

WEST 1/16TH CORNER OF THE NORTHWEST 1/4 OF SECTION 24, TOWNSHIP 18 SOUTH, RANGE 12 EAST

- 1) E. B. KIRKENDALL, COUNTY SURVEYOR FROM 1863 TO 1863, IN A ROAD SURVEY RECORDED IN SURVEY BOOK "A" ON PAGE 47 BY THE PETITION OF TIMOTHY McINTIRE AND OTHERS OF JACKSON TOWNSHIP FOR A TOWNSHIP ROAD FROM "FOREST HILL TO WATERLOO" THAT WAS SURVEYED AND VIEWED APRIL 24, 1864 AND ESTABLISHED JULY 6, 1864 IN THE COMMISSIONERS JOURNAL ON PAGE 2, APPARENTLY **FOUND THE STONE** AT THE NORTHEAST CORNER OF THE SOUTHEAST 1/4 [OF THE SOUTHEAST 1/4] OF SECTION 23-18-12 TO END THIS ROAD SURVEY AS HE RAN 4-1/4 MILES NORTH OF THE NORTHEAST CORNER OF THE SOUTHEAST 1/4 OF SECTION 11-19-12.

HIS SURVEY NOTES SHOWS THE FOLLOWING INFORMATION:

- 1) THIS ROAD EXTENDS SOUTH ON THE SECTION LINES FOR 4-1/4 MILES TO THE NORTHEAST CORNER OF THE SE1/4 OF SECTION 11-19-12 ON THE NORTH LINE OF THE TOWN OF FOREST HILL TO BEGIN THIS ROAD SURVEY
- 2) D. T. McAULEY, COUNTY SURVEYOR FROM 1867 TO 1870, IN SURVEY NUMBER 90 RECORDED IN SURVEY BOOK "A" ON PAGE 184 DATED FEBRUARY 15, 1869 FOR A SURVEY OF LAND OWNED BY WELLS, BEING IN SECTION 24-18-12, TO SURVEY THE SOUTH 1/2 OF THE NORTHWEST 1/4 AND THE NORTH 1/2 OF THE SOUTHWEST 1/4 OF SECTION 24, SAID THAT HE DETERMINED THAT THE **TRUE POSITION** FOR THE WEST 1/2/4 CORNER OF THE NORTHWEST 1/4 OF SECTION 24-18-12 TO BE EQUIDISTANT BETWEEN THE STONES THAT HE FOUND AT THE NORTHWEST CORNER AND THE WEST 1/4 CORNER OF SECTION 24-18-12, AND THAT THIS **TRUE POSITION** FALLS IN A CREEK. **HE SET A STONE AT 5 LINKS NORTH OF THE TRUE POSITION** FOR THIS 1/2/4 CORNER ON THIS SURVEY.

- 3) ROBERT MILLIKEN, COUNTY SURVEYOR FROM 1870 TO 1875 AND FROM 1882 TO 1883, IN A SURVEY NUMBER 87 OF THE 7TH TERM, A **PERMANENT SURVEY** RECORDED IN SURVEY BOOK "C" ON PAGE 9 DATED FEBRUARY 11, 1873 TO ESTABLISH THE CORNERS OF THE SOUTH 1/2 OF THE NORTHEAST 1/4 AND THE NORTH 1/2 OF THE SOUTHEAST 1/4 OF SECTION 23-18-12, SAID THAT **HE SET A 4" DIAMETER POST** FOR THE PERMANENT EAST 1/2/4 CORNER OF THE NORTHEAST 1/4 OF SECTION 23-18-12 ON LINE AND HALFWAY BETWEEN THE STONE THAT HE FOUND AT THE NORTHEAST CORNER OF SECTION 23-18-12 AND THE STONE THAT HE FOUND AT THE EAST 1/4 CORNER OF SECTION 23-18-12 ON THIS **PERMANENT SURVEY**. HE SET A POST FOR THIS PERMANENT 1/2/4 CORNER BECAUSE "THE GROUND WAS TOO FROZEN TO SET A STONE". **[NOTE:** THE WORDING IN THE DESCRIPTION HAS TOWNSHIP 18, RANGE 11, BUT THERE IS A REFERENCE IN THE FIELD NOTES TO CROSSING BADGER CREEK, MAKING THIS SURVEY IN TOWNSHIP 18, RANGE 12, WHICH CORRESPONDS TO THE HEADING AT THE TOP OF THE LEFT PAGE – WARREN CHIP WOODS, L.S. 603, COUNTY SURVEYOR]

HIS SURVEY NOTES/DRAWING INDICATES THE FOLLOWING INFORMATION:

- 1) 1,324-1/2' NORTH TO THE STONE HE FOUND AT THE NORTHEAST CORNER OF SECTION 23-18-12
- 2) 1,324-1/2' SOUTH TO THE STONE HE FOUND AT THE EAST 1/4 CORNER OF SECTION 23-18-12
- 3) 2,646-1/2' SOUTH TO THE STONE HE SET FOR THE PERMANENT EAST 1/2/4 CORNER OF THE SE1/4 OF SECTION 23-18-12
- 4) 3,968-1/2' SOUTH TO THE STONE HE FOUND AT THE SOUTHEAST CORNER OF SECTION 23-18-12
