

CENTER 1/4 CORNER SECTION 30, TOWNSHIP 19 SOUTH, RANGE 11 EAST

- 1) ROBERT MILLIKEN, COUNTY SURVEYOR FROM 1870 TO 1875 AND FROM 1882 TO 1883, BY D. T. McAULEY, DEPUTY COUNTY SURVEYOR, IN A ROAD SURVEY RECORDED IN ROAD RECORD BOOK "A" ON PAGE 205 [PACKET 56 IN THE VAULT IN THE COUNTY SURVEYOR'S OFFICE] PETITIONED BY H. C. THOMPSON AND OTHERS FOR A COUNTY ROAD IN TOWNSHIP 19-11 THAT HE SURVEYED OCTOBER 18, 1872, AND WAS ORDERED ESTABLISHED AS A 60 FOOT WIDE ROAD BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS ON JANUARY 6, 1873 AS ATTESTED BY DAVID S. GILMORE, COUNTY CLERK, SHOWS ON HIS SURVEY DRAWING THAT **HE FOUND THE STONE** AT THE CENTER CORNER OF SECTION 30-19-11 ON THIS ROAD SURVEY. THIS CORNER WAS NOT A PART OF THIS ROAD BUT WAS USED AS A REFERENCE TO THE END OF THIS ROAD SURVEY
- 2) ROBERT MILLIKEN, COUNTY SURVEYOR FROM 1870 TO 1875 AND FROM 1882 TO 1883, IN A **PERMANENT SURVEY** RECORDED IN SURVEY BOOK "C" ON PAGE 103 DATED OCTOBER 1874, STATES THAT **HE SET A 16" X 12" X 3" STONE** FOR THE CENTER CORNER OF SECTION 30-19-11 ON THIS **PERMANENT SURVEY**.
- 3) MATTHEW BROWN, COUNTY SURVEYOR FROM 1888 TO 1900, AND 1914, IN A ROAD SURVEY FOR ROAD NUMBER 678 RECORDED IN ROAD RECORD BOOK "E" ON PAGE 35 PETITIONED BY F. E. THOMAS AND OTHERS FOR THE **VACATION** OF A ROAD IN TOWNSHIP 19-11 [PACKET 848 IN THE VAULT IN THE COUNTY ENGINEERS OFFICE] THAT WAS VIEWED BY THE COUNTY COMMISSIONERS AND COUNTY SURVEYOR ON MAY 12, 1914 AND WAS **VACATED** ON JUNE 5, 1914 AS NOTED BY N. S. WENDLING, CHAIRMAN OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS, APPARENTLY **FOUND THE STONE** AT THE SOUTHEAST CORNER OF THE NORTHWEST 1/4 OF SECTION 30-19-11 ON THIS ROAD SURVEY.
HIS SURVEY NOTES SHOWS THE FOLLOWING INFORMATION:
 - 1) BEGINNING IN THE MIDDLE OF THE PUBLIC ROAD ABOUT 40 RODS WEST OF THE SOUTHEAST CORNER OF THE NW1/4 OF SECTION 30-19-11; THENCE NORTH TO THE COTTONWOOD RIVER AND ENDING THERE
- 4) STEVEN S. BROSEMER, L.S. 752, DEPUTY COUNTY SURVEYOR, IN A SECTION CORNER REPORT DATED FEBRUARY 28, 1997, FOR JOB NUMBER 96309, SAID THAT **HE FOUND A 3" X 11" WHITE LIMESTONE** AT THE CENTER CORNER OF SECTION 30-19-11. **HE DROVE A 5/8" REBAR WITH A LYON COUNTY CAP OVER THE TOP OF THE STONE AND ON THE NORTH SIDE OF THE STONE.**
 - 1) 21.0' SSW TO A CONCRETE NAIL IN A LONE HEDGE
 - 2) 34.3' NW TO A CONCRETE NAIL IN A TRIPLE ELM TREE
 - 3) IN THE CENTERLINE TRAVELED WAY OF THE ROAD
 - 4) 7.3' WEST TO A CROP LINE TO THE NORTH [EXTENDED]
- 5) STEVEN S. BROSEMER, L.S. 752, DEPUTY COUNTY SURVEYOR, IN SURVEY F30001 IN THE SURVEY FILE FOR SECTIONS 17-36 IN TOWNSHIP 19-11 FOR THE SURVEY OF A TRACT OF LAND IN THE SOUTHWEST QUARTER OF SECTION 31-19-11 FOR PROJECT 960307 DATED JANUARY 24, 1999, SHOWS ON HIS SURVEY DRAWING THAT **HE FOUND THE STONE** AT THE NORTHEAST CORNER OF THE SOUTHWEST QUARTER OF SECTION 30-19-11. HIS TIES ARE MISSING FROM THE SURVEY TIE FILES.
HIS SURVEY DRAWING SHOWS THE FOLLOWING INFORMATION:
 - 1) 2,055.13' WEST TO THE 1/2" REBAR WITH HIS "LS 752" CAP HE SET FOR THE NORTHEAST CORNER OF THE TRACT SURVEYED AS WITNESSED BY THE 1/2" REBAR WITH HIS "LS 752" CAP SET AT 20.00' SOUTH
 - 2) 2,555.13' WEST TO THE THEORETICAL POSITION FOR THE NORTHWEST CORNER OF THE SW1/4 OF SECTION 30-19-11 – FALLS IN THE RIVER

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- 6) STEVEN S. BROSEMER, L.S. 752, DEPUTY COUNTY SURVEYOR, IN A SECTION CORNER REPORT DATED DECEMBER 19, 2006, FOR PROJECT NUMBER 06430-02, SURVEY F30002 IN THE SURVEY FILE FOR SECTIONS 17-36 IN TOWNSHIP 19-11 TO STAKE THE WEST LINE OF THE ROAD OPENING IN THE NORTHEAST QUARTER OF SECTION 30-19-11 FOR THE LYON COUNTY ROAD & BRIDGE DEPARTMENT, SAID **THAT HE FOUND THE 5/8" REBAR WITH A LYON COUNTY CAP OVER THE STONE** AT THE CENTER CORNER OF SECTION 30-19-11 FROM HIS EXISTING REFERENCE TIES ON FILE AT THE COUNTY ENGINEER'S OFFICE.
- 1) 49.6' NW TO A CONCRETE NAIL & WASHER IN AN 8" HEDGE TREE
 - 2) 31.3' NNW TO A CONCRETE NAIL & WASHER IN A 7" ELM TREE
 - 3) 31.3' NNW TO A CONCRETE NAIL & WASHER IN A 7" ELM TREE
 - 4) IN THE CENTERLINE TRAVELED WAY OF COUNTY ROAD 145 EAST-WEST
- HIS SURVEY DRAWING SHOWS THE FOLLOWING INFORMATION:
- 1) 2,656.30' EAST TO THE CHANNEL POST OVER THE GAS PIPE HE FOUND FROM A PRIOR SURVEY AT THE SOUTHEAST CORNER OF THE NE1/4 OF SEC. 30-19-11
