

NORTH 1/16 CORNER OF THE SOUTHWEST QUARTER OF SECTION 18, TOWNSHIP 16 SOUTH, RANGE 13 EAST

- 1) D. T. McAULEY, COUNTY SURVEYOR FROM 1867 TO 1870, IN SURVEY NUMBER 94-1/2 RECORDED IN SURVEY BOOK "A" ON PAGE 189 DATED MARCH 2, 1869 FOR A SURVEY OF SECTION 18-16-13, TO ESTABLISH THE CENTER POST AND THE SOUTHWEST CORNER OF THE SOUTHEAST 1/4 OF THE NORTHWEST 1/4 OF SECTION 18, SAID THAT **HE SET A STONE** FOR THE SOUTHWEST CORNER OF THE SOUTHEAST 1/4 OF THE NORTHWEST 1/4 OF SECTION 18-16-13 ON LINE BETWEEN THE STONE THAT HE FOUND AT THE WEST 1/4 CORNER OF SECTION 18-16-13 ON THE RANGE LINE AND THE STONE THAT HE FOUND ON THE INDIAN RESERVE LINE ON THE SOUTH LINE OF THE NORTHEAST 1/4 OF SECTION 18-16-13 ON THIS SURVEY.

- 2) IN A **PERMANENT SURVEY** WITH NO SURVEYOR NAMED RECORDED IN SURVEY BOOK "D" ON PAGE 116 DATED AUGUST 31, 1883 AT THE ORDER OF ROBERT AND JAMES POLLOCK TO SURVEY SECTION 18-16-13, THE SURVEYOR SAID THAT **HE SET AN 18" X 10" X 2" STONE** FOR THE PERMANENT SOUTH 1/8TH CORNER OF THE NORTHWEST 1/4 OF SECTION 18-16-13 ON LINE BETWEEN THE STONE THAT HE SET FOR THE PERMANENT WEST 1/4 CORNER OF SECTION 18-16-13 ON THE RANGE LINE AND THE STONE THAT HE SET FOR THE PERMANENT FRACTIONAL 1/4 CORNER ON THE SAC & FOX INDIAN RESERVE LINE AT 20.00 CHAINS EAST OF THE STONE THAT HE SET FOR THE PERMANENT WEST 1/4 CORNER OF SECTION 18-16-13 ON THIS **PERMANENT SURVEY**.
HIS SURVEY NOTES/DRAWING SHOWS THE FOLLOWING INFORMATION:
 - 1) 20.00 CHAINS WEST TO THE 17" X 10" X 4" STONE THAT WAS "PLAINLY MARKED" THAT HE SET FOR THE PERMANENT WEST 1/4 CORNER OF SECTION 18-16-13 ON THE RANGE LINE
 - 2) 25.79 CHAINS EAST TO THE 18" X 12" X 4" STONE HE SET FOR THE PERMANENT FRACTIONAL 1/4 CORNER ON THE SAC & FOX INDIAN RESERVE LINE
 - 3) 60.89 CHAINS EAST TO THE STONE HE FOUND AT THE EAST 1/4 CORNER OF SECTION 18-16-13
 - 4) 20.00 CHAIN NORTH TO THE 10" X 10" X 6" STONE HE SET FOR THE PERMANENT CENTER CORNER OF THE NW1/4 OF SECTION 18-16-13
 - 5) 12.18 CHAINS SOUTH TO THE STONE HE SET FOR THE PERMANENT NORTHWEST CORNER OF J. LANGLEY'S LAND
 - 6) 20.00 CHAINS SOUTH TO THE 16" X 10" X 2" STONE HE SET FOR THE PERMANENT CENTER CORNER OF THE SW1/4 OF SECTION 18-16-13

- 3) ROBERT MILLIKEN, COUNTY SURVEYOR FROM 1870 TO 1875 AND FROM 1882 TO 1883, IN A ROAD SURVEY RECORDED IN SURVEY BOOK "F" ON PAGE 80 DATED DECEMBER 11, 1883 FOR A ROAD IN TOWNSHIP 16, RANGES 12 & 13 FOR JOHN LANGLEY, PRINCIPAL PETITIONER, SAID THAT **HE FOUND THE STONE** AT THE SOUTHEAST CORNER OF THE SOUTHWEST 1/4 OF THE NORTHWEST 1/4 OF SECTION 18-16-13 ON THIS ROAD SURVEY. SEE THE ROAD SURVEY FOR THE LOCATION AND WIDTH OF THE ROAD SURVEYED.

- 4) ROBERT MILLIKEN, COUNTY SURVEYOR FROM 1870 TO 1875 AND FROM 1882 TO 1883, IN A ROAD SURVEY FOR ROAD NUMBER 252 RECORDED IN ROAD RECORD BOOK "B" ON PAGES 594 TO 596 PETITIONED BY JOHN LANGLEY AND OTHERS FOR THE LOCATION AND VACATION OF A COUNTY ROAD IN TOWNSHIPS 16-12 AND 16-13 [PACKET 487 IN THE VAULT IN THE COUNTY SURVEYOR'S OFFICE] THAT HE SURVEYED ON DECEMBER 11, 1883, WAS ESTABLISHED AS 50 FOOT WIDE ROAD, EXCEPT AS SHOWN IN THE FIELD NOTES, ON JANUARY 10, 1884, AS NOTED BY J. E. JONES, CHAIRMAN OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS, AND RECORDED ON FEBRUARY 2, 1884 BY ROLAND LARKIN, COUNTY CLERK, SAID THAT **HE**

FOUND THE STONE AT THE SOUTHEAST CORNER OF THE SOUTHWEST 1/4 OF THE NORTHWEST 1/4 OF SECTION 18-16-13 ON THIS ROAD SURVEY. THEY **VACATED** ALL THAT PART OF THE OLD ROAD, LYING PARALLEL TO THIS SURVEY, BETWEEN THE INITIAL AND TERMINAL POINTS. SEE THE ROAD SURVEY FOR THE EXACT LOCATION AND WIDTH OF THIS ROAD.

- 5) R. H. EDMISTON, COUNTY SURVEYOR FROM 1884 TO 1887, IN SURVEY NUMBER TWO IN SURVEY BOOK "E" ON PAGE 2 DATED FEBRUARY 1, 1884 FOR AN **INFORMAL SURVEY** TO RESURVEY CERTAIN LINES AND CORRECT BEARINGS IN SECTION 18-16-13, SAID THAT **HE FOUND THE STONE** AT THE SOUTHWEST CORNER OF THE SOUTHEAST 1/4 OF THE NORTHWEST 1/4 OF SECTION 18-16-13 TO BEGIN THIS **INFORMAL SURVEY**.

- 6) STEVEN S. BROSEMER, L.S. 752, DEPUTY COUNTY SURVEYOR, IN A LAND SURVEY REFERENCE REPORT DATED APRIL 19, 2007 FOR PROJECT NUMBER 07019-02, SURVEY F18001 IN THE SURVEY FILE FOR TOWNSHIP 16-13, A SURVEY FOR A 32.65 ACRE TRACT IN THE NORTHWEST 1/4 OF SECTION 18-16-13 FOR JAMES NELSON AND RICHARD PORTER, SAID THAT **HE FOUND A 2" X 10" STONE** AT THE NORTH 1/16TH CORNER OF THE SOUTHWEST 1/4 OF SECTION 18-16-13 FROM THE PERMANENT SURVEY RECORDED IN SURVEY BOOK "D" ON PAGE 116 DATED 1883.
 - 1) THE STONE FALLS ON THE SOUTHEASTERLY SIDE OF A LOCUST TREE
 - 2) THE STONE FALLS ON THE NORTH SIDE OF A CORNER FENCE POST
 - 3) HE SET A 1/2" X 24" REBAR WITH HIS "BROSEMER L.S. 752" CAP ON THE EAST SIDE AND CENTER OF THE STONE
 - 4) IN LINE WITH A FENCE TO THE SOUTH
 - 5) IN LINE WITH A FENCE TO THE WEST
 - 6) 846.11' WEST TO A 1/2" REBAR WITH "BROSEMER L.S. 752" CAP SET
