

**WEST 1/4 CORNER SECTION 34, TOWNSHIP 20 SOUTH, RANGE 12 EAST**

- 1) ON PAGE 553 OF THE GLO ORIGINAL FIELD NOTES IN THE DRAFTING ROOM IN THE COUNTY ENGINEER'S OFFICE IT STATES THAT **THEY SET A SANDSTONE 26" X 15" X 1-1/2"** FOR THE 1/4 CORNER BETWEEN SECTIONS 33 & 34-20-12.
  
- 2) ROBERT MILLIKEN, COUNTY SURVEYOR FROM 1870 TO 1875 AND FROM 1882 TO 1883, IN A ROAD SURVEY RECORDED IN ROAD RECORD BOOK "A" ON PAGES 196 TO 198 [PACKET 61 IN THE VAULT IN THE COUNTY SURVEYOR'S OFFICE] PETITIONED BY L. O. PRIEST AND OTHERS FOR A COUNTY ROAD IN TOWNSHIPS 20-11, 20-12 AND 21-11 THAT HE SURVEYED FEBRUARY 1-3, 1872, AND WAS ESTABLISHED AND ORDERED RECORDED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS AS A 50 FOOT WIDE ROAD ON APRIL 1, 1872 AS ATTESTED BY DAVID S. GILMORE, COUNTY CLERK, SAID THAT **HE FOUND** THE WEST 1/4 CORNER OF SECTION 34-20-12 ON THIS ROAD SURVEY.  
HIS SURVEY NOTES SHOWS THE FOLLOWING INFORMATION:
  - 1) THIS ROAD EXTENDS WEST ON THE 1/2 SECTION LINE WITH AN ANGLE IN THE SOUTHEAST 1/4 OF SECTION 31-20-12 AT THE EAST BANK OF EAGLE CREEK AND INTERSECTS THE 1/2 SECTION LINE AT THE WEST BANK OF EAGLE CREEK AND EXTENDS WEST ON THE 1/2 SECTION LINE TO THE WEST 1/4 CORNER OF SECTION 36-20-11 AT A TURN TO THE SOUTH
  - 2) THIS ROAD EXTENDS EAST ON THE 1/2 SECTION LINE TO THE CENTER CORNER OF SECTION 35-20-12 TO BEGIN THIS ROAD SURVEY
