

NORTHWEST CORNER SECTION 30, TOWNSHIP 16 SOUTH, RANGE 12 EAST

- 1) ON PAGE 82 OF THE GLO ORIGINAL FIELD NOTES IN THE DRAFTING ROOM IN THE COUNTY ENGINEER'S OFFICE IT STATES THAT **THEY SET A LIMESTONE 18" X 14" X 4"** FOR THE CORNER TO SECTIONS 19 & 30-16-12 ON THE WEST TOWNSHIP BOUNDARY ON DECEMBER 18, 1856.

THE GOVERNMENT SURVEY NOTES SHOWS THE FOLLOWING INFORMATION:

- 1) 33.10 CHAINS EAST TO THE 12" X 9" X 6" LIMESTONE THEY SET FOR THE 1/4 CORNER BETWEEN SECTIONS 19 & 30-16-12
- 2) 73.10 CHAINS EAST TO THE 20" X 18" X 4" LIMESTONE THEY SET FOR THE CORNER TO SECTIONS 19, 20, 29 & 30-16-12
- 3) 40.00 CHAINS SOUTH ON THE WEST TOWNSHIP BOUNDARY TO THE 15" X 13" X 6" LIMESTONE THEY SET FOR THE WEST 1/4 CORNER OF SECTION 30-16-12
- 4) 80.00 CHAINS SOUTH ON THE WEST TOWNSHIP BOUNDARY TO THE 18" X 12" X 5" LIMESTONE THEY SET FOR THE CORNER TO SECTIONS 30 & 31-16-12

- 2) C. H. RICE, DEPUTY COUNTY SURVEYOR, IN A ROAD SURVEY RECORDED IN SURVEY BOOK "F" ON PAGE 27 DATED AUGUST 22 & 31, 1882, FOR A ROAD IN TOWNSHIP 16, RANGE 11 FOR M. HAAS, PRINCIPAL PETITIONER, SAID THAT **HE FOUND THE STONE** AT THE NORTHEAST CORNER OF SECTION 25-16-11 ON THE RANGE LINE FOR THE POINT OF TERMINATION FOR THIS ROAD SURVEY. THERE IS NO WIDTH RECORDED ON THIS ROAD SURVEY.

IS SURVEY NOTES SHOWS THE FOLLOWING INFORMATION:

- 1) THIS ROAD EXTENDS WEST ON THE SECTION LINES FOR 47.77 CHAINS TO THE ROAD STONE MARKED "V M" HE SET FOR THE 5 MILE STONE; THEN CONTINUES WEST ON THE SECTION LINES WITH A DEVIATION TO THE NORTH ON THE NORTH LINE OF SECTION 29-16-11; THEN INTERSECTS THE SECTION LINES AT A POINT 27.48 CHAINS WEST OF THE SOUTHEAST CORNER OF SECTION 19-16-11; THEN CONTINUES WEST ON THE SECTION LINES FOR 27.49 CHAINS TO THE STONE HE FOUND AT THE SOUTHEAST CORNER OF SECTION 19-16-11; THEN CONTINUES WEST ON THE SECTION LINES FOR 40.33 CHAINS TO THE STONE HE FOUND AT THE 1/4 CORNER ON THE SOUTH BOUNDARY OF SECTION 19-16-11 TO COMMENCE THIS ROAD SURVEY

- 3) ROBERT MILLIKEN, COUNTY SURVEYOR FROM 1870 TO 1875 AND FROM 1882 TO 1883, IN A ROAD SURVEY FOR ROAD NUMBER 104 RECORDED IN ROAD RECORD BOOK "B" ON PAGES 402 TO 404 PETITION BY M. HAAS AND OTHERS FOR A COUNTY ROAD IN TOWNSHIP 16-11 [PACKET 481 IN THE VAULT IN THE COUNTY SURVEYOR'S OFFICE] THAT HE SURVEYED ON AUGUST 23, 1882, WAS ESTABLISHED AS A 40 FOOT WIDE ROAD ON JANUARY 6, 1883 AS NOTED BY HUGH F. HOLMES, CHAIRMAN OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS, AND RECORDED ON JANUARY 23, 1883 BY WILLIAM F. EWING, COUNTY CLERK, SAID THAT **HE FOUND THE STONE** AT THE NORTHEAST CORNER OF SECTION 25-16-11 ON THE RANG LINE AT THE TERMINUS OF THIS ROAD SURVEY.

EDMISTON, COUNTY SURVEYOR FROM 1884 TO 1887, IN A ROAD SURVEY RECORDED IN SURVEY BOOK "E" ON PAGE 155 DATED DECEMBER 6 & 7, 1886 FOR A ROAD IN TOWNSHIP 16-11 FOR D. L. SAYLOR, PRINCIPAL PETITIONER, SAID THAT **HE FOUND THE STONE** AT THE NORTHEAST CORNER OF SECTION 25-16-11 ON THE RANGE LINE ON THE FIRST ROAD ON THIS ROAD SURVEY ON THE RANGE LINE. HIS SURVEY NOTES SHOWS THE FOLLOWING INFORMATION:
- 1) THE FIRST ROAD EXTENDS NORTH ON THE RANGE LINE TO THE STONE HE FOUND AT THE NORTHEAST CORNER OF SECTION 12-16-11 TO BEGIN THE FIRST ROAD ON THIS ROAD SURVEY
 - 2) THE FIRST ROAD EXTENDS SOUTH ON THE RANGE LINE TO THE STONE HE FOUND AT THE SOUTHEAST CORNER OF SECTION 25-16-11 TO END THIS FIRST ROAD SURVEY
 - 3) **NOTE:** SEE ROAD RECORD BOOK "C" ON PAGE 372 – THE ROAD WAS GRANTED FOR ONE MILE BETWEEN SECTIONS 13-17-11 AND 18-17-12 – THE BALANCE OF THE ROAD WAS **REJECTED** – WARREN CHIP WOODS, L.S. 603, COUNTY SURVEYOR
- 5) R. H. EDMISTON, COUNTY SURVEYOR FROM 1884 TO 1887, IN A ROAD SURVEY FOR ROAD NUMBER 355 RECORDED IN ROAD RECORD BOOK "C" ON PAGES 370 TO 372 PETITIONED BY D. L. SAYLORS AND OTHERS COMMENCING AT THE NORTHEAST CORNER OF SECTION 12-16-11, THENCE SOUTH AS NEARLY AS PRACTICABLE ON THE SECTION LINES TO THE SOUTHEAST CORNER OF SECTION 25-16-12, THENCE SOUTH OVER A ROAD ALREADY LOCATED TO THE SOUTHEAST CORNER OF SECTION 12-17-11, THENCE SOUTH AS NEARLY AS PRACTICABLE ON THE SECTION LINES TO THE SOUTHEAST CORNER OF SECTION 25-17-11 [PACKET 604 IN THE VAULT IN THE COUNTY SURVEYOR'S OFFICE] THAT HE SURVEYED ON DECEMBER 6, 1886, SAID THAT **HE FOUND THE STONE** AT THE NORTHEAST CORNER OF SECTION 25-16-11 ON THE RANGE LINE. ON JANUARY 5, 1887 THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS GRANTED THE ROAD FOR ONE MILE BETWEEN SECTIONS 13-17-11 AND 18-17-12, AND THE BALANCE OF THE ROAD WAS **REJECTED** AS NOTED BY T. E. McMILLAN, CHAIRMAN, AND RECORDED ON JANUARY 18, 1887 BY ROLAND LAKIN, COUNTY CLERK.
- 6) MATTHEW BROWN, COUNTY SURVEYOR FROM 1888 TO 1900, AND 1914, IN SURVEY NUMBER 179, A **PERMANENT SURVEY** AT THE REQUEST OF JAMES W. WORSTELL TO ESTABLISH THE LINES AND CORNERS OF THE SOUTHEAST 1/4 OF SECTION 14 AND THE NORTHEAST 1/4 OF SECTION 23, ALL IN TOWNSHIP 16, RANGE 11 RECORDED IN SURVEY BOOK "F" ON PAGE 133 DATED JUNE 18 TO JULY 7, 1888, SAID THAT HE DID **NOT** FIND THE STONE AT THE SOUTHEAST CORNER OF SECTION 24-16-11 AS HE RAN THE RANGE LINE FROM THE STONE THAT HE FOUND AT THE NORTHWEST CORNER OF SECTION 7-16-12 TO THE STONE THAT HE FOUND AT THE TOWNSHIP CORNER AT THE SOUTHEAST CORNER OF SECTION 36-16-11. **HE SET A TEMPORARY STAKE** FOR THE SOUTHEAST CORNER OF SECTION 24-16-11 ON THIS **PERMANENT SURVEY**.
- 7) NATHANIEL BROWN, DEPUTY COUNTY SURVEYOR, IN A ROAD SURVEY FOR ROAD NUMBER 385 RECORDED IN ROAD RECORD BOOK "C" ON PAGES 486 TO 488 PETITIONED BY C. D. HATCHER AND OTHERS FOR A ROAD IN TOWNSHIP 16-12 [PACKET 634 IN THE VAULT IN THE COUNTY SURVEYOR'S OFFICE] THAT HE SURVEYED ON DECEMBER 11, 1891, WAS ESTABLISHED AS 50 FOOT WIDE ROADS ON JANUARY 7, 1892 AS NOTED BY J. W. LAY, CHAIRMAN OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS, AND RECORDED ON JANUARY 20, 1892 BY C. W. WILHITE, COUNTY CLERK, SAID THAT **HE SET A ROAD STONE "PROPERLY MARKED"** AT THE SOUTHWEST CORNER OF SECTION 19-16-12 ON THE RANGE LINE TO BEGIN THIS ROAD SURVEY.

HIS SURVEY NOTES SHOWS THE FOLLOWING INFORMATION:

- 1) THIS ROAD EXTENDS EAST ON THE SECTION LINES FOR 1 MILE TO THE ROAD STONE HE SET FOR THE SOUTHEAST CORNER OF SECTION 19-16-12; THEN SOUTH ON THE SECTION LINE FOR 25 FEET TO THE ROAD STONE HE SET, THEN EAST FOR 1/4 OF A MILE TO THE ROAD STONE HE SET; THEN NORTH FOR 50 FEET TO THE ROAD STONE HE SET, THEN EAST FOR 1/4 OF A MILE TO THE ROAD STONE HE SET FOR THE TERMINUS OF THIS ROAD SURVEY AT THE SOUTHWEST CORNER OF THE CITY OF ADMIRE
- 8) ALVA J. SMITH, COUNTY SURVEYOR FROM 1900 THROUGH 1906, IN SURVEY NUMBER 91, A **PERMANENT SURVEY** RECORDED IN SURVEY BOOK "F" ON PAGE 171 DATED MARCH 1 & 2, 1904 AT THE REQUEST OF W. W. BAYLAND FOR A SURVEY FOR THE PURPOSE OF LOCATING AND PERMANENTLY ESTABLISHING THE SOUTHEAST CORNER AND THE SOUTH 1/4 CORNER OF SECTION 23-16-11 AND RUN SUCH LINES AS MAY BE NECESSARY TO PROPERLY COMPLETE THE WORK, SAID THAT **HE FOUND THE STONE** AT THE SOUTHEAST CORNER OF SECTION 24-16-11 ON THE RANGE LINE ON THIS **PERMANENT SURVEY**. HIS FIELD NOTES ARE IN BOOK 2 ON PAGE 28 IN THE "KRETSINGER COLLECTION" OF FIELD BOOKS, AND THERE IS ADDITIONAL INFORMATION IN PACKET "M 121" IN MISCELLANEOUS DRAWER NUMBER 5 IN THE VAULT IN THE COUNTY ENGINEER'S OFFICE.

- 1) 79.48 CHAINS WEST TO THE 18" X 6" X 6" STONE HE SET FOR THE PERMANENT SOUTHEAST CORNER OF SECTION 23-16-11
 - 2) 119.34 CHAINS WEST TO THE 15" X 9" X 3" STONE WITH A PIECE OF PLOW SHARE ON THE NORTH SIDE OF THE STONE HE SET FOR THE PERMANENT SOUTH 1/4 CORNER OF SECTION 23-16-11
 - 3) 159.20 CHAINS WEST TO THE 18" X 8" X 4" STONE HE SET FOR THE PERMANENT SOUTHWEST CORNER OF SECTION 23-16-11 AT A POINT PREVIOUSLY LOCATED BY THE AFFIDAVIT OF W. M. PORTER [SEE SURVEY RECORD "E" ON PAGE 224] AT 33 LINKS EAST AND 33 LINKS NORTH OF A LARGE CORNER POST
- 9) ALVA J. SMITH, COUNTY SURVEYOR FROM 1900 THROUGH 1906, IN SURVEY NUMBER 97, A **PERMANENT SURVEY** RECORDED IN SURVEY BOOK "F" ON PAGE 177 DATED JUNE 28, 1904 BY THE ORDER OF T. G. WISDOM FOR THE PURPOSE OF LOCATING AND PERMANENTLY ESTABLISHING THE CORNERS AND BOUNDARIES OF THE SOUTHWEST 1/4 OF SECTION 24-16-11 AND RUN SUCH LINES AS MAY BE NECESSARY TO PROPERLY COMPLETE THE WORK, SAID THAT **HE FOUND A STONE MARKED "R"** AT THE SOUTHEAST CORNER OF SECTION 24-16-11 ON THE RANGE LINE ON THIS **PERMANENT SURVEY**. HE RAN THE RANGE LINE FROM THE STONE THAT HE FOUND AT THE EAST 1/4 CORNER OF SECTION 13-16-11 SOUTH TO THE STONE THAT HE FOUND AT THE SOUTHEAST CORNER OF SECTION 25-16-11 ON THIS **PERMANENT SURVEY**. HE COMMENTED THAT THE **STONE MARKED "R"**, BEING SO NEAR THE POSITION FOR THIS CORNER, AND HAVING BEEN RECOGNIZED BY THE LANDOWNERS AS THE **TRUE CORNER** FOR MORE THAN 20 YEARS, HE DID **NOT** SET ANOTHER STONE AT THE SOUTHEAST CORNER OF SECTION 24-16-11. HIS FIELD NOTES ARE IN HIS BOOK 2 ON PAGE 60 IN THE "KRETSINGER COLLECTION" OF FIELD BOOKS, AND THERE IS ADDITIONAL INFORMATION IN PACKET "M 158" IN MISCELLANEOUS DRAWER NUMBER 8 IN THE VAULT IN THE COUNTY ENGINEER'S OFFICE.

 - 2) THE ROAD PETITIONED EXTENDING NORTH ON THE RANGE LINE FOR 2 MILES TO THE STONE HE FOUND AT THE NORTHWEST CORNER OF SECTION 18-16-12 WAS **REJECTED**
- 7) ALVA J. SMITH, COUNTY SURVEYOR FROM 1900 THROUGH 1906, IN A ROAD SURVEY FOR ROAD NUMBER 598 RECORDED IN ROAD RECORD BOOK "D" ON PAGES 261 THROUGH 264 PETITION BY J. A. RABOURN AND OTHERS FOR A ROAD ON THE RANGE LINE BETWEEN TOWNSHIPS 16-11 AND 16-12 AS FOLLOWS: BEGINNING AT THE NORTHEAST CORNER OF SECTION 12-16-11, THENCE SOUTH ON THE SECTION LINE OR AS NEAR AS PRACTICABLE 4 MILES TO THE SOUTHEAST CORNER OF SECTION 25-16-11 AND THERE ENDING [PACKET 748 IN THE VAULT IN THE COUNTY SURVEYOR'S OFFICE] THAT HE SURVEYED ON JANUARY 3, 1905, SAID THAT **HE FOUND THE STONE MARKED "R"** AT THE NORTHWEST CORNER OF SECTION 30-16-12 ON THE RANGE LINE TO BEGIN THE SECOND ROAD APPROVED ON THIS ROAD SURVEY. THE FINAL ORDER OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS GRANTED THE NORTH MILE AND THE SOUTH MILE **ONLY** AT 40 FEET WIDE, 20 FEET ON EACH SIDE OF THE LINE AS SURVEYED, ON APRIL 6, 1905 AS NOTED BY W. H. MAPES, CHAIRMAN OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS, ATTESTED BY W. F. EGGERS, COUNTY CLERK, AND RECORDED ON MAY 9, 1905 BY ALVA J. SMITH, COUNTY SURVEYOR. THE REMAINDER OF THE ROAD AS PETITIONED WAS **REJECTED**.

 - 2) THE ROAD PETITIONED EXTENDING NORTH ON THE RANGE LINE FOR 2 MILES TO THE STONE HE FOUND AT THE NORTHWEST CORNER OF SECTION 18-16-12 WAS **REJECTED**
