

WEST 1/4 CORNER SECTION 12, TOWNSHIP 20 SOUTH, RANGE 12 EAST

- 1) ON PAGE 548 OF THE GLO ORIGINAL FIELD NOTES IN THE DRAFTING ROOM IN THE COUNTY ENGINEER'S OFFICE IT STATES THAT **THEY SET A LIMESTONE 20" X 12" X 3"** FOR THE 1/4 CORNER BETWEEN SECTIONS 11 & 12-20-12.
- 2) SAMUEL P. DAVIES, DEPUTY COUNTY SURVEYOR, IN SURVEY NUMBER 62, A **PERMANENT SURVEY** RECORDED IN SURVEY BOOK "B" ON PAGE 60 DATED JULY 1, 1870 TO REESTABLISH THE EST 1/4 SECTION CORNER OF SECTION 12-20-12, THE CENTER CORNER, AND TO DIVIDE THE SOUTHEAST 1/4 BY A LINE RUNNING NORTH & SOUTH, SAID THAT **HE FOUND THE STONE** AT THE WEST 1/4 CORNER OF SECTION 12-20-12 ON THIS **PERMANENT SURVEY**.
HIS SURVEY NOTES SHOWS THE FOLLOWING INFORMATION:
 - 1) 79.72 CHAINS EAST TO THE LIMESTONE THAT HE SET FOR THE PERMANENT EAST 1/4 OF SECTION 12-20-12 ON THE RANGE LINE
- 3) ROBERT MILLIKEN, COUNTY SURVEYOR FROM 1870 TO 1875 AND FROM 1882 TO 1883, IN A PERMANENT SURVEY RECORDED IN SURVEY BOOK "B" ON PAGE 215 AND DATED OCTOBER 1872, SAID THAT **HE FOUND THE STONE** AT THE WEST 1/4 CORNER OF SECTION 12-20-12 ON THIS **PERMANENT SURVEY**.
- 4) STEVEN S. BROSEMER, L.S. 752, DEPUTY COUNTY SURVEYOR, IN A LAND SURVEY REPORT DATED OCTOBER 31, 1990, FOR JOB NUMBER 90328, SURVEY F11002 IN THE SURVEY FILE FOR TOWNSHIP 20-12 FOR A SURVEY TO ESTABLISH THE NORTH AND EAST LINES OF SECTION 11-20-12 AT THE REQUEST OF THE LYON COUNTY ENGINEER, SAID THAT HE EXCAVATED WITH A COUNTY BACKHOE FOR THE STONE AT THE EAST 1/4 CORNER OF SECTION 11-20-12, BUT THAT HE DID **NOT** FIND THE STONE. HE DEEMED THAT THE EAST 1/4 CORNER OF SECTION 11-20-12 WAS **LOST**. HE DID **NOT** RESET THE EAST 1/4 CORNER OF SECTION 11-20-12 ON THIS SURVEY.
