

**WEST 1/4 CORNER SECTION 07, TOWNSHIP 21 SOUTH, RANGE 10 EAST**

- 1) ON PAGE 113 OF THE GLO ORIGINAL FIELD NOTES IN THE DRAFTING ROOM IN THE COUNTY ENGINEER'S OFFICE IT STATES THAT **THEY SET A LIMESTONE 24" X 10" X 3"** FOR THE WEST 1/4 CORNER OF SECTION 7-21-10 ON THE WEST TOWNSHIP BOUNDARY AND COUNTY LINE ON MARCH 17, 1857.

THE GOVERNMENT SURVEY NOTES SHOW THE FOLLOWING INFORMATION:

- 1) 40.00 CHAINS NORTH ON THE WEST TOWNSHIP BOUNDARY AND THE COUNTY LINE TO THE 30" X 10" X 3" LIMESTONE THEY SET FOR THE CORNER TO SECTIONS 6 & 7-21-10
  - 2) 40.00 CHAINS SOUTH ON THE WEST TOWNSHIP BOUNDARY AND THE COUNTY LINE TO THE 24" X 10" X 3" LIMESTONE THEY SET FOR THE CORNER TO SECTIONS 7 & 18-21-10
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- 2) ALVA J. SMITH, COUNTY SURVEYOR FROM 1900 THROUGH 1906, IN SURVEY NUMBER 55, A JOINT **PERMANENT SURVEY** WITH THE CHASE COUNTY SURVEYOR RECORDED IN SURVEY BOOK "E" ON PAGE 236 DATED SEPTEMBER 2 & 3, 1902 ORDERED BY D. S. RICHARDS FOR THE PURPOSE OF LOCATING AND PERMANENTLY ESTABLISHING THE NORTHEAST CORNER AND THE WEST 1/4 CORNER OF SECTION 7-21-10 AND RUN SUCH LINES AS MAY BE NECESSARY TO PROPERLY COMPLETE THE WORK, SAID THAT **HE FOUND THE GOVERNMENT STONE** AT THE WEST 1/4 CORNER OF SECTION 7-20-10 ON THE RANGE LINE AND THE LYON AND CHASE COUNTY LINE ON THIS **PERMANENT SURVEY**. HE NOTED THAT ALL OF THE STONES THAT HE FOUND ON THIS SURVEY HAD THE GOVERNMENT MARKS ON THEM. HIS FIELD NOTES ARE IN HIS BOOK NUMBER 3 ON PAGE 94, AND ADDITIONAL INFORMATION IS IN PACKET "M 67" IN MISCELLANEOUS DRAWER NUMBER 3 IN THE VAULT IN THE COUNTY ENGINEER'S OFFICE.  
HIS SURVEY NOTES/DRAWING SHOWS THE FOLLOWING INFORMATION:
    - 1) 40.16 CHAINS NORTH ON THE RANGE LINE AND COUNTY LINE TO THE BROKEN GOVERNMENT STONE HE FOUND AT THE NORTHWEST CORNER OF SEC. 7-21-10
