

WEST 1/4 CORNER SECTION 07, TOWNSHIP 17 SOUTH, RANGE 11 EAST

- 1) ON PAGE 54 OF THE GLO ORIGINAL FIELD NOTES IN THE DRAFTING ROOM IN THE COUNTY ENGINEER'S OFFICE IT STATES THAT **THEY SET A LIMESTONE 20" X 12" X 3"** FOR THE WEST 1/4 CORNER OF SECTION 7-17-11 ON THE WEST TOWNSHIP BOUNDARY ON JANUARY 7, 1861.
THE GOVERNMENT SURVEY NOTES SHOWS THE FOLLOWING INFORMATION:
 - 1) 40.00 CHAINS NORTH ON THE RANGE LINE TO THE 24" X 14" X 4" LIMESTONE THEY SET FOR THE CORNER TO SECTIONS 6 & 7-17-11
 - 2) 40.00 CHAINS SOUTH ON THE RANGE LINE TO THE 20" X 14" X 3" LIMESTONE THEY SET FOR THE CORNER TO SECTIONS 7 & 18-17-11
- 2) D. T. McAULEY, COUNTY SURVEYOR FROM 1867 TO 1870, IN SURVEY NUMBER 130 RECORDED IN SURVEY BOOK "A" ON PAGES 214 & 215 DATED JULY 3, 1869 TO SURVEY THE NORTH 1/2 OF THE SOUTHEAST 1/4 OF SECTION 7-17-11, SAID THAT **HE FOUND THE STONE** AT THE WEST 1/4 CORNER OF SECTION 7-17-11 ON THE RANGE LINE ON THIS SURVEY.
- 3) ROBERT MILLIKEN, COUNTY SURVEYOR FROM 1870 TO 1875 AND FROM 1882 TO 1883, IN SURVEY NUMBER 3 OF THE 8TH TERM, A **PERMANENT SURVEY** RECORDED IN SURVEY BOOK "C" ON PAGE 58 DATED FEBRUARY 12 & 13, 1874 TO ESTABLISH THE CENTER CORNER AND SUBDIVIDE THE SOUTHEAST 1/4 OF SECTION 7-17-11 EQUALLY BY A LINE EAST AND WEST, SAID THAT **HE FOUND THE STONE** AT THE WEST 1/4 CORNER OF SECTION 7-17-11 ON THE RANGE LINE ON THIS **PERMANENT SURVEY**.
