

CENTER CORNER OF SECTION 35, TOWNSHIP 21 SOUTH, RANGE 10 EAST

- 1) MATTHEW BROWN, COUNTY SURVEYOR FROM 1888 TO 1900, AND 1914, IN SURVEY NUMBER 170, A **PERMANENT SURVEY** RECORDED IN SURVEY BOOK "F" ON PAGE 134 DATED JULY 16-20, 1888 AT THE REQUEST OF L. NEWMAN TO ESTABLISH THE CORNERS OF THE NORTHEAST 1/4 AND THE LINE BETWEEN THE SOUTHEAST 1/4 AND THE SOUTHWEST 1/4 OF SECTION 35-21-10, SAID THAT **HE SET A 24" X 6" X 4" LIMESTONE MARKED WITH A PLUS ("+") NEAR THE BOTTOM ON THE WEST SIDE** FOR THE PERMANENT CENTER CORNER OF SECTION 35-21-10 AT THE INTERSECTION OF THE LINES FROM THE OPPOSITE 1/4 CORNERS ON THIS **PERMANENT SURVEY**.
- 2) THE KRETSINGER REFERENCE TIE BOOK FOR TOWNSHIP 21-10 SHOWS A **STONE** AT THE "C1/4 CORNER SECTION 35-21-10".
 - 1) 16.5' EAST OF THE SOUTH END OF A HEDGE
 - 2) THE STONE IS 8" UNDER THE GROUND BY A CORNER FENCE POST
