

NORTHWEST CORNER SECTION 07, TOWNSHIP 21 SOUTH, RANGE 10 EAST

- 1) ON PAGE 113 OF THE GLO ORIGINAL FIELD NOTES IN THE DRAFTING ROOM IN THE COUNTY ENGINEER'S OFFICE IT STATES THAT **THEY SET A LIMESTONE 30" X 10" X 3"** FOR THE CORNER TO SECTIONS 6 & 7-21-10 ON THE WEST TOWNSHIP BOUNDARY AND THE COUNTY LINE ON MARCH 17, 1857.

THE GOVERNMENT SURVEY NOTES SHOW THE FOLLOWING INFORMATION:

- 1) 40.00 CHAINS NORTH ON THE WEST TOWNSHIP BOUNDARY AND THE COUNTY LINE TO THE 24" X 14" X 2-1/2" LIMESTONE THEY SET FOR THE WEST 1/4 CORNER OF SECTION 6-21-10
- 2) 82.97 CHAINS NORTH ON THE WEST TOWNSHIP BOUNDARY AND THE COUNTY LINE TO THE 30" X 10" X 3" LIMESTONE THEY SET FOR THE CORNER TO TOWNSHIP 21 SOUTH OF RANGES 9 & 10 EAST AT THE NORTHWEST CORNER OF SECTIONS 6-21-10
- 3) 40.00 CHAINS SOUTH ON THE WEST TOWNSHIP BOUNDARY AND THE COUNTY LINE TO THE 24" X 10" X 3" LIMESTONE THEY SET FOR THE WEST 1/4 CORNER OF SECTION 7-21-10
- 4) 80.00 CHAINS SOUTH ON THE WEST TOWNSHIP BOUNDARY AND THE COUNTY LINE TO THE 24" X 10" X 3" LIMESTONE THEY SET FOR THE CORNER TO SECTIONS 7 & 18-21-10
- 5) 34.73 CHAINS EAST TO THE 20" X 11" X 3-1/2" LIMESTONE THEY SET FOR THE 1/4 CORNER BETWEEN SECTIONS 6 & 7-21-10
- 6) 74.73 CHAINS EAST TO THE 17" X 11" X 4" LIMESTONE THEY SET FOR THE CORNER TO SECTIONS 5, 6, 7 & 8-21-10

- 2) R. H. EDMISTON, COUNTY SURVEYOR FROM 1884 TO 1887, IN SURVEY NUMBER 49, A ROAD SURVEY RECORDED IN SURVEY BOOK "E" ON PAGE 49 DATED AUGUST 11, 1884 FOR FUNK, THE PRINCIPAL PETITIONER, FOR A ROAD IN TOWNSHIP 21, RANGE 10, SAID THAT **HE FOUND THE STONE** AT THE NORTHWEST CORNER OF SECTION 7-21-10 ON THE RANGE LINE AND THE LYON AND CHASE COUNTY LINE AT THE TERMINUS OF THIS ROAD SURVEY.

HIS SURVEY NOTES SHOWS THE FOLLOWING INFORMATION:

- 1) THIS ROAD EXTENDS EAST ON THE SECTION LINES FOR 3 MILES TO THE STONE THAT HE FOUND AT THE NORTHWEST CORNER OF SECTION 10-21-10 TO BEGIN THIS ROAD SURVEY
- 3) R. H. EDMISTON, COUNTY SURVEYOR FROM 1884 TO 1887, IN A ROAD SURVEY FOR ROAD NUMBER 273 RECORDED IN ROAD RECORD BOOK "C" ON PAGES 42 TO 44 PETITIONED BY R. FUNK AND OTHERS FOR A COUNTY ROAD IN TOWNSHIP 21-10 [PACKET 518 IN THE VAULT IN THE COUNTY SURVEYOR'S OFFICE] THAT HE SURVEYED ON AUGUST 11, 1884, WAS ESTABLISHED AS A 50 FOOT WIDE ROAD ON OCTOBER 9, 1884, AS NOTED BY P. Y. HALLBERG, CHAIRMAN OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS, AND RECORDED ON NOVEMBER 26, 1884 BY ROLAND LAKIN, COUNTY CLERK, SAID THAT **HE FOUND THE STONE** AT THE NORTHWEST CORNER OF SECTION 7-20-10 ON THE RANGE LINE AND THE LYON AND CHASE COUNTY LINE AT THE TERMINUS OF THIS ROAD SURVEY.

HIS SURVEY NOTES SHOWS THE FOLLOWING INFORMATION:

- 1) THIS ROAD EXTENDS EAST ON THE SECTION LINES FOR 3 MILES TO THE STONE HE FOUND AT THE NORTHWEST CORNER OF SECTION 10-21-10 TO BEGIN THIS ROAD SURVEY
- 4) ALVA J. SMITH, COUNTY SURVEYOR FROM 1900 THROUGH 1906, IN SURVEY NUMBER 55, A JOINT **PERMANENT SURVEY** WITH THE CHASE COUNTY SURVEYOR RECORDED IN SURVEY BOOK "E" ON PAGE 236 DATED SEPTEMBER 2 & 3, 1902 ORDERED BY D. S. RICHARDS FOR THE PURPOSE OF LOCATING AND PERMANENTLY ESTABLISHING THE NORTHEAST CORNER AND THE WEST 1/4

CORNER OF SECTION 7-21-10 AND RUN SUCH LINES AS MAY BE NECESSARY TO PROPERLY COMPLETE THE WORK, SAID THAT **HE FOUND THE GOVERNMENT STONE IN PLACE WITH THE TOP OF THE STONE WITH THE MARKS ON IT BROKEN OFF AND LAYING NEARBY** AT THE NORTHWEST CORNER OF SECTION 7-20-10 ON THE RANGE LINE AND THE LYON AND CHASE COUNTY LINE ON THIS **PERMANENT SURVEY**. HE PLACED THE BROKEN PIECE ON THE WEST SIDE OF THE STONE. HE NOTED THAT ALL OF THE STONES THAT HE FOUND ON THIS SURVEY HAD THE GOVERNMENT MARKS ON THEM. HIS FIELD NOTES ARE IN HIS BOOK NUMBER 3 ON PAGE 94, AND ADDITIONAL INFORMATION IS IN PACKET "M 67" IN MISCELLANEOUS DRAWER NUMBER 3 IN THE VAULT IN THE COUNTY ENGINEER'S OFFICE.

- 1) 40.15 CHAINS SOUTH ON THE RANGE LINE AND THE COUNTY LINE TO THE GOVERNMENT STONE HE FOUND AT THE WEST 1/4 CORNER OF SECTION 7-21-10
