

SOUTH 1/4 CORNER SECTION 31, TOWNSHIP 20 SOUTH, RANGE 13 EAST

- 1) ON PAGE 22 OF THE GLO ORIGINAL FIELD NOTES IN THE DRAFTING ROOM IN THE COUNTY ENGINEER'S OFFICE IT STATES THAT **THEY SET A LIMESTONE ROCK 23" X 12" X 2"** ON LEVEL GROUND FOR THE SOUTH 1/4 CORNER OF SECTION 31-20-13 ON THE 4TH STANDARD PARALLEL ON NOVEMBER 19, 1855, FROM WHICH:
 - 1) A BURR OAK TREE 22" IN DIAMETER BEARS N. 58-1/2° E. AT 69 LINKS DISTANCE
 - 2) A HICKORY TREE 16" IN DIAMETER BEARS S. 28-1/2° W. AT 75 LINKS DISTANCE

THE GOVERNMENT SURVEY NOTES SHOW THE FOLLOWING INFORMATION:

 - 1) 40.00 CHAINS WEST ON THE 4TH STANDARD PARALLEL TO THE 35" X 8" X 3" LIMESTONE THEY SET ON LEVEL GROUND FOR THE CORNER TO TOWNSHIP 20 SOUTH, RANGES 12 & 13 EAST
 - 2) 40.00 CHAINS EAST ON THE 4TH STANDARD PARALLEL TO THE 31" X 6" X 6" LIMESTONE THEY SET IN THE BOTTOM FOR THE CORNER TO SEC. 31 & 32-20-13

- 2) ROBERT MILLIKEN, COUNTY SURVEYOR FROM 1870 TO 1875 AND FROM 1882 TO 1883, IN SURVEY NUMBER 18, A **PERMANENT SURVEY** RECORDED IN SURVEY BOOK "B" ON PAGE 18 DATED MARCH 1-5, 1870 FOR A SURVEY IN SECTION 31-20-13, SAID THAT **HE FOUND THE STONE** AT THE SOUTH 1/4 CORNER OF SECTION 31-20-13 ON THE 4TH STANDARD PARALLEL ON THIS **PERMANENT SURVEY**.
