL FIELD NOTES IN THE DRAFTING ROOM IN THE COUNTY ENGINEER'S OFFICE IT STATES THAT **THEY SET A LIMESTONE 16" X 14" X 6"** FOR THE WEST 1/4 CORNER OF SECTION 6-16-12 ON THE WEST TOWNSHIP BOUNDARY ON DECEMBER 18, 1856.

THE GOVERNMENT SURVEY NOTES SHOWS THE FOLLOWING INFORMATION:

- 1) 42.75 CHAINS NORTH ON THE WEST TOWNSHIP BOUNDARY TO THE INTERSECT THE 3RD STANDARD PARALLEL AT 9 CHAINS & 70 LINKS WEST OF THE CORNER TO TOWNSHIP 15 SOUTH, RANGES 12 & 13 EAST – NO MONUMENT DESCRIBED
 - 2) 40.00 CHAINS SOUTH ON THE WEST TOWNSHIP BOUNDARY TO THE 14" X 14" X 3" LIMESTONE THEY SET FOR THE CORNER TO SECTIONS 6 & 7-16-12
- 2) ROBERT MILLIKEN, COUNTY SURVEYOR FROM 1870 TO 1875 AND FROM 1882 TO 1883, PER C. H. RICE, DEPUTY COUNTY SURVEYOR, IN A **PERMANENT SURVEY** RECORDED IN SURVEY BOOK "D" ON PAGE 147 DATED MARCH 6-8, 1883 AT THE ORDER OF GEORGE W. DeCAMP TO PERMANENTLY ESTABLISH THE SOUTHEAST AND NORTHEAST CORNERS OF SECTION 6-16-12, SAID THAT **HE FOUND THE STONE** AT THE WEST 1/4 CORNER OF SECTION 6-16-12 ON THE RANGE LINE ON THIS **PERMANENT SURVEY**.

HIS SURVEY NOTES SHOW THE FOLLOWING INFORMATION:

- 1) 12.20 CHAINS EAST TO THE STONE HE SET FOR THE PERMANENT NORTH 1/8TH CORNER OF THE SW1/4 OF SECTION 6-16-12
 - 2) 32.20 CHAINS EAST TO THE STONE HE SET FOR THE PERMANENT CENTER CORNER OF SECTION 6-16-12
 - 3) 52.20 CHAINS EAST TO THE STONE HE SET FOR THE PERMANENT NORTH 1/8TH CORNER OF THE SE1/4 OF SECTION 6-16-12
 - 4) 72.20 CHAINS EAST TO THE STONE HE FOUND AT THE EAST 1/4 CORNER SECTION 6-16-12
- 3) R. H. EDMISTON, COUNTY SURVEYOR FROM 1884 TO 1887, IN SURVEY NUMBER 113, RECORDED IN SURVEY BOOK "E" ON PAGE 113 DATED AUGUST 17-19, 1885, AND RECORDED IN VOLUME 41 ON PAGE 34 IN THE REGISTER OF DEEDS OFFICE ON JANUARY 27, 1887 AND SURVEY F06001 IN THE SURVEY FILE FOR TOWNSHIP 16-11, SURVEYED PER THE ORDER OF THE **DISTRICT COURT OF LYON COUNTY** TO SURVEY AND SUBDIVIDE SECTION 6-16-12, SAID THAT **HE FOUND THE STONE** AT THE WEST 1/4 CORNER OF SECTION 6-16-12 ON THE RANGE LINE ON THIS **DISTRICT COURT ORDERED SURVEY**.
- 4) J. HARRISON PARKMAN, COUNTY SURVEYOR FROM 1907 TO 1915, BY MAX YINGLING, DEPUTY COUNTY SURVEYOR, IN SURVEY NUMBER 155, TERM 2, A **PERMANENT SURVEY** RECORDED IN SURVEY BOOK "D" ON PAGE 78 DATED MARCH 4-6, 1909 AT THE ORDER OF LeMONT DeCAMP TO ESTABLISH THE CORNERS AND BOUNDARIES OF LOTS 3 & 4 IN SECTION 1-16-11, APPARENTLY DID **NOT** FIND THE STONE AT THE EAST 1/4 CORNER OF SECTION 1-16-11 ON THE RANGE LINE AS HE RAN THE RANGE LINE FROM THE STONE THAT HE FOUND AT THE SOUTHEAST CORNER OF SECTION 12-16-11 NORTH TO THE STONE THAT HE SET FOR THE NORTHEAST CORNER OF SECTION 1-16-11 ON THE 3RD STANDARD PARALLEL ON THIS **PERMANENT SURVEY**.

- 5) COMMISSIONER'S ROAD JOURNAL BOOK "A", PAGE 132
ON OCTOBER 9, 1933 A PETITION SIGNED BY C. J. GILBERT AND OTHERS FOR THE **VACATION** OF A ROAD IN TOWNSHIP 16-11 WAS PRESENTED TO THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS. THE ROAD WAS VIEWED ON MARCH 2, 1934, AND THE FINAL ORDER WAS ISSUED ON MARCH, 1934 THAT **VACATED** THE FOLLOWING ROAD:

- 1) BEGINNING AT A POINT ON THE EAST LINE OF SECTION 1-16-11, SAID POINT BEING APPROXIMATELY 20 RODS NORTH OF THE EAST 1/4 CORNER OF SAID SECTION 1; FROM THENCE IN A WESTERLY DIRECTION LYING ON OR NEAR THE EAST AND WEST CENTERLINE OF SAID SECTION 1 CROSSING 142 CREEK TO THE CENTER OF SECTION 1 AND TERMINATING THERE.
 - 2) ABOVE DESCRIBED ROAD BEING THE ONE RELOCATED IN 1920 ACCORDING TO ROAD RECORD BOOK "E" ON PAGE 73 IN THE OFFICE OF THE COUNTY ENGINEER
 - 3) SAID ROAD SHOULD BE VACATED AS PETITIONED FOR AND FOR THE REASONS: THERE SEEMS TO BE NO DEMAND FOR THIS ROAD AS NO ONE APPEARED OR PROTESTED AT THE HEARING AND THE PETITION HAD THE SIGNATURES OF ALL THE RESIDENTS OF THE COMMUNITY
- 6) O. D. HENRY, COUNTY ENGINEER FROM 1929 TO 1944, IN A ROAD SURVEY FOR ROAD NUMBER 759 RECORDED IN ROAD RECORD BOOK 1 ON PAGE 15 PETITIONED BY C. J. GILBERT AND OTHERS FOR VACATING A ROAD IN SECTION 1-16-11 THAT WAS VIEWED ON MARCH 2, 1934 AND WAS VACATED ON MARCH 7, 1934 AS RECORDED ON PAGE 132 IN BOOK "A" OF THE COMMISSIONERS JOURNALS AS ATTESTED BY W. J. HANNAH, COUNTY CLERK, THE VIEWERS RECOMMENDED THAT THE ROAD BE VACATED FOR THE FOLLOWING REASONS:
- 1) NO ONE APPEARED OR PROTESTED AT THE HEARING
 - 2) THE PETITION HAD THE SIGNATURES OF ALL THE RESIDENTS IN THE COMMUNITY
 - 3) THE ROAD VACATED IS DESCRIBED AS FOLLOWS: BEGINNING AT A POINT ON THE EAST LINE OF SECTION 1-16-11, SAID POINT BEING APPROXIMATELY TWENTY (20) RODS NORTH OF THE EAST 1/4 CORNER OF SAID SECTION 1; THENCE IN A WESTERLY DIRECTION LYING ON OR NEAR THE EAST AND WEST CENTER LINE OF SAID SECTION 1, CROSSING 142 CREEK, TO THE CENTER OF SECTION 1-16-11 AND THERE ENDING
 - 4) THE ABOVE DESCRIBED ROAD BEING THE ONE RELOCATED IN 1920 ACCORDING TO ROAD RECORD "E", PAGE 73, IN THE OFFICE OF THE COUNTY ENGINEER
- 7) STEVEN S. BROSEMER, L.S. 752, IN A LAND SURVEY REFERENCE REPORT DATED MAY 9, 2012 FOR PROJECT NUMBER 12098-02 FOR SURVEY F06002 IN THE SURVEY FILE FOR TOWNSHIP 16-12, A SURVEY FOR A TRACT IN THE SOUTHWEST QUARTER OF SECTION 6-20-12 FOR BILL MARTIN, SAID THAT HE SEARCHED FOR THE STONE AT THE WEST 1/4 CORNER OF SECTION 6-16-12 ON THE RANGE LINE FROM THE RETRACEMENT OF THE SURVEYS BY MILLIKEN IN 1883 AND EDMISTON IN 1885, BUT HE DID NOT FIND THE STONE. HE DEEMED THAT THE WEST 1/4 CORNER OF SECTION 6-16-12 WAS LOST. HE DID NOT RESET THE WEST 1/4 CORNER OF SECTION 6-16-12 ON THIS SURVEY.
