

NORTHWEST CORNER SECTION 32, TOWNSHIP 21 SOUTH, RANGE 10 EAST

- 1) ON PAGE 265 OF THE GLO ORIGINAL FIELD NOTES IN THE DRAFTING ROOM IN THE COUNTY ENGINEER'S OFFICE IT STATES THAT **THEY SET A LIMESTONE 30" X 8" X 3"** FOR THE CORNER TO SECTIONS 29, 30, 31 & 32-21-10.
THE GOVERNMENT SURVEY NOTES SHOW THE FOLLOWING INFORMATION:
 - 1) 39.93-1/2 CHAINS EAST TO THE 34" X 13" X 3-1/2" LIMESTONE THEY SET AT **50 LINKS SOUTH OF THE POINT FOR THE TRUE 1/4 CORNER BETWEEN SECTIONS 29 & 32 AS THE TRUE 1/4 CORNER POSITION FALLS IN A CREEK**
 - 2) 79.87 CHAINS EAST TO THE 27" X 15" X 3" LIMESTONE THEY SET FOR THE CORNER TO SECTIONS 28, 29, 32 & 33-21-10

- 2) C. H. RICE, DEPUTY COUNTY SURVEYOR, IN A ROAD SURVEY RECORDED IN SURVEY BOOK "F" ON PAGE 31 DATED SEPTEMBER 5, 1882, FOR A ROAD IN TOWNSHIP 21, RANGE 10 FOR C. T. CAVANESS, PRINCIPAL PETITIONER, SAID THAT **HE FOUND THE STONE** AT THE NORTHEAST CORNER OF SECTION 31-21-10 ON THIS ROAD SURVEY. THERE IS NO WIDTH RECORDED ON THIS ROAD SURVEY.
HIS SURVEY NOTES SHOWS THE FOLLOWING DISTANCES:
 - 1) THIS ROAD EXTENDS EAST FOR 20 CHAINS TO THE STONE HE FOUND AT THE SOUTHEAST CORNER OF THE SW1/4 OF THE SW1/4 OF SECTION 29-21-10; THEN CONTINUES NORTH FOR 40 CHAINS TO THE ROAD STONE HE SET; THEN CONTINUES EAST ON THE 1/2 SECTION LINE FOR 20 CHAINS TO THE STONE HE SET MARKED "11 M" FOR THE CENTER CORNER OF SECTION 29-21-10; THEN CONTINUES EAST ON THE 1/2 SECTION LINE FOR 19.37 CHAINS TO THE STONE HE FOUND AT THE EAST 1/4 OF SECTION 29-21-10 AT THE TERMINUS OF THIS ROAD SURVEY [**NOTE:** HE APPARENTLY LEFT OUT 20 CHAINS BETWEEN THE EAST 1/4 CORNER AND THE CENTER CORNER OF SECTION 29-21-10 – WARREN CHIP WOODS, L.S. 603, COUNTY SURVEYOR]
 - 2) THIS ROAD EXTENDS WEST ON THE SECTION LINES FOR 1 MILE TO THE STONE HE FOUND AT THE NORTHWEST CORNER OF SECTION 31-21-10 ON THE RANGE LINE AND THE LYON AND CHASE COUNTY LINE TO COMMENCE THIS ROAD SURVEY

- 3) ROBERT MILLIKEN, COUNTY SURVEYOR FROM 1870 TO 1875 AND FROM 1882 TO 1883, A ROAD SURVEY FOR ROAD NUMBER 188 RECORDED IN ROAD RECORD BOOK "B" ON PAGES 338 TO 340 PETITIONED BY CHARLES F. CAVANESS AND OTHERS FOR A COUNTY ROAD IN TOWNSHIP 21-10 [PACKET 411 IN THE VAULT IN THE COUNTY SURVEYOR'S OFFICE] THAT HE SURVEYED ON SEPTEMBER 5, 1882, WAS ESTABLISHED AS A 50 FOOT WIDE ROAD ON OCTOBER 7, 1882 AS NOTED BY HUGH F. HOLMES, CHAIRMAN OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS, AND RECORDED ON OCTOBER 25, 1882 BY WILLIAM F. EWING, COUNTY CLERK, SAID THAT **HE FOUND THE STONE** AT THE SOUTHEAST CORNER OF SECTION 31-21-10 ON THIS ROAD SURVEY.
HIS NOTES SHOW THE FOLLOWING INFORMATION:
 - 3) THIS ROAD EXTENDS EAST FOR 20 CHAINS TO THE STONE HE FOUND AT THE SOUTHEAST CORNER OF THE SW1/4 OF THE SW1/4 OF SECTION 29-21-10; THEN CONTINUES NORTH FOR 40 CHAINS TO THE ROAD STONE HE SET; THEN CONTINUES EAST ON THE 1/2 SECTION LINE FOR 20 CHAINS TO THE STONE HE SET MARKED "11 M" FOR THE CENTER CORNER OF SECTION 29-21-10; THEN CONTINUES EAST ON THE 1/2 SECTION LINE FOR 19.37 CHAINS TO THE STONE HE FOUND AT THE EAST 1/4 OF SECTION 29-21-10 AT THE TERMINUS OF THIS ROAD SURVEY [**NOTE:** HE APPARENTLY LEFT OUT 20 CHAINS BETWEEN THE EAST 1/4 CORNER AND THE CENTER CORNER OF SECTION 29-21-10 – WARREN CHIP WOODS, L.S. 603, COUNTY SURVEYOR]
 - 4) THIS ROAD EXTENDS WEST ON THE SECTION LINES FOR 1 MILE TO THE STONE HE FOUND AT THE NORTHWEST CORNER OF SECTION 31-21-10 ON THE RANGE
