

NORTH 1/16TH CORNER NORTHEAST QUARTER OF SECTION 16, TOWNSHIP 19 SOUTH, RANGE 11 EAST

- 1) ROBERT MILLIKEN, COUNTY SURVEYOR FROM 1870 TO 1875 AND FROM 1882 TO 1883, IN SURVEY NUMBER 29, A **PERMANENT SURVEY** RECORDED IN SURVEY BOOK "B" ON PAGE 29 DATED APRIL 25, 1870 TO ESTABLISH THE CORNERS OF THE NORTHEAST 1/4 OF THE SOUTHEAST 1/4 OF SECTION 9-19-11, SAID THAT **HE SET A TEMPORARY 1/2/4 CORNER** ON THE SOUTH SIDE OF THE SOUTHEAST 1/4 OF SECTION 9-19-11 ON LINE AND HALFWAY BETWEEN THE STONE THAT HE FOUND AT THE SOUTH 1/4 CORNER OF SECTION 9-19-11 AND THE STONE THAT HE FOUND AT THE SOUTHEAST CORNER OF SECTION 9-19-11 ON THIS **PERMANENT SURVEY**.
HIS SURVEY NOTES SHOWS THE FOLLOWING INFORMATION:
 - 1) 1,331' WEST TO THE STONE HE FOUND AT THE SOUTH 1/4 CORNER OF SECTION 9-19-11
 - 2) 1,331' EAST TO THE STONE HE FOUND AT THE SOUTHEAST CORNER OF SECTION 9-19-11
- 2) J. H. HIBBEN, COUNTY SURVEYOR FROM 1875 TO 1882, IN A ROAD SURVEY RECORDED IN ROAD RECORD BOOK "A-1" ON PAGE 46 FOR ROAD NUMBER 12 AND DATED OCTOBER 1878, SAID THAT **HE FOUND THE STONE** AT THIS CORNER TO END THIS ROAD SURVEY.
- 3) ALVA J. SMITH, COUNTY SURVEYOR FROM 1900 THROUGH 1906, IN A PRIVATE SURVEY RECORDED IN SURVEY BOOK "F" ON PAGE 115 DATED JANUARY 25, 1905 FOR A SURVEY IN THE SOUTHEAST 1/4 OF THE SOUTHWEST 1/4 OF THE SOUTHEAST 1/4 OF SECTION 9, SAID THAT **HE FOUND THE STONE IN PLACE ON THE SECTION LINE** AT THE SOUTHEAST CORNER OF THE SOUTHEAST 1/4 OF THE OF THE SOUTHWEST 1/4 OF THE SOUTHEAST 1/4 OF SECTION 9-19-11. HIS DRAWING SHOWS THE STONE IN *SIXTH AVENUE AND ON THE WEST LINE OF CHESTNUT STREET*. HIS FIELD NOTES ARE IN HIS BOOK 2 ON PAGE 115 IN THE "KRETSINGER COLLECTION" OF FIELD BOOKS.
- 4) J. HARRISON PARKMAN, COUNTY SURVEYOR FROM 1907 TO 1915, BY J. MAX YINGLING, DEPUTY COUNTY SURVEYOR, IN SURVEY NUMBER 150 OF TERM 2, A **PERMANENT SURVEY** RECORDED IN SURVEY BOOK "D" ON PAGE 74 DATED JANUARY 22, 1909 FOR TWO TRACTS IN THE SOUTHWEST 1/4 OF THE SOUTHEAST 1/4 OF SECTION 9-19-11, SAID THAT **HE FOUND THE STONE** AT THE SOUTHEAST CORNER OF THE SOUTHWEST 1/4 OF THE SOUTHEAST 1/4 OF SECTION 9-19-11 ON THIS **PERMANENT SURVEY**.
HIS SURVEY NOTES/DRAWING SHOWS THE FOLLOWING INFORMATION:
 - 1) 130' WEST TO THE THREE FOOT, 3/4" ROUND IRON STAKE HE SET ON THIS PERMANENT SURVEY
 - 2) 330' WEST TO THE 3/4" SQUARE IRON STAKE, ABOUT 15" LONG HE SET ON THIS PERMANENT SURVEY
 - 3) 214' NORTH TO THE STAKE HE SET ON THIS PERMANENT SURVEY
- 5) COMMISSIONER'S ROAD JOURNAL BOOK "A", PAGE 38
ON AUGUST 3, 1914 A PETITION SIGNED BY G. F. BLANKENSHIP AND OTHERS FOR THE LOCATION OF A ROAD IN TOWNSHIP 19-11 WAS PRESENTED TO THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS. THE ROAD WAS VIEWED ON SEPTEMBER 15, 1914, AND THE FINAL ORDER WAS ISSUED ON OCTOBER 5, 1914.
 - 1) THE PETITIONED ROAD BEGAN AT THE SOUTHEAST CORNER OF THE SOUTHWEST 1/4 OF THE SOUTHEAST 1/4 OF SECTION 9-19-11; THENCE NORTH ON THE EAST SIDE OF THE WEST 1/2 OF SAID SOUTHEAST 1/4 TO THE NORTH LINE OF SAID SOUTHEAST 1/4; THENCE WEST 20 FEET; THENCE SOUTH PARALLEL WITH

- THE EAST LINE OF THE WEST 1/2 OF THE SOUTHEAST 1/4 TO THE SOUTH LINE OF SAID SOUTHEAST 1/4; THENCE EAST 20 FEET TO THE PLACE OF BEGINNING.
- 2) THE FINAL ORDER GRANTED THE ROAD IN PART AS FOLLOWS: GRANTED AS PETITIONED **EXCEPT** THAT PORTION LYING BETWEEN THE SOUTH LINE OF THE SOUTHEAST 1/4 OF SECTION 9-19-11 AND LEWIS AVENUE, WHICH IS GRANTED FOR A WIDTH OF **10 FEET ONLY**
 - 3) THE ROAD GRANTED WAS **50 FEET WIDE EXCEPT THAT PORTION SOUTH OF LEWIS AVENUE, WHICH IS 40 FEET**
- 6) MATTHEW BROWN, COUNTY SURVEYOR FROM 1888 TO 1900, AND 1914, BY HOWARD E. BROWN, DEPUTY COUNTY SURVEYOR, IN A ROAD SURVEY FOR ROAD NUMBER 684 RECORDED IN ROAD RECORD BOOK "E" ON PAGE 41 PETITIONED BY G. F. BLANKENSHIP AND OTHERS FOR A ROAD IN TOWNSHIP 19-11 [PACKET 931 IN THE VAULT IN THE COUNTY SURVEYOR'S OFFICE] THAT WAS VIEWED BY THE COUNTY COMMISSIONERS AND THE DEPUTY COUNTY SURVEYOR ON SEPTEMBER 15, 1914, SAID THAT "ALL FOUR CORNERS TO THE SOUTHEAST QUARTER OF SECTION 9-19-11 WERE IN AT THE TIME THIS SURVEY WAS MADE, AND THE EAST LINE OF THE WEST 1/2 OF SAID QUARTER WAS MIDWAY BETWEEN THESE **STONES.**" THE ROAD WAS GRANTED AS PETITIONED FOR **EXCEPT** THAT PORTION LAYING BETWEEN THE SOUTH LINE OF THE SOUTHEAST 1/4 OF SECTION 9-19-11 AND LEWIS AVENUE IN THE CITY OF EMPORIA WHICH PART SHOULD BE GRANTED TO THE **WIDTH OF 10 FEET ONLY.** AS NOTED BY E. MOORHEAD, CHAIRMAN OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS. HIS SURVEY DRAWING SHOWS THAT **HE FOUND AN IRON PIN** AT THE SOUTHEAST CORNER OF THE WEST 1/2 OF THE SOUTHEAST 1/4 OF SECTION 9-19-11 IN SIXTH AVENUE TO BEGIN THIS ROAD SURVEY.
- HIS SURVEY NOTES/DRAWING SHOWS THE FOLLOWING INFORMATION:**
- 1) BEGINNING AT THE SOUTHEAST CORNER OF THE W1/2 OF THE SE1/4 OF SECTION 9-19-11; THENCE NORTH TO THE NORTHEAST CORNER OF THE W1/2 OF THE SE1/4 OF SECTION 9-19-11. ROAD TO BE 10 FEET OFF THE WEST SIDE OF THE ABOVE LINE FROM THE NORTH SIDE OF 6TH AVENUE TO THE SOUTH SIDE OF LEWIS AVENUE AND TO BE 20 FEET OFF THE WEST SIDE OF SAID LINE FROM THE NORTH SIDE OF LEWIS AVENUE TO THE SOUTH SIDE OF 12TH AVENUE.
- 7) AI CHAMNESS, DEPUTY COUNTY SURVEYOR FROM 1906 TO 1946, IN A **PERMANENT SURVEY** RECORDED IN PERMANENT SURVEY BOOK 1 ON PAGE 121 AT THE ORDER OF EDNA D. STOUT TO PERMANENTLY ESTABLISH THE CORNERS TO HER LOT IN THE SOUTHEAST 1/4 OF SECTION 19, SAID THAT **HE FOUND AN IRON PIN IN A "WELL" IN THE BRICK PAVEMENT** IN THE INTERSECTION OF *CHESTNUT STREET AND SIXTH AVENUE* MARKING THE SOUTH 1/4 CORNER OF THE SOUTHEAST 1/4 OF SECTION 9-19-11 ON AUGUST 11, 1941 ON THIS PERMANENT SURVEY. HIS FIELD NOTES ARE IN HIS BOOK "V" ON PAGE 99 IN THE "KRETSINGER COLLECTION" OF FIELD BOOKS.
- 8) E. C. GOLDSMITH, COUNTY ENGINEER FROM 1944 TO 1949, BY W. D. KRETSINGER, L.S. 363, IN AN **INFORMAL SURVEY** RECORDED IN PERMANENT SURVEY BOOK 1 ON PAGE 137 TO RELOCATE THE CORNERS OF LOTS ONE, TWO AND THREE IN THE MORRIS JONES SUBDIVISION IN THE SOUTHWEST 1/4 OF THE SOUTHEAST 1/4 OF SECTION 9 IN THE CITY OF EMPORIA, SAID THAT **HE FOUND AN IRON PIN UNDER A WATER CAP** AT THE SOUTHEAST CORNER OF THE SOUTHWEST 1/4 OF THE SOUTHEAST 1/4 OF SECTION 9-19-11 AT THE INTERSECTION OF *SIXTH AVENUE AND CHESTNUT STREET* ON THIS **INFORMAL SURVEY.** HE USED THIS IRON PIN AND THE IRON PIN HE FOUND THE INTERSECTION OF 12TH AVENUE AND CHESTNUT STREET TO ESTABLISH THE EAST LINE OF THE SOUTHWEST 1/4 OF THE SOUTH-EAST 1/4 OF SECTION 16-19-11.

- 9) E. C. GOLDSMITH, COUNTY ENGINEER FROM 1944 TO 1949, IN A **PERMANENT SURVEY** RECORDED IN PERMANENT SURVEY BOOK 1 ON PAGE 156 WITH NO DATE, SHOWS ON HIS SURVEY DRAWING THAT **HE FOUND AN IRON PIN** AT THIS CORNER ON THIS **PERMANENT SURVEY**.
- 10) W. D. KRETSINGER, L.S. 363, COUNTY ENGINEER FROM 1952 TO 1981, IN LARGE SURVEY SR #16016 IN THE SURVEY DRAWER FOR SECTIONS 11-16 IN TOWNSHIP 19-11 DATED DECEMBER 16, 1962, SHOWS ON HIS SURVEY DRAWING THAT **HE FOUND A PLUS (“+”) IN THE PAVEMENT** AT THE NORTHWEST CORNER OF THE NORTHEAST 1/4 OF THE NORTHEAST 1/4 OF SECTION 16-19-11.
- 10) LESLIE M. GOULD, L.S. 142, COUNTY SURVEYOR FROM 1953 TO 1978, IN LARGE SURVEY SR #16003 IN THE SURVEY DRAWER DATED JUNE 24, 1953, SHOWS ON HIS SURVEY DRAWING THAT **HE FOUND A PLUS (“+”) IN THE PAVEMENT** AT THE NORTHEAST CORNER OF THE NORTHWEST 1/4 OF THE NORTHEAST 1/4 OF SECTION 16-19-11.

NORTH SIXTEENTH CORNER NORTHEAST QUARTER SECTION 16-19-11
