

**NORTHWEST CORNER SECTION 28, TOWNSHIP 20 SOUTH, RANGE 10 EAST**

- 1) ON PAGE 236 OF THE GLO ORIGINAL FIELD NOTES IN THE DRAFTING ROOM IN THE COUNTY ENGINEER'S OFFICE IT STATES THAT **THEY SET A LIMESTONE 22" X 10" X 5"** FOR THE CORNER TO SECTIONS 20, 21, 28 & 29-20-10.

THE GOVERNMENT SURVEY NOTES SHOW THE FOLLOWING INFORMATION:

- 1) 40.10 CHAINS EAST TO THE 24" X 10" X 4" LIMESTONE THEY SET FOR THE 1/4 CORNER BETWEEN SECTIONS 21 & 28-20-10
- 2) 80.20 CHAINS EAST TO THE 32" X 12" X 4" LIMESTONE THEY SET FOR THE CORNER TO SECTIONS 21, 22, 27 & 28-20-10

- 2) R. H. EDMISTON, COUNTY SURVEYOR FROM 1884 TO 1887, IN SURVEY NUMBER 130, A ROAD SURVEY RECORDED IN ROAD RECORD BOOK E" ON PAGE 130 FOR ROAD IN TOWNSHIP 21-10 FOR J. H. RICE, PRINCIPAL PETITIONER, DATED NOVEMBER 27, 1885, **APPARENTLY FOUND THE STONE** AT THE NORTHWEST CORNER OF SECTION 28-20-10 ON THIS ROAD SURVEY FOR A 50 FOOT WIDE ROAD.

HIS SURVEY NOTES SHOWS THE FOLLOWING INFORMATION:

- 1) THIS ROAD EXTENDS EAST ON THE SECTION LINES FOR 3 MILES TO THE STONE HE FOUND AT THE NORTHEAST CORNER OF SECTION 26-16-10 TO BEGIN THIS ROAD SURVEY
- 2) THIS ROAD EXTENDS WEST ON THE SECTION LINES FOR 2 MILES TO THE STONE HE FOUND AT THE NORTHWEST CORNER OF SECTION 30-10-10 ON THE RANGE LINE AND THE LYON AND CHASE COUNTY LINE TO END THIS ROAD SURVEY

- 3) R. H. EDMISTON, COUNTY SURVEYOR FROM 1884 TO 1887, IN A ROAD SURVEY FOR ROAD NUMBER 315 RECORDED IN ROAD RECORD BOOK "C" ON PAGES 210 TO 212 PETITIONED BY J. H. RICE AND OTHERS FOR A ROAD IN TOWNSHIP 20-10 [PACKET 581 IN THE VAULT IN THE COUNTY SURVEYOR'S OFFICE] THAT HE SURVEYED ON NOVEMBER 27, 1885, WAS ESTABLISHED AS A 50 FOOT WIDE ROAD ON JANUARY 7, 1886 AS NOTED BY JOHN L. BUTLER, CHAIRMAN OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS, AND RECORDED ON FEBRUARY 6, 1886 BY ROLAND LAKIN, COUNTY CLERK, **APPARENTLY FOUND THE STONE** AT THE NORTHWEST CORNER OF SECTION 28-20-10 ON THIS ROAD SURVEY.

HIS SURVEY NOTES SHOWS THE FOLLOWING INFORMATION:

- 1) THIS ROAD EXTENDS WEST ON THE SECTION LINES FOR 2 MILES TO THE STONE HE FOUND AT THE NORTHWEST CORNER OF SECTION 30-20-10 ON THE RANGE LINE AND THE LYON AND CHASE COUNTY LINE TO END THIS ROAD SURVEY
- 2) THIS ROAD EXTENDS EAST ON THE SECTION LINES FOR 3 MILES TO THE STONE HE FOUND AT THE NORTHEAST CORNER OF SECTION 26-20-10 TO BEGIN THIS ROAD SURVEY

- 4) MATTHEW BROWN, COUNTY SURVEYOR FROM 1888 TO 1900, AND 1914, IN A ROAD SURVEY FOR ROAD NUMBER 402 RECORDED IN ROAD RECORD BOOK "C" ON PAGES 546 TO 548 PETITIONED BY E. J. RATCLIFF AND OTHERS FOR A ROAD IN TOWNSHIP 20-10 [PACKET 657 IN THE VAULT IN THE COUNTY SURVEYOR'S OFFICE] THAT HE SURVEYED ON NOVEMBER 17, 1893, WAS ORDERED ESTABLISHED AS A 40 FOOT ROAD ON JANUARY 4, 1894 AS NOTED BY W. N. D. BIRD, CHAIRMAN OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS AND ATTESTED BY C. W. WILHITE, COUNTY CLERK, AND RECORDED ON JUNE 24, 1894 BY MATTHEW BROWN, COUNTY SURVEYOR, **APPARENTLY FOUND OR SET THE NORTHEAST CORNER** OF SECTION 29-20-10 ON THIS ROAD SURVEY.

HIS SURVEY NOTES SHOWS THE FOLLOWING INFORMATION:

- 1) THIS ROAD EXTENDS NORTH ON THE SECTION LINES FOR 1 MILE TO THE STONE HE FOUND OR SET AT THE NORTHEAST CORNER OF SECTION 20-20-10 TO BEGIN THIS ROAD SURVEY, TAKING 20 FEET ON EACH SIDE OF THE SECTION LINE
- 2) THIS ROAD EXTENDS SOUTH ON THE SECTION LINES FOR 1 MILE TO THE STONE HE FOUND OR SET AT THE SOUTHEAST CORNER OF SECTION 29-20-13 AT THE TERMINUS OF THIS ROAD SURVEY, TAKING 20 FEET ON EACH SIDE OF THE SECTION LINE **EXCEPT** THAT THE HEDGE ROW NEAR THE EAST LINE OF THE SE1/4 OF SECTION 29-20-10 SHALL BE CONSIDERED THE WEST LINE OF THE ROAD IF IT IS LESS THAN 20 FEET FROM THE SECTION LINE
