

WEST 1/4 CORNER SECTION 22, TOWNSHIP 17 SOUTH, RANGE 11 EAST

- 1) ON PAGE 315 OF THE GLO ORIGINAL FIELD NOTES IN THE DRAFTING ROOM IN THE COUNTY ENGINEER'S OFFICE IT STATES THAT **THEY SET A LIMESTONE 16" X 14" X 3"** FOR THE 1/4 CORNER BETWEEN SECTIONS 21 & 22-17-11.

- 2) R. H. EDMISTON, COUNTY SURVEYOR FROM 1884 TO 1887, BY MATTHEW BROWN, DEPUTY, IN SURVEY NUMBER 69, A **PERMANENT SURVEY** RECORDED IN SURVEY BOOK "E" ON PAGE 69 DATED AUGUST 1 THROUGH NOVEMBER 15, 1884 AT THE ORDER OF A. S. STEADMAN, J. H. COURTNEY, AND M. WILLIAMSON TO SUBDIVIDE SECTIONS 16 & 17-17-11, SAID THAT HE DID **NOT** FIND THE STONE AT THE EAST 1/4 CORNER OF SECTION 21-17-11 AS HE RAN THE SECTION LINES FROM THE STONE THAT HE FOUND AT THE SOUTHEAST CORNER OF SECTION 21-17-11 NORTH TO THE STONE THAT HE FOUND AT THE NORTHEAST CORNER OF SECTION 9-21-11 ON THIS **PERMANENT SURVEY**. HE SAID THAT THIS SURVEY WAS SUBJECT TO A CORRECTED SURVEY RECORDED IN SURVEY BOOK "E" ON PAGE 79 DATED DECEMBER 20-25, 1884. THIS SURVEY IS RECORDED IN VOLUME 41 ON PAGE 27 IN THE REGISTER OF DEEDS OFFICE ON JANUARY 27, 1887 AND SURVEY F17001 IN THE SURVEY FILE FOR TOWNSHIP 17-11. HE DID **NOT** RESET THE EAST 1/4 CORNER OF SECTION 21-17-11 ON THIS **PERMANENT SURVEY**.

- 3) ALVA J. SMITH, COUNTY SURVEYOR FROM 1900 THROUGH 1906, IN SURVEY NUMBER 31, A **PERMANENT SURVEY** RECORDED IN SURVEY BOOK "E" ON PAGE 212 DATED AUGUST 12, 1901 BY THE ORDER OF W. E. DAVIS TO SURVEY SECTION 22-17-11, SAID THAT HE DID **NOT** FIND THE STONE AT THE WEST 1/4 CORNER OF SECTION 22-17-11, SO **HE SET A TEMPORARY CORNER** ON LINE AND HALFWAY BETWEEN THE GOVERNMENT STONE THAT HE FOUND AT THE NORTHWEST CORNER OF SECTION 22-17-11 AND THE STONE THAT HE FOUND AT THE SOUTHWEST CORNER OF SECTION 22-17-11 ON THIS **PERMANENT SURVEY**.
HIS SURVEY DRAWING SHOWS THE FOLLOWING INFORMATION:
 - 1) 2,649' NORTH TO THE GOVERNMENT STONE HE FOUND AT THE NORTHWEST CORNER OF SECTION 22-17-11
 - 2) 2,649' SOUTH TO THE STONE HE FOUND AT THE SOUTHWEST CORNER OF SECTION 22-17-11

- 4) STEVEN S. BROSEMER, L.S. 752, DEPUTY COUNTY SURVEYOR, IN A LAND SURVEY REFERENCE REPORT DATED MARCH 14, 2011 FOR PROJECT NUMBER 11031-02, SURVEY F21001 IN THE SURVEY FILE FOR TOWNSHIP 17-11 FOR A SURVEY OF THE WEST LINE OF AN EXCEPTED TRACT IN THE SOUTHEAST 1/4 OF SECTION 21-17-11 FOR ROBERT PRELLWITZ, SAID THAT **HE FOUND A 6" X 7" LIMESTONE** AT THE EAST 1/4 CORNER OF SECTION 21-17-11.
 - 1) 1/2" REBAR ON THE NORTH SIDE OF THE STONE FOUND
 - 2) 5/8" X 30" REBAR WITH LYON COUNTY CAP SET ON WEST SIDE OF STONE
 - 3) 1/2" X 24" REBAR WITH "LS 752" CAP SET ON EAST SIDE CENTER OF THE STONE
 - 4) 23.5' ENE TO A 40 D NAIL IN THE TOP OF THE NORTH GATE POST
 - 5) 38.40' SE TO A 40 D NAIL & WASHER IN THE TOP OF THE SOUTH GATE POST
 - 6) 23.80' WEST TO A CONCRETE NAIL & BOTTLECAP IN THE SOUTH FACE OF A CORNER FENCE POST
 - 7) 2' NORTH TO A LINE OF FENCE TO THE WEST EXTENDED
 - 8) IN THE CENTERLINE TRAVELED-WAY OF GRAVEL COUNTY ROAD "K" NORTH-SOUTHHIS SURVEY DRAWING SHOWS THE FOLLOWING INFORMATION:
 - 1) 430.27' WEST TO THE 1/2" REBAR WITH HIS "LS 752" CAP HE SET FOR THE NORTHWEST CORNER OF THE EXCEPTED TRACT

- 4) 2,648.74' SOUTH TO THE 1/2" REBAR HE FOUND AT THE SOUTHEAST CORNER OF THE SE1/4 OF SECTION 21-17-11
