

**NORTH 1/4 CORNER SECTION 26, TOWNSHIP 20 SOUTH, RANGE 12 EAST**

- 1) ON PAGE 551 OF THE GLO ORIGINAL FIELD NOTES IN THE DRAFTING ROOM IN THE COUNTY ENGINEER'S OFFICE IT STATES THAT **THEY SET A SANDSTONE 40" X 15" X 1-1/2"** FOR THE 1/4 CORNER BETWEEN SECTIONS 23 & 26-20-12.  
THE GOVERNMENT SURVEY NOTES SHOWS THE FOLLOWING INFORMATION:
  - 1) 39.95 CHAINS WEST TO THE 24" X 14" X 2" SANDSTONE THEY SET FOR THE CORNER TO SECTIONS 22, 23, 26 & 27-20-12
  - 2) 39.95 CHAINS EAST TO THE 20" X 12" X 6" LIMESTONE THEY SET FOR THE CORNER TO SECTIONS 23, 24, 25 & 26-20-12
  
- 2) J. H. HIBBEN, COUNTY SURVEYOR FROM 1875 TO 1882, BY FRANK P. MACLEMAN, DEPUTY COUNTY SURVEYOR, IN A **PERMANENT SURVEY** RECORDED IN SURVEY BOOK "C" ON PAGE 205 DATED MAY 1, 1878 ORDERED BY THOMAS E. WELCH TO SURVEY THE NORTHWEST 1/4 OF THE NORTHEAST 1/4 OF SECTION 26-20-12, SAID THAT **HE FOUND THE STONE** AT THE NORTH 1/4 CORNER OF SECTION 26-20-12 ON THIS **PERMANENT SURVEY**.  
HIS SURVEY NOTES/ DRAWING SHOW THE FOLLOWING INFORMATION:
  - 1) 79 RODS, 23-1/2 LINKS SOUTH TO THE STONE HE SET FOR THE PERMANENT WEST 1/2/4 CORNER OF THE NE1/4 OF SECTION 26-20-12
  - 2) 159 RODS, 22 LINKS SOUTH TO THE STONE HE SET FOR THE PERMANENT CENTER CORNER OF SECTION 26-20-12
  - 3) 79 RODS, 16-1/2 LINKS EAST TO THE STONE HE SET FOR THE PERMANENT NORTH 1/2/4 CORNER OF THE NE1/4 OF SECTION 26-20-12
  - 4) 159 RODS, 8 LINKS EAST TO THE STONE HE FOUND AT THE NORTHEAST CORNER OF SECTION 26-20-12
  
- 3) J. H. HIBBEN, COUNTY SURVEYOR FROM 1875 TO 1882, IN A ROAD SURVEY RECORDED IN SURVEY BOOK "C" ON PAGE 198 DATED SEPTEMBER 22, 1880, FOR A ROAD SURVEY IN TOWNSHIPS 20-12 & 20-13 APPARENTLY **FOUND THE STONE** AT THE NORTHEAST CORNER OF THE NORTHWEST 1/4 OF SECTION 26-20-12 TO COMMENCE THE SECOND ROAD ON THIS ROAD SURVEY.  
HIS SURVEY NOTES SHOWS THE FOLLOWING INFORMATION:
  - 1) THE SECOND ROAD EXTENDS SOUTH ON THE 1/2 SECTION LINE TO THE STONE HE FOUND AT THE SOUTHEAST CORNER OF THE NORTHWEST 1/4 OF SECTION 26-20-13 AT THE TERMINUS OF THE SECOND ROAD ON THIS ROAD SURVEY
  
- 4) J. H. HIBBEN, COUNTY SURVEYOR FROM 1875 TO 1882, IN A ROAD SURVEY FOR ROAD NUMBER 97 RECORDED IN ROAD RECORD BOOK "A-1" ON PAGES 390 TO 392 PETITIONED BY WILLIAM SHOCKLEY AND OTHERS FOR THE LOCATION OF TWO COUNTY ROADS IN TOWNSHIPS 20-12 AND 20-13, AND THE **VACATION** OF A COUNTY OR OLD STATE ROAD IN TOWNSHIP 20-12, THAT HE SURVEYED ON SEPTEMBER 22, 1880, WERE ESTABLISHED AS 50 FEET WIDE ROADS ON JANUARY 6, 1881 AS NOTED BY I. A. TAYLOR, CHAIRMAN OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS, AND RECORDED ON JANUARY 6, 1881 BY WILLIAM F. EWING, COUNTY CLERK, SAID THAT **HE FOUND THE STONE** AT THE NORTHEAST CORNER OF THE NORTHWEST 1/4 OF SECTION 26-20-12 TO COMMENCE THE SECOND ROAD AND ON THE FIRST ROAD ON THIS ROAD SURVEY. THE ROAD **VACATED** WAS THAT PORTION OF A COUNTY ROAD OR OLD STATE ROAD AS NOW LOCATED THROUGH SECTIONS 14-20-12 & 23-20-12 TO THE CENTER OF SECTION 26-20-12.  
HIS SURVEY NOTES SHOWS THE FOLLOWING INFORMATION:
  - 1) THE FIRST ROAD EXTENDS WEST ON THE SECTION LINES TO THE NORTHWEST CORNER OF THE NE1/4 OF SECTION 28-20-12 TO COMMENCE THE FIRST ROAD ON THIS ROAD SURVEY

- 2) THE FIRST ROAD EXTENDS EAST ON THE SECTION LINES TO THE NORTHEAST CORNER OF SECTION 27-20-13 ON THE LYON/COFFEY COUNTY LINE AT THE TERMINUS OF THE FIRST ROAD ON THIS ROAD SURVEY
  - 3) THE SECOND ROAD EXTENDS SOUTH ON THE 1/2 SECTION LINE FOR 2,640' TO THE SOUTHEAST CORNER OF THE NW1/4 OF SECTION 26-20-12 AT THE TERMINUS OF THE SECOND ROAD ON THIS ROAD SURVEY
- 5) ROBERT MILLIKEN, COUNTY SURVEYOR FROM 1870 TO 1875 AND FROM 1882 TO 1883, IN A ROAD SURVEY RECORDED IN SURVEY BOOK "F" ON PAGE 43 DATED FEBRUARY 13, 1883 FOR A ROAD IN TOWNSHIP 20, RANGES 12 & 13 FOR R. W. BAYSINGER, PRINCIPAL PETITIONER, SAID THAT **HE FOUND THE STONE** AT THE SOUTHEAST CORNER OF THE SOUTHWEST 1/4 OF SECTION 23-20-12 TO BEGIN THIS ROAD SURVEY FOR A 40 FOOT WIDE ROAD THAT EXTENDS NORTH ON THE MIDDLE LINE OF SECTION 23-20-12 FOR ONE MILE.
  - 6) ROBERT MILLIKEN, COUNTY SURVEYOR FROM 1870 TO 1875 AND FROM 1882 TO 1883, IN A ROAD SURVEY FOR ROAD NUMBER 210 RECORDED IN ROAD RECORD BOOK "B" ON PAGES 426 TO 428 PETITION BY R. W. BAYSINGER AND OTHERS FOR A COUNTY ROAD IN TOWNSHIPS 20-12 AND 2-13 [PACKET 473 IN THE VAULT IN THE COUNTY SURVEYOR'S OFFICE] THAT HE SURVEYED ON FEBRUARY 13, 1883, WAS ESTABLISHED AS A 40 FOOT AND 50 FOOT WIDE ROAD AS DESCRIBED IN THE FIELD NOTES OF THE COUNTY SURVEYOR, ON APRIL 13, 1883 AS NOTED BY J. E. JONES, CHAIRMAN OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS, AND WAS RECORDED ON MAY 7, 1883 BY WILLIAM F. EWING, COUNTY CLERK, SAID THAT **HE FOUND THE STONE** AT THE SOUTHEAST CORNER OF THE SOUTHWEST 1/4 OF SECTION 33-20-12 TO COMMENCE THE SECOND ROAD ON THIS ROAD SURVEY. HIS SURVEY NOTES SHOWS THE FOLLOWING INFORMATION:
    - 1) THIS 40 FOOT WIDE FIRST ROAD EXTENDS NORTH ON THE CENTER LINE OF THE SECTION FOR 1 MILE TO THE STONE HE FOUND AT THE NORTHEAST CORNER OF THE *NE*1/4 OF SECTION 23-20-12 AT THE TERMINUS OF THE SECOND ROAD ON THIS ROAD SURVEY. [**NOTE:** THE TERMINUS OF THIS ROAD SURVEY SHOULD BE THE NORTHEAST CORNER OF THE *NW*1/4 OF SECTION 23-20-12 – WARREN CHIP WOODS, L.S. 603, COUNTY SURVEYOR]
  - 7) R. H. EDMISTON, COUNTY SURVEYOR FROM 1884 TO 1887, BY MATTHEW BROWN, DEPUTY COUNTY SURVEYOR, IN SURVEY NUMBER 70, A **PERMANENT SURVEY** RECORDED IN SURVEY BOOK "E" ON PAGE 70 DATED OCTOBER 13-14, 1884 ORDERED BY V. G. BAYSINGER, R. W. BAYSINGER, D. N. TWEEDY, J. J. TWEEDY, AND R. A. MARSHALL TO LOCATE THE NORTHEAST CORNER AND SUBDIVIDE SECTION 23-20-12, SAID THAT **HE FOUND THE STONE** AT THE SOUTH 1/4 CORNER OF SECTION 23-20-12 ON THIS **PERMANENT SURVEY**.
  - 8) J. HARRISON PARKMAN, COUNTY SURVEYOR FROM 1907 TO 1915, BY J. MAX YINGLING, DEPUTY COUNTY SURVEYOR, IN A **PERMANENT SURVEY** RECORDED IN PERMANENT SURVEY BOOK 1 ON PAGE 54 AND DATED FEBRUARY 1910, SHOWS ON HIS SURVEY DRAWING THAT **HE FOUND THE STONE** AT THE NORTH 1/4 CORNER OF SECTION 26-20-12 ON THIS **PERMANENT SURVEY** FOR A ROAD RECORDED IN ROAD RECORD BOOK "E" ON PAGE 8.
  - 9) J. HARRISON PARKMAN, COUNTY SURVEYOR FROM 1907 TO 1915, BY J. MAX YINGLING, DEPUTY COUNTY SURVEYOR, IN A ROAD SURVEY FOR ROAD NUMBER 651 RECORDED IN ROAD RECORD BOOK "E" ON PAGE 8 PETITIONED BY J. S. ZINK AND OTHERS FOR THE VACATION OF A ROAD IN TOWNSHIP 20-12 THAT WAS VIEWED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS ON JANUARY 11, 1910, WAS GRANTED ON FEBRUARY 11, 1910 AS NOTED BY E. MOORHEAD, CHAIRMAN, AND RECORDED ON FEBRUARY 24, 1910 BY J. MAX YINGLING, DEPUTY COUNTY

SURVEYOR, SAID THAT **HE FOUND THE STONE** AT THE SOUTH 1/4 CORNER OF SECTION 23-20-12 TO END THIS ROAD **VACATION** SURVEY.

**HIS SURVEY NOTES/DRAWING SHOWS THE FOLLOWING INFORMATION:**

1) THIS **VACATED** ROAD EXTENDS NORTH ONE MILE TO THE STONE HE FOUND AT THE NORTH 1/4 CORNER OF SECTION 23-20-12 TO END THIS ROAD **VACATION** SURVEY

10) **COMMISSIONER'S ROAD JOURNAL BOOK "C", PAGE 41**

A PETITION SIGNED BY ROBERT D. BUCK FOR THE **VACATION** OF A ROAD IN TOWNSHIP 20-12 WAS PRESENTED TO TAMMY VOPAT, COUNTY CLERK. THE ROAD WAS VIEWED BY THE COUNTY COMMISSIONERS ON AUGUST 8, 2012, AND THE FINAL ORDER DATED AUGUST 9, 2012 ORDERED THAT THE FOLLOWING ROAD BE **VACATED**:

1) BEGINNING IN THE CENTERLINE OF COUNTY ROAD "T5" AT A POINT 2,490 FEET NORTH OF THE CENTER CORNER OF SECTION 35-20-12; THENCE ALONG THE CENTERLINE OF SAID COUNTY ROAD "T5" TO A POINT 4,660 FEET SOUTH OF THE NORTH 1/4 CORNER OF SECTION 26-20-12 AND THERE ENDING.
