

NORTH 1/16TH CORNER OF THE NORTHWEST QUARTER OF SECTION 32, TOWNSHIP 21 SOUTH, RANGE 10 EAST

- 1) C. H. RICE, DEPUTY COUNTY SURVEYOR, IN A ROAD SURVEY RECORDED IN SURVEY BOOK "F" ON PAGE 31 DATED SEPTEMBER 5, 1882, FOR A ROAD IN TOWNSHIP 21, RANGE 10 FOR C. T. CAVANESS, PRINCIPAL PETITIONER, SAID THAT **HE FOUND THE STONE** AT THE SOUTHEAST CORNER OF THE SOUTHWEST 1/4 OF THE SOUTHWEST 1/4 OF SECTION 29-21-10 AT A TURN ON THIS ROAD SURVEY. THERE IS NO WIDTH RECORDED ON THIS ROAD SURVEY.
HIS SURVEY NOTES SHOWS THE FOLLOWING INFORMATION:
 - 1) THIS ROAD EXTENDS NORTH FOR 40 CHAINS TO THE ROAD STONE HE SET; THEN CONTINUES EAST ON THE 1/2 SECTION LINE FOR 20 CHAINS TO THE STONE HE SET MARKED "11 M" FOR THE CENTER CORNER OF SECTION 29-21-10; THEN CONTINUES EAST ON THE 1/2 SECTION LINE FOR 19.37 CHAINS TO THE STONE HE FOUND AT THE EAST 1/4 OF SECTION 29-21-10 AT THE TERMINUS OF THIS ROAD SURVEY [**NOTE:** HE APPARENTLY LEFT OUT 20 CHAINS BETWEEN THE EAST 1/4 CORNER AND THE CENTER CORNER OF SECTION 29-21-10 – WARREN CHIP WOODS, L.S. 603, COUNTY SURVEYOR]
 - 2) THIS ROAD EXTENDS WEST ON THE SECTION LINES FOR 20 CHAINS TO THE STONE HE FOUND AT THE NORTHEAST CORNER OF SECTION 31-21-10; THEN CONTINUES WEST ON THE SECTION LINES FOR 1 MILE TO THE STONE HE FOUND AT THE NORTHWEST CORNER OF SECTION 31-21-10 ON THE RANGE LINE AND LYON AND CHASE COUNTY LINE TO COMMENCE THIS ROAD SURVEY

- 2) ROBERT MILLIKEN, COUNTY SURVEYOR FROM 1870 TO 1875 AND FROM 1882 TO 1883, A ROAD SURVEY FOR ROAD NUMBER 188 RECORDED IN ROAD RECORD BOOK "B" ON PAGES 338 TO 340 PETITIONED BY CHARLES F. CAVANESS AND OTHERS FOR A COUNTY ROAD IN TOWNSHIP 21-10 [PACKET 411 IN THE VAULT IN THE COUNTY SURVEYOR'S OFFICE] THAT HE SURVEYED ON SEPTEMBER 5, 1882, WAS ESTABLISHED AS A 50 FOOT WIDE ROAD ON OCTOBER 7, 1882 AS NOTED BY HUGH F. HOLMES, CHAIRMAN OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS, AND RECORDED ON OCTOBER 25, 1882 BY WILLIAM F. EWING, COUNTY CLERK, SAID THAT **HE FOUND THE STONE** FOR THE SOUTHEAST CORNER OF THE SOUTHWEST 1/4 OF THE SOUTHWEST 1/4 OF SECTION 29-21-10 ON THIS ROAD SURVEY.
HIS NOTES SHOW THE FOLLOWING INFORMATION:
 - 3) THIS ROAD EXTENDS NORTH FOR 40 CHAINS TO THE ROAD STONE HE SET; THEN CONTINUES EAST ON THE 1/2 SECTION LINE FOR 20 CHAINS TO THE STONE HE SET MARKED "11 M" FOR THE CENTER CORNER OF SECTION 29-21-10; THEN CONTINUES EAST ON THE 1/2 SECTION LINE FOR 19.37 CHAINS TO THE STONE HE FOUND AT THE EAST 1/4 OF SECTION 29-21-10 AT THE TERMINUS OF THIS ROAD SURVEY [**NOTE:** HE APPARENTLY LEFT OUT 20 CHAINS BETWEEN THE EAST 1/4 CORNER AND THE CENTER CORNER OF SECTION 29-21-10 – WARREN CHIP WOODS, L.S. 603, COUNTY SURVEYOR]
 - 4) THIS ROAD EXTENDS WEST ON THE SECTION LINES FOR 20 CHAINS TO THE STONE HE FOUND AT THE NORTHEAST CORNER OF SECTION 31-21-10; THEN CONTINUES WEST ON THE SECTION LINES FOR 1 MILE TO THE STONE HE FOUND AT THE NORTHWEST CORNER OF SECTION 31-21-10 ON THE RANGE LINE AND LYON AND CHASE COUNTY LINE TO COMMENCE THIS ROAD SURVEY

- 3) R. H. EDMISTON, COUNTY SURVEYOR FROM 1884 TO 1887, IN SURVEY NUMBER 62, A ROAD SURVEY RECORDED IN SURVEY BOOK "E" ON PAGE 62 DATED SEPTEMBER 8, 1884 AT THE REQUEST OF A. S. SMITH FOR A ROAD IN TOWNSHIP 21, RANGE 10, SAID THAT **HE FOUND THE STONE** AT THE SOUTHEAST CORNER OF THE

SOUTHWEST 1/4 OF THE SOUTHWEST 1/4 OF SECTION 29-21-10 TO BEGIN THIS ROAD SURVEY FOR A 60 FOOT WIDE ROAD.

HIS SURVEY NOTES SHOWS THE FOLLOWING INFORMATION:

- 1) THIS ROAD EXTENDS EAST ON THE SECTION LINE FOR 440 FEET TO A ROAD STONE HE SET MARKED "R", THEN DIVERGES FROM THE SECTION LINE TO END THIS ROAD SURVEY AT THE STONE HE FOUND AT THE NORTHEAST CORNER OF SECTION 32-21-10
- 4) R. H. EDMISTON, COUNTY SURVEYOR FROM 1884 TO 1887, IN A ROAD SURVEY FOR ROAD NUMBER 274 RECORDED IN ROAD RECORD BOOK "C" ON PAGES 46 TO 48 PETITIONED BY A. S. SMITH AND OTHERS FOR THE VACATION AND RELOCATION OF A COUNTY ROAD IN TOWNSHIP 21-10 [PACKET 519 IN THE VAULT IN THE COUNTY SURVEYOR'S OFFICE] THAT HE SURVEYED ON SEPTEMBER 8, 1884, WAS ESTABLISHED AS A 60 FOOT WIDE ROAD ON OCTOBER 10, 1884, AS NOTED BY P. Y. HALLBERG, CHAIRMAN OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS, AND RECORDED ON DECEMBER 9, 1884 BY ROLAND LAKIN, COUNTY CLERK, SAID THAT **HE FOUND THE STONE** AT THE SOUTHEAST CORNER OF THE SOUTHWEST 1/4 OF THE SOUTHWEST 1/4 OF SECTION 29-21-10 TO BEGIN THIS ROAD SURVEY.
- HIS SURVEY NOTES SHOWS THE FOLLOWING INFORMATION:
- 1) THIS ROAD EXTENDS EAST ON THE SECTION LINES FOR 440 FEET TO A ROAD STONE HE SET; THEN GOES THROUGH A SERIES OF ANGLES TO INTERSECT THE SECTION LINES AT 800 FEET WEST OF THE NORTHEAST CORNER OF SECTION 32-21-10; THEN EXTENDS EAST ON THE SECTION LINES FOR 800 FEET TO THE NORTHEAST CORNER OF SECTION 32-21-10 AT THE TERMINUS OF THIS ROAD SURVEY
 - 2) THE ROAD **VACATED** BEGINS AT THIS CORNER AND EXTENDS NORTH FOR 1/2 MILE; THEN EXTEND EAST ON THE 1/2 SECTION LINE TO INTERSECT THE EAST LINE OF SECTION 29-21-10
