

WEST 1/16TH CORNER OF THE SOUTHWEST QUARTER OF SECTION 28, TOWNSHIP 20 SOUTH, RANGE 12 EAST

1) S. K. McCRARY, DEPUTY COUNTY SURVEYOR, IN SURVEY NUMBER 126, A **PERMANENT SURVEY** RECORDED IN SURVEY BOOK "F" ON PAGE 207 DATED MAY 9, 1905 AT THE REQUEST OF W. C. LONG AND E. B. VAN NESS FOR THE PURPOSE OF LOCATING AND PERMANENTLY ESTABLISHING THE CORNERS AND BOUNDARIES OF THE SOUTHEAST 1/4 OF SECTION 28-20-12 AND RUN SUCH LINES AS MAY BE NECESSARY TO PROPERLY COMPLETE THE WORK, SAID THAT **HE FOUND A STONE SET BY ROBERT MILLIKEN** AT 59.63 CHAINS SOUTH AND 0.07 CHAINS WEST OF THE NORTHWEST CORNER OF SECTION 28-20-12, BUT HE DID **NOT** ACCEPT THE STONE ON THIS **PERMANENT SURVEY**. **HE SET A NEW STONE** FOR THE PERMANENT WEST 1/8TH CORNER OF THE SW1/4 OF SECTION 28-20-12 AT 57.74 CHAINS SOUTH OF THE NORTHWEST CORNER OF SECTION 28-20-12 ON THIS **PERMANENT SURVEY**. HIS FIELD NOTES ARE IN BOOK 2 ON PAGE 148 IN THE "KRETSINGER COLLECTION" OF FIELD BOOKS, AND THERE IS ADDITIONAL INFORMATION IN PACKET "M 157" IN MISCELLANEOUS DRAWER NUMBER 8 IN THE VAULT IN THE COUNTY ENGINEER'S OFFICE.

HIS SURVEY NOTES/ DRAWING SHOW THE FOLLOWING INFORMATION:

- 1) 0.11 CHAINS NORTH TO THE MILLIKEN STONE HE FOUND BUT HE DID **NOT** ACCEPTED
- 2) 19.91 CHAINS NORTH TO THE STONE MARKED "H 1/4" HE SET FOR THE PERMANENT WEST 1/4 CORNER OF SECTION 28-20-12 AT 4 FEET SOUTH OF AN EAST & WEST HEDGE
- 3) 39.82-1/2 CHAINS NORTH TO THE STONE SET FOR THE PERMANENT WEST 1/8TH CORNER OF THE NW1/4 OF SECTION 28-20-12 [40.02 CHAINS NORTH TO THE STONE HE FOUND BUT HE DID **NOT** ACCEPT]
- 4) 59.74 CHAINS NORTH TO THE STONE HE FOUND IN PLACE AT THE NORTHWEST CORNER OF SECTION 28-20-12
- 5) 19.92 CHAINS SOUTH TO THE STONE MARKED "I" ON THE SOUTH SIDE AND "III" ON THE EAST SIDE WITH "H" ON THE WEST SIDE HE SET FOR THE PERMANENT SOUTHWEST CORNER OF SECTION 28-20-12
- 6) 59.76 CHAINS SOUTH TO THE STONE HE FOUND IN PLACE AT THE WEST 1/4 CORNER OF SECTION 33-20-12
- 7) 99.54 CHAINS SOUTH TO THE STONE FOUND IN PLACE AT THE SOUTHWEST CORNER OF SECTION 33-20-12 ON THE 4TH STANDARD PARALLEL, ABOUT 5 FEET WEST OF A NORTH & SOUTH HEDGE

2) J. HARRISON PARKMAN, COUNTY SURVEYOR FROM 1907 TO 1915, IN A ROAD SURVEY FOR ROAD NUMBER 638 RECORDED IN ROAD RECORD BOOK "D" ON PAGES 421 THROUGH 424 PETITIONED BY W. L. McCLELLAND AND OTHERS FOR A ROAD IN TOWNSHIP 19-12 [PACKET 905 IN THE VAULT IN THE COUNTY SURVEYOR'S OFFICE] THAT HE SURVEYED ON MARCH 26, 1908 AND WAS GRANTED AS A 40 FOOT WIDE ROAD, 20 FEET EACH SIDE OF THE SURVEYED LINE, ON APRIL 10, 1908 AS NOTED BY J. A. CLEMMER, CHAIRMAN OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS, SAID THAT **HE FOUND THE STONE** AT THE NORTHEAST CORNER OF THE SOUTHEAST 1/4 OF THE SOUTHEAST 1/4 OF SECTION 29-20-12 TO BEGIN THIS ROAD SURVEY.

HIS SURVEY NOTES SHOWS THE FOLLOWING INFORMATION:

- 1) THIS ROAD EXTENDS WEST ON THE 1/8TH SECTION LINE FOR 1/2 MILE TO THE STONE HE FOUND AT THE NORTHWEST CORNER OF THE SW1/4 OF THE SE1/4 OF SECTION 29-20-12 TO END THIS ROAD SURVEY
