

SOUTHWEST CORNER SECTION 32, TOWNSHIP 20 SOUTH, RANGE 10 EAST

- 1) ON PAGE 13 OF THE GLO ORIGINAL FIELD NOTES IN THE DRAFTING ROOM IN THE COUNTY ENGINEER'S OFFICE IT STATES THAT **THEY SET A LIMESTONE ROCK 20" X 11" X 2-1/2"** ON LEVEL GROUND FOR THE CORNER TO SECTIONS 31 & 32-20-10 ON THE 4TH STANDARD PARALLEL ON NOVEMBER 16, 1855.

THE GOVERNMENT SURVEY NOTES SHOW THE FOLLOWING INFORMATION:

- 1) 40.00 CHAINS EAST ON THE 4TH STANDARD PARALLEL TO THE 23" X 5" X 5" LIMESTONE THEY SET ON LEVEL GROUND FOR THE SOUTH 1/4 CORNER OF SECTION 32-20-10
 - 2) 80.00 CHAINS EAST ON THE 4TH STANDARD PARALLEL TO THE 24" X 9" X 5" LIMESTONE THEY SET ON A NORTHEAST SLOPE FOR THE CORNER TO SECTIONS 32 & 33-20-10
- 2) R. H. EDMISTON, COUNTY SURVEYOR FROM 1884 TO 1887, IN SURVEY NUMBER 87, A ROAD SURVEY RECORDED IN SURVEY BOOK "E" ON PAGE 87 FOR A COUNTY ROAD IN TOWNSHIPS 20-10 AND 20-11 FOR J. C. DARR, PRINCIPAL PETITIONER, DATED FEBRUARY 25, 1885, SAID THAT HE **FOUND THE STONE** AT THE SOUTHEAST CORNER OF SECTION 31-20-10 ON THE 4TH STANDARD PARALLEL AT THE TERMINUS OF THE ROAD ALLOWED ON THE ROAD SURVEY.
HIS SURVEY NOTES SHOWS THE FOLLOWING INFORMATION:
 - 1) THIS ROAD EXTENDS NORTH ON THE SECTION LINES FOR 3 MILES TO THE STONE HE FOUND AT THE NORTHEAST CORNER OF SECTION 19-20-10 TO BEGIN THE ROAD ALLOWED ON THIS ROAD SURVEY
 - 2) 2.15 CHAINS WEST ON THE 4TH STANDARD PARALLEL TO THE STONE HE FOUND AT THE NORTHEAST CORNER OF SECTION 6-21-10

- 4) ARTHUR MILLIKEN, DEPUTY COUNTY SURVEYOR, IN A ROAD SURVEY FOR ROAD NUMBER 290 RECORDED IN ROAD RECORD BOOK "C" ON PAGES 110 TO 112 PETITIONED BY JOHN C. DARR AND OTHERS FOR 2 ROADS IN TOWNSHIP 20-11 [PACKET 527 IN THE VAULT IN THE COUNTY SURVEYOR'S OFFICE] THAT HE SURVEYED ON FEBRUARY 26, 1885, WAS ESTABLISHED AS A 50 FOOT WIDE ROAD FROM THE NORTHEAST CORNER OF SECTION 16-20-10 TO THE SOUTHEAST CORNER OF SECTION 30-20-10 – THE REST OF THE ROAD ON THE PETITION WAS **REJECTED** BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS ON JANUARY 9, 1885 AS NOTED BY JOHN L. BUTLER, CHAIRMAN OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS, AND RECORDED ON MAY 16, 1885 BY ROLAND LAKIN, COUNTY CLERK, SAID THAT **HE FOUND THE STONE** AT THE SOUTHEAST CORNER OF SECTION 31-20-10 TO THE TERMINUS OF THE ROAD ALLOWED ON THIS ROAD SURVEY. SEE THE RECORD FOR WHAT PART OF THE ROAD PETITION THAT WAS **REJECTED**.

HIS SURVEY NOTES SHOWS THE FOLLOWING INFORMATION:

- 1) THIS ROAD EXTENDS NORTH ON THE SECTION LINES FOR 3 MILES TO THE STONE HE FOUND AT THE NORTHEAST CORNER OF SECTION 19-20-10 TO BEGIN THE ROAD ALLOWED ON THIS ROAD SURVEY
- 1) 2.15 CHAINS WEST ON THE 4TH STANDARD PARALLEL TO THE STONE HE FOUND AT THE NORTHEAST CORNER OF SECTION 6-21-10
