

**NORTH 1/16TH CORNER OF THE SOUTHWEST QUARTER OF SECTION 11, TOWNSHIP 20 SOUTH, RANGE 10 EAST**

- 1) ROBERT MILLIKEN, COUNTY SURVEYOR FROM 1870 TO 1875 AND FROM 1882 TO 1883, IN SURVEY NUMBER 74 OF THE 8<sup>TH</sup> TERM, A **PERMANENT SURVEY** RECORDED IN SURVEY BOOK "C" ON PAGE 131 DATED JULY 1, 1875 TO DIVIDE THE NORTHWEST 1/4 AND THE SOUTHWEST 1/4 OF SECTION 11-20-10 BY A LINE RUNNING NORTH & SOUTH, SAID THAT **HE SET A 30" X 8" X 8" STONE ON THE LEFT BANK OF PHENIS CREEK AND 33 FEET NORTH OF THE POINT OF TRUE POSITION** AS THE TRUE POSITION FOR THE PERMANENT NORTH 1/2/4 CORNER OF THE SOUTHWEST 1/4 OF SECTION 11-20-10 FALLS IN DEEP WATER. HE DETERMINED THE TRUE POSITION TO BE ON LINE AND HALFWAY BETWEEN THE STONE THAT HE FOUND AT THE WEST 1/4 CORNER OF SECTION 11-20-10 AND THE 20" X 10" X 4" STONE THAT HE SET FOR THE PERMANENT CENTER CORNER OF SECTION 11-20-10 ON THIS **PERMANENT SURVEY**. HIS SURVEY NOTES/DRAWING SHOWS THE FOLLOWING DISTANCES FROM THE **TRUE POSITION** FOR THE 1/2/4 CORNER:
- 1) 1,320-1/2' WEST TO THE STONE HE FOUND AT THE WEST 1/4 CORNER OF SECTION 11-20-10
  - 2) 1,320-1/2' EAST TO THE 20" X 10" X 4" STONE HE SET FOR THE PERMANENT CENTER CORNER OF SECTION 11-20-10
