

**CENTER CORNER SECTION 33, TOWNSHIP 18 SOUTH, RANGE 11 EAST**

- 1) G. M. WALKER, BRECKENRIDGE COUNTY SURVEYOR FROM 1857 TO 1860, IN SURVEY NUMBER 2 RECORDED IN SURVEY BOOK "A" ON PAGE 3, A **PERMANENT SURVEY** DATED DECEMBER 31, 1857 TO ESTABLISH THE CENTER POST OF SECTION 33-18-11 AND ALSO THE SOUTHWEST AND SOUTHEAST CORNERS OF THE NORTH 1/2 OF THE SOUTHEAST 1/4 OF SAID SECTION 33-18-11, SAID THAT **HE SET THE STONE CENTER POST** FOR THE PERMANENT CENTER CORNER OF SECTION 33-18-11 "BY CORRECTION" ON LINE AND HALFWAY BETWEEN THE STONE 1/4 POST THAT HE FOUND ON THE NORTH LINE OF SECTION 33-18-11 AND THE STONE 1/4 POST THAT HE FOUND ON THE SOUTH LINE OF SECTION 33-18-11 ON THE TOWNSHIP LINE ON THIS **PERMANENT SURVEY**.

HIS SURVEY NOTES SHOW THE FOLLOWING INFORMATION:

- 1) 40.34 CHAINS NORTH TO THE FOUND NORTH STONE 1/4 POST OF SEC. 33-18-11
  - 2) 20.17 CHAINS SOUTH TO THE STONE POST HE SET FOR THE PERMANENT SOUTHWEST CORNER OF THE N1/2 OF THE SE1/4 OF SECTION 33-18-11
  - 3) 40.34 CHAINS SOUTH TO THE FOUND SOUTH STONE 1/4 POST OF SECTION 33-18-11 ON THE TOWNSHIP LINE
- 2) W. T. PARKER, SURVEYOR, IN A ROAD SURVEY RECORDED IN ROAD RECORD BOOK "A" ON PAGES 8 & 9 [PACKET 170 IN THE VAULT IN THE COUNTY SURVEYOR'S OFFICE] FOR THE "EMPORIA AND AMERICUS ROAD" SURVEYED SEPTEMBER 11, 1858, AND RECORDED IN THE COMMISSIONER'S JOURNAL ON PAGE 31 ON NOVEMBER 1, 1858, SAID THAT **HE FOUND THE STONE** AT THE CENTER CORNER OF SECTION 33-18-11 ON THIS ROAD SURVEY. NO WIDTH IS RECORDED AND BY THE TERRITORIAL LAW IN EFFECT AT THE TIME THE ROAD WOULD BE FORTY FEET WIDE.

HIS SURVEY NOTES SHOWS THE FOLLOWING INFORMATION:

- 1) THIS ROAD EXTENDS SOUTH TO THE CENTER CORNER OF SECTION 4-19-11 AT A TURN TO THE SOUTHEASTERLY TO SOUTHWEST CORNER OF THE SE1/4 OF SECTION 3-19-11 TO START THIS ROAD SURVEY
- 2) THIS ROAD EXTENDS NORTHWESTERLY TO THE SOUTH LINE OF AMERICUS TO END THIS ROAD SURVEY

- 3) G. M. WALKER, BRECKENRIDGE COUNTY SURVEYOR FROM 1857 TO 1860, IN A ROAD SURVEY RECORDED IN ROAD RECORD BOOK "A" ON PAGES 17 TO 19 FOR THE RESURVEY OF THE "EMPORIA TO AMERICUS ROAD" ORIGINALLY SURVEYED SEPTEMBER 10, 1858 AND ESTABLISHED NOVEMBER 1, 1858, RESURVEYED THE ROAD ON FEBRUARY 15 & 16, 1859 AND IT WAS ESTABLISHED ON FEBRUARY 28, 1859 [PACKET 526 IN THE VAULT IN THE COUNTY SURVEYOR'S OFFICE] ESTABLISHED NOVEMBER 1, 1858, SAID THAT **HE FOUND THE CENTER POST STONE** OF SECTION 33-18-11 AT A TURN TO THE NORTHWESTERLY AND TO THE SOUTH ON THIS ROAD RESURVEY.

HIS SURVEY NOTES SHOWS THE FOLLOWING INFORMATION:

- 1) THIS ROAD EXTENDS SOUTH ON THE 1/2 SECTION LINE TO THE STONE HE FOUND AT THE SOUTH 1/4 POST OF SECTION 4-19-11 TO COMMENCE THIS ROAD SURVEY
- 4) G. M. WALKER, BRECKENRIDGE COUNTY SURVEYOR FROM 1857 TO 1860, IN A ROAD SURVEY ON REVIEW FROM THE ORIGINAL SURVEY OF SEPTEMBER 10, 1858, AND ESTABLISHED NOVEMBER 1, 1858, RECORDED IN SURVEY BOOK "A" ON PAGES 26, 27 & 28 DATED FEBRUARY 15, 1859 FOR THE COUNTY ROAD FROM EMPORIA TO AMERICUS, SAID THAT **HE FOUND THE STONE CENTER POST** OF SECTION 33-18-11 ON THIS ROAD SURVEY.

- 1) 20.17 CHAINS SOUTH TO THE STONE HE FOUND AT THE SOUTHWEST CORNER OF THE N1/2 OF THE SE1/4 OF SECTION 33-18-11
  
- 5) D. T. McAULEY, COUNTY SURVEYOR FROM 1867 TO 1870, IN SURVEY NUMBER 54 RECORDED IN SURVEY BOOK "A" ON PAGE 153 DATED MAY 22, 1868 FOR A SURVEY OF ANN OWEN'S LAND, BEING ALL THAT PART OF THE SOUTHWEST 1/4 OF SECTION 33-18-11, AND ALSO THE EAST 1/2 OF THE NORTHWEST 1/4 OF SECTION 4-19-11, SAID THAT **HE FOUND THE STONE ESTABLISHED BY A FORMER COUNTY SURVEYOR** AT THE CENTER CORNER OF SECTION 33-18-11 ON THIS SURVEY. HIS SURVEY NOTES SHOWS THE FOLLOWING INFORMATION:
  - 1) 160 RODS, 9 LINKS EAST TO THE STONE HE SET FOR THE EAST 1/4 CORNER OF SECTION 33-18-11 THAT HE ESTABLISHED FROM WITNESS TREES
  - 2) 80 RODS, 11 LINKS WEST TO THE STONE HE SET FOR THE NORTH 1/2/4 CORNER OF THE SW1/4 OF SECTION 33-18-11
  - 3) 160 RODS, 22 LINKS WEST TO THE STONE HE FOUND AT THE WEST 1/4 CORNER OF SECTION 33-18-11
  
- 6) J. H. HIBBEN, COUNTY SURVEYOR FROM 1875 TO 1882, IN A ROAD SURVEY RECORDED IN ROAD RECORD BOOK "A-1" ON PAGES 22 & 23 FOR ROAD NUMBER 6 BY A PETITION BY P. B. PLUMB AND OTHERS TO VACATE A PORTION OF THE "EMPORIA AND AMERICUS ROAD" AND RELOCATE A COUNTY ROAD IN TOWNSHIP 18-11 [PACKET 108 IN THE VAULT IN THE COUNTY SURVEYOR'S OFFICE]. THE PORTION OF THE "EMPORIA AND AMERICUS ROAD" TO BE VACATED BEGINS AT THE CENTER CORNER OF SECTION 33-8-11 AND RUNS NORTHWESTERLY TO THE POINT WHERE IT CROSSES THE EAST LINE OF SECTION 29-18-11. HE SURVEYED THE NEW ROAD LOCATION ON AUGUST 23, 1878, IT WAS ESTABLISHED AS A 50 FOOT WIDE ROAD ON OCTOBER 7, 1878, AND WAS RECORDED ON NOVEMBER 30, 1878 BY WILLIAM F. EWING, COUNTY CLERK. HE SAID THAT **HE FOUND THE STONE** AT THE CENTER CORNER OF SECTION 33-18-11 AT THE INTERSECTION OF THE "EMPORIA AND AMERICUS" ROAD TO BEGIN THIS ROAD SURVEY. HIS SURVEY NOTES SHOWS THE FOLLOWING INFORMATION:
  - 1) THIS ROAD EXTENDS WEST FOR 2,640' TO THE 1/4 CORNER ON THE WEST LINE OF SECTION 33-18-11; THEN TURNS AND EXTENDS NORTH ON THE SECTION LINE FOR 2,640' TO THE NORTHWEST CORNER OF SECTION 33-18-11; THEN CONTINUES NORTH ON THE SECTION LINE FOR 1,620' TO INTERSECT THE "EMPORIA AND AMERICUS" ROAD AND THE TERMINATION OF THIS ROAD SURVEY
