

NORTHWEST CORNER SECTION 09, TOWNSHIP 21 SOUTH, RANGE 10 EAST

- 1) ON PAGE 264 OF THE GLO ORIGINAL FIELD NOTES IN THE DRAFTING ROOM IN THE COUNTY ENGINEER'S OFFICE IT STATES THAT **THEY SET A LIMESTONE 23" X 11" X 3"** FOR THE CORNER TO SECTIONS 4, 5, 8 & 9-21-10.

THE GOVERNMENT SURVEY NOTES SHOW THE FOLLOWING INFORMATION:

- 1) 40.00 CHAINS NORTH TO THE 22" X 14" X 3" LIMESTONE THEY SET FOR THE 1/4 CORNER BETWEEN SECTIONS 4 & 5-21-10
- 2) 82.88 CHAINS NORTH TO THE 22" X 15" X 3" LIMESTONE THEY SET FOR THE CORNER TO SECTIONS 4 & 5-21-10 ON THE 4TH STANDARD PARALLEL
- 3) 40.04-1/2" CHAINS EAST TO THE 16" X 15" X 3" LIMESTONE THEY SET FOR THE 1/4 CORNER BETWEEN SECTION 4 & 9-21-10
- 4) 80.09 CHAINS EAST TO THE 22" X 17" X 3" LIMESTONE THEY SET FOR THE CORNER TO SECTIONS 3, 4, 9 & 10-21-10

- 2) R. H. EDMISTON, COUNTY SURVEYOR FROM 1884 TO 1887, IN SURVEY NUMBER 49, A ROAD SURVEY RECORDED IN SURVEY BOOK "E" ON PAGE 49 DATED AUGUST 11, 1884 FOR FUNK, THE PRINCIPAL PETITIONER, FOR A ROAD IN TOWNSHIP 21, RANGE 10, **APPARENTLY FOUND THE STONE** AT THE NORTHWEST CORNER OF SECTION 9-21-10 ON THIS ROAD SURVEY.

HIS SURVEY NOTES SHOWS THE FOLLOWING INFORMATION:

- 1) THIS ROAD EXTENDS WEST ON THE SECTION LINES FOR 2 MILES TO THE STONE THAT HE FOUND AT THE NORTHWEST CORNER OF SECTION 7-21-10 ON THE RANGE LINE AND THE LYON AND CHASE COUNTY LINE AT THE TERMINUS OF THIS ROAD SURVEY
- 2) THIS ROAD EXTENDS EAST ON THE SECTION LINES FOR 1 MILE TO THE STONE THAT HE FOUND AT THE NORTHWEST CORNER OF SECTION 10-21-10 TO BEGIN THIS ROAD SURVEY

- 3) R. H. EDMISTON, COUNTY SURVEYOR FROM 1884 TO 1887, IN A ROAD SURVEY FOR ROAD NUMBER 273 RECORDED IN ROAD RECORD BOOK "C" ON PAGES 42 TO 44 PETITIONED BY R. FUNK AND OTHERS FOR A COUNTY ROAD IN TOWNSHIP 21-10 [PACKET 518 IN THE VAULT IN THE COUNTY SURVEYOR'S OFFICE] THAT HE SURVEYED ON AUGUST 11, 1884, WAS ESTABLISHED AS A **50 FOOT WIDE ROAD** ON OCTOBER 9, 1884, AS NOTED BY P. Y. HALLBERG, CHAIRMAN OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS, AND RECORDED ON NOVEMBER 26, 1884 BY ROLAND LAKIN, COUNTY CLERK, **APPARENTLY FOUND THE STONE** AT THE NORTHWEST CORNER OF SECTION 9-20-10 ON THIS ROAD SURVEY.

HIS SURVEY NOTES SHOWS THE FOLLOWING INFORMATION:

- 1) THIS ROAD EXTENDS WEST ON THE SECTION LINES FOR 2 MILES TO THE STONE THAT HE FOUND AT THE NORTHWEST CORNER OF SECTION 7-21-10 ON THE RANGE LINE AND THE LYON AND CHASE COUNTY LINE AT THE TERMINUS OF THIS ROAD SURVEY
- 2) THIS ROAD EXTENDS EAST ON THE SECTION LINES FOR 1 MILE TO THE STONE THAT HE FOUND AT THE NORTHWEST CORNER OF SECTION 10-21-10 TO BEGIN THIS ROAD SURVEY

- 4) COMMISSIONER'S ROAD JOURNAL BOOK "B", PAGE 122

ON JANUARY 19, 1960, A PETITION SIGNED BY ALEX MURPHY AND OTHERS FOR THE **VACATION** OF TWO ROADS IN TOWNSHIP 21-10 WAS PRESENTED TO W. A. STOLFUS, COUNTY CLERK. THE ROAD WAS VIEWED BY THE COUNTY COMMISSIONERS AND W. D. KRETSINGER, COUNTY ENGINEER, ON FEBRUARY 16, 1960 AND THE FINAL ORDER WAS NOT DATED BUT THE VIEWERS REPORT WAS SIGNED BY ALL THREE MEMBERS OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS TO

VACATE THE FOLLOWING TWO ROADS:

- 1) ROAD NUMBER 1: BEGINNING AT THE NORTH ONE QUARTER (N1/4) CORNER OF SECTION 10-21-10, THENCE RUNNING WEST ONE AND ONE-HALF (1-1/2) MILES TO THE NORTHWEST CORNER OF SECTION 9-21-10 AND THERE ENDING.
- 2) ROAD NUMBER 2: BEGINNING AT THE NORTHEAST CORNER OF SECTION 9-21-10, THENCE RUNNING SOUTH ONE-HALF (1/2) MILE TO THE EAST 1/4 CORNER OF SAID SECTION, AND ENDING THERE.
