

WEST 1/4 CORNER SECTION 36, TOWNSHIP 17 SOUTH, RANGE 11 EAST

- 1) ON PAGE 306 OF THE GLO ORIGINAL FIELD NOTES IN THE DRAFTING ROOM IN THE COUNTY ENGINEER'S OFFICE IT STATES THAT **THEY SET A LIMESTONE 17" X 12" X 3"** FOR THE 1/4 CORNER BETWEEN SECTIONS 35 & 36-17-11.

- 2) G. M. WALKER, BRECKENRIDGE COUNTY SURVEYOR FROM 1857 TO 1860, IN A ROAD SURVEY RECORDED IN SURVEY BOOK "A" ON PAGES 22 & 23 [PACKET 525 IN THE VAULT IN THE COUNTY SURVEYOR'S OFFICE] FOR THE NOTES OF A COUNTY ROAD FROM THE POINT AT WHICH THE EMPORIA AND WATERLOO ROAD CROSSES THE EAST LINE OF NOAH BIXLER'S CLAIM TO THE NORTHEAST CORNER OF S. CRANDALL'S CLAIM, BEING THE NORTHEAST CORNER OF THE SOUTHEAST 1/4 OF SECTION 26-17-11 THAT WAS ESTABLISHED ON FEBRUARY 28, 1859 IN THE COMMISSIONERS JOURNAL ON PAGE 48, SAID THAT **HE FOUND THE EAST 1/4 STONE POST** OF SECTION 35-17-11 ON THIS ROAD SURVEY.
HIS SURVEY NOTES SHOW THE FOLLOWING INFORMATION:
 - 1) 20.60 CHAINS NORTH TO THE STONE HE SET FOR AN ANGLE POINT TO THE NORTHEASTERLY ON THIS ROAD SURVEY
 - 2) 40.14 CHAINS SOUTH TO THE STONE POST HE FOUND AT THE SOUTHWEST CORNER OF SECTION 36-17-11 ON THE TOWNSHIP LINE
 - 3) 78.14 CHAINS SOUTH TO THE STONE HE FOUND AT THE EAST 1/4 POST OF SECTION 2-18-11
 - 4) 118.19 CHAINS SOUTH TO THE STONE HE FOUND AT THE NORTHEAST CORNER OF SECTION 11-18-11

- 3) D. T. McAULEY, COUNTY SURVEYOR FROM 1867 TO 1870, IN SURVEY NUMBER 31 RECORDED IN SURVEY BOOK "A" ON PAGE 126 DATED APRIL 2, 1868 TO SURVEY SECTION 36-17-11 FOR W. GILLILAND, ANDERSON, SHIELDS, AND ROSYENE, SAID THAT **HE SET A STONE** FOR THE WEST 1/4 CORNER OF SECTION 36-17-11 EQUIDISTANT BETWEEN THE STONE THAT HE FOUND AT THE NORTHWEST CORNER OF SECTION 36-17-11 AND THE STONE THAT HE SET FOR THE SOUTHWEST CORNER OF SECTION 36-17-11 ON THE TOWNSHIP LINE ON THIS SURVEY.
HIS SURVEY DRAWING SHOWS THE FOLLOWING INFORMATION:
 - 1) 80 RODS SOUTH TO THE STONE HE SET FOR THE WEST 1/2/4 CORNER OF THE SW1/4 OF SECTION 36-17-11
 - 2) 160 RODS SOUTH TO THE STONE HE SET FOR THE SOUTHWEST CORNER OF SECTION 36-17-11 ON THE TOWNSHIP LINE
 - 3) 160 RODS NORTH TO THE STONE HE FOUND AT THE NORTHWEST CORNER OF SECTION 36-17-11
 - 4) 317 RODS, 21 LINKS EAST TO THE STONE SET FOR THE EAST 1/4 CORNER OF SECTION 36-17-11

- 5) REA BOOK 30 ON PAGE 31 SAYS THAT **THEY DROVE AN IRON PIN** FOR THE WEST 1/4 CORNER OF SECTION 36-17-11 AT 2,640 FEET NORTH OF THE SOUTHWEST CORNER OF SECTION 36-17-11, AND IN LINE WITH FENCE LINES OF OLD TIME [NO FENCES] EAST AND WEST.
 - 1) 25' WEST TO A WITNESS PIN IN LINE WITH AN OLD FENCE LINE WEST [NO FENCE] AND WEST LINE OF THE ROAD ACCORDING TO A COUNTY STAKE

- 6) STEVEN S. BROSEMER, L.S. 752, IN A LAND SURVEY REFERENCE REPORT DATED AUGUST 9, 1985, FOR PROJECT NUMBER 85113, SURVEY F36002 IN THE SURVEY FILE FOR TOWNSHIP 17-11 TO REESTABLISH THE WEST LINE OF SECTION 36-17-11, SAID THAT THAT HE CONSIDERED THAT THE WEST 1/4 CORNER OF SECTION 36-17-11 WAS **LOST** AS THE PHYSICAL EVIDENCE AT THIS CORNER IS NOT SUFFICIENT TO WARRANT A DETERMINATION OF OBLITERATION. **HE SET A 1/2" REBAR WITH HIS "BROSEMER LS 752" CAP** FOR THE WEST 1/4 CORNER OF SECTION 36-17-11 ON

TRUE LINE AND HALFWAY BETWEEN THE SOUTHWEST AND NORTHWEST CORNERS OF SECTION 36-17-11. IN HIS *REPORT OF SURVEY* HE SAID THAT PRIOR TO HIS INVOLVEMENT, THE COUNTY HAD EXCAVATED FOR THE McAULEY STONE AT THE WEST 1/4 CORNER OF SECTION 36-17-11 AND IT WAS **NOT** FOUND. THIS SURVEY WAS RECORDED IN VOLUME 418 ON PAGE 13 IN THE REGISTER OF DEEDS OFFICE ON AUGUST 22, 1985.

- 1) 2.0' SOUTH TO A CROP LINE TO THE EAST
- 2) 1.0' SOUTH TO A TREE ROW TO THE WEST
- 3) 4.0' EAST TO THE TRAVELED WAY OF THE ROAD NORTH-SOUTH
- 4) 28.9' EAST TO A SPIKE IN A POWER POLE
- 5) 28.8' WEST TO A LINE OF FENCE NORTH-SOUTH

HIS SURVEY DRAWING SHOWS THE FOLLOWING INFORMATION:

- 1) 2,643.82' NORTH TO THE 1/2" REBAR WITH HIS "BROSEMER LS 752" CAP HE SET FOR THE NORTHWEST CORNER OF SECTION 36-17-11
- 2) 2,643.82' SOUTH TO THE 5/8" REBAR HE FOUND AT THE SOUTHWEST CORNER OF SECTION 36-18-11 ON THE TOWNSHIP LINE, THAT WAS SET BY AI CHAMNESS
