

NORTH 1/4 CORNER SECTION 19, TOWNSHIP 21 SOUTH, RANGE 10 EAST

- 1) ON PAGE 269 OF THE GLO ORIGINAL FIELD NOTES IN THE DRAFTING ROOM IN THE COUNTY ENGINEER'S OFFICE IT STATES THAT **THEY SET A LIMESTONE 19" X 12" X 3"** FOR THE 1/4 CORNER BETWEEN SECTIONS 18 & 19-21-10.
THE GOVERNMENT SURVEY NOTES SHOW THE FOLLOWING DISTANCES:
 - 1) 35.40 CHAINS WEST TO THE 20" X 20" X 2" LIMESTONE THEY SET FOR THE CORNER TO SECTIONS 18 & 19-21-10 ON THE WEST TOWNSHIP BOUNDARY AND THE COUNTY LINE
 - 2) 40.00 CHAINS EAST TO THE 24" X 12" X 4" SANDSTONE THEY SET FOR THE CORNER TO SECTIONS 17, 18, 19 & 20-21-10
- 2) R. H. EDMISTON, COUNTY SURVEYOR FROM 1884 TO 1887, IN SURVEY NUMBER 87, A ROAD SURVEY RECORDED IN SURVEY BOOK "E" ON PAGE 87 FOR A COUNTY ROAD IN TOWNSHIPS 20-10 AND 20-11 FOR J. C. DARR, PRINCIPAL PETITIONER, DATED FEBRUARY 25, 1885, SAID THAT **HE FOUND THE STONE** AT THE NORTH 1/4 CORNER OF SECTION 19-21-10. THIS PORTION OF ROAD WAS **REJECTED** BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS.
- 3) ARTHUR MILLIKEN, DEPUTY COUNTY SURVEYOR, IN A ROAD SURVEY FOR ROAD NUMBER 290 RECORDED IN ROAD RECORD BOOK "C" ON PAGES 110 TO 112 PETITIONED BY JOHN C. DARR AND OTHERS FOR 2 ROADS IN TOWNSHIP 20-11 [PACKET 527 IN THE VAULT IN THE COUNTY SURVEYOR'S OFFICE] THAT HE SURVEYED ON FEBRUARY 26, 1885, WAS ESTABLISHED AS A 50 FOOT WIDE ROAD FROM THE NORTHEAST CORNER OF SECTION 16-20-10 TO THE SOUTHEAST CORNER OF SECTION 30-20-10 – THE REST OF THE ROAD ON THE PETITION WAS **REJECTED** BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS ON JANUARY 9, 1885 AS NOTED BY JOHN L. BUTLER, CHAIRMAN OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS, AND RECORDED ON MAY 16, 1885 BY ROLAND LAKIN, COUNTY CLERK, SAID THAT **HE FOUND THE STONE** AT THE NORTH 1/4 CORNER OF SECTION 19-21-10. THIS PORTION OF ROAD WAS **REJECTED** BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS.
- 4) R. H. EDMISTON, COUNTY SURVEYOR FROM 1884 TO 1887, IN SURVEY NUMBER 111, A ROAD SURVEY RECORDED IN SURVEY BOOK "E" ON PAGE 111 FOR A ROAD IN TOWNSHIP 21-10 FOR G. I. JONES, PRINCIPAL PETITIONER, DATED JUNE 15, 1885, **APPARENTLY FOUND THE STONE** AT THE NORTH 1/4 CORNER OF SECTION 19-21-10 ON THIS ROAD SURVEY.
HIS SURVEY NOTES SHOWS THE FOLLOWING INFORMATION:
 - 1) THIS ROAD EXTENDS NORTH ON THE 1/4 SECTION LINE FOR 2 MILES TO THE STONE HE FOUND AT THE NORTH 1/4 CORNER OF SECTION 7-21-10; THEN EAST ON THE SECTION LINE FOR 1/2 MILE TO THE STONE HE FOUND AT THE SOUTHEAST CORNER OF SECTION 6-21-10; THEN NORTH ON THE SECTION LINES FOR 1 MILE TO THE STONE HE FOUND AT THE NORTHEAST CORNER OF SECTION 6-21-10 ON THE 4TH STANDARD PARALLEL TO BEGIN THIS ROAD SURVEY
 - 2) THIS ROAD EXTENDS SOUTH ON THE 1/4 SECTION LINE FOR 2 MILES TO THE STONE HE FOUND AT THE SOUTH 1/4 CORNER OF SECTION 30-21-10 AT THE TERMINUS OF THIS ROAD SURVEY
- 5) R. H. EDMISTON, COUNTY SURVEYOR FROM 1884 TO 1887, IN A ROAD SURVEY FOR ROAD NUMBER 301 RECORDED IN ROAD RECORD BOOK "C" ON PAGES 154 TO 156 PETITIONED BY G. P. JONES AND OTHERS FOR A COUNTY ROAD IN TOWNSHIP 21-10 THAT HE SURVEYED ON JUNE 15, 1885, WAS ESTABLISHED AS A 40 FOOT WIDE ROAD ON JULY 11, 1885 AS NOTED BY JOHN L. BUTLER, CHAIRMAN OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS, AND RECORDED ON JANUARY 22, 1886 BY ROLAND

LAKIN, COUNTY CLERK, APPARENTLY **FOUND THE STONE** AT THE NORTH 1/4 CORNER OF SECTION 19-21-10 ON THIS ROAD SURVEY.

HIS SURVEY NOTES SHOWS THE FOLLOWING INFORMATION:

- 1) THIS ROAD EXTENDS NORTH ON THE 1/4 SECTION LINE FOR 2 MILES TO THE STONE HE FOUND AT THE NORTH 1/4 CORNER OF SECTION 7-21-10; THEN EAST ON THE SECTION LINE FOR 1/2 MILE TO THE STONE HE FOUND AT THE SOUTHEAST CORNER OF SECTION 6-21-10; THEN NORTH ON THE SECTION LINES FOR 1 MILE TO THE STONE HE FOUND AT THE NORTHEAST CORNER OF SECTION 6-21-10 ON THE 4TH STANDARD PARALLEL TO BEGIN THIS ROAD SURVEY
- 2) THIS ROAD EXTENDS SOUTH ON THE 1/4 SECTION LINE FOR 2 MILES TO THE STONE HE FOUND AT THE SOUTH 1/4 CORNER OF SECTION 30-21-10 AT THE TERMINUS OF THIS ROAD SURVEY
