

NORTH 1/16TH CORNER OF THE NORTHWEST QUARTER OF SECTION 14, TOWNSHIP 20 SOUTH, RANGE 10 EAST

- 1) ROBERT MILLIKEN, COUNTY SURVEYOR FROM 1870 TO 1875 AND FROM 1882 TO 1883, IN SURVEY NUMBER 74 OF THE 8TH TERM, A **PERMANENT SURVEY** RECORDED IN SURVEY BOOK "C" ON PAGE 131 DATED JULY 1, 1875 TO DIVIDE THE NORTHWEST 1/4 AND THE SOUTHWEST 1/4 OF SECTION 11-20-10 BY A LINE RUNNING NORTH & SOUTH, SAID THAT **HE SET AN 18" X 12" X 3" STONE** FOR THE PERMANENT SOUTH 1/2/4 CORNER OF THE SOUTHWEST 1/4 OF SECTION 11-20-10 ON LINE AND HALFWAY BETWEEN THE STONE THAT HE FOUND AND **HE RESET** FOR THE PERMANENT SOUTHWEST CORNER OF SECTION 11-20-10 AND THE STONE THAT HE FOUND AT THE SOUTH 1/4 CORNER OF SECTION 11-20-10 ON THIS **PERMANENT SURVEY**.

HIS SURVEY NOTES/DRAWING SHOWS THE FOLLOWING INFORMATION:

- 1) 1,317' WEST TO THE ORIGINAL STONE HE FOUND AND **HE RESET** FOR THE PERMANENT SOUTHWEST CORNER OF SECTION 11-20-10
 - 2) 1,317' EAST TO THE STONE HE FOUND AT THE SOUTH 1/4 CORNER OF SECTION 11-20-10
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- 2) STEVEN S. BROSEMER, L.S. 752, DEPUTY COUNTY SURVEYOR, IN A LAND SURVEY REFERENCE REPORT DATED JUNE 26, 1989, FOR JOB NUMBER 97-27, SAID THAT **HE FOUND A LIMESTONE** AT THE SOUTHWEST CORNER OF THE EAST 1/2 OF THE SOUTHWEST 1/4 OF SECTION 11-20-10. **HE PLACED A 1/2" X 24" REBAR WITH A CAP ON THE SOUTH SIDE OF THE STONE.**
 - 1) 32.5' NNE TO A NAIL & SHINER IN A POWER POLE
 - 2) 36.15' NW TO A NAIL & SHINER IN A FENCE POST
 - 3) 24.75' SW TO A NAIL & SHINER IN A FENCE POST
 - 4) 30.2' SE TO A NAIL & SHINER IN A FENCE POST
 - 5) IN LINE WITH A HEDGE ROW TO THE NORTH

NORTH SIXTEENTH CORNER OF NORTHWEST QUARTER 14-20-10
