

**CENTER CORNER SECTION 23, TOWNSHIP 18 SOUTH, RANGE 12 EAST**

- 1) ROBERT MILLIKEN, COUNTY SURVEYOR FROM 1870 TO 1875 AND FROM 1882 TO 1883, IN A SURVEY NUMBER 87 OF THE 7<sup>TH</sup> TERM, A **PERMANENT SURVEY** RECORDED IN SURVEY BOOK "C" ON PAGE 9 DATED FEBRUARY 11, 1873 TO ESTABLISH THE CORNERS OF THE SOUTH 1/2 OF THE NORTHEAST 1/4 AND THE NORTH 1/2 OF THE SOUTHEAST 1/4 OF SECTION 23-18-12, SAID THAT **HE SET A POST** FOR THE PERMANENT CENTER CORNER OF SECTION 23-18-12 AT THE INTERSECTION OF THE LINES FROM THE OPPOSITE 1/4 CORNERS ON THIS **PERMANENT SURVEY**. HE SET A POST FOR THE PERMANENT CENTER CORNER BECAUSE "THE GROUND WAS TOO FROZEN TO SET A STONE". **[NOTE:** THE WORDING IN THE DESCRIPTION HAS TOWNSHIP 18, RANGE **11**, BUT THERE IS A REFERENCE IN THE FIELD NOTES TO CROSSING BADGER CREEK, MAKING THIS SURVEY IN TOWNSHIP 18, RANGE **12**, WHICH CORRESPONDS TO THE HEADING AT THE TOP OF THE LEFT PAGE - WARREN CHIP WOODS, L.S. 603, COUNTY SURVEYOR]

**HIS SURVEY NOTES/DRAWING INDICATES THE FOLLOWING INFORMATION:**

- 1) 2,631-1/2' WEST TO THE STONE HE FOUND AT THE WEST 1/4 OF SEC. 23-18-12
- 2) 1,329' NORTH TO A POST HE SET FOR THE PERMANENT WEST 1/2/4 CORNER OF THE NE1/4 OF SECTION 23-18-12 "THE GROUND BEING TOO FROZEN TO SET A STONE"
- 3) 2,658' NORTH TO THE STONE HE FOUND AT THE NORTH 1/4 CORNER OF SECTION 23-18-12
- 4) 2,637-1/2' EAST TO THE STONE HE FOUND AT THE EAST 1/4 CORNER OF SECTION 23-18-12
- 5) 1,326' SOUTH TO THE POST HE SET FOR THE PERMANENT WEST 1/2/4 CORNER OF THE SE1/4 OF SECTION 23-18-12 "THE GROUND BEING TOO FROZEN TO SET A STONE"
- 6) 2,652' SOUTH TO THE STONE HE FOUND AT THE SOUTH 1/4 CORNER OF SECTION 23-18-12
