

NORTHWEST CORNER SECTION 27, TOWNSHIP 21 SOUTH, RANGE 12 EAST

- 1) ON PAGE 577 OF THE GLO ORIGINAL FIELD NOTES IN THE DRAFTING ROOM IN THE COUNTY ENGINEER'S OFFICE IT STATES THAT **THEY SET A LIMESTONE 24" X 14" X 3"** FOR THE CORNER TO SECTIONS 21, 22, 27 & 28-21-12.
THE GOVERNMENT SURVEY NOTES SHOW THE FOLLOWING INFORMATION:
 - 1) 39.70 CHAINS EAST TO THE 18" X 12" X 3" LIMESTONE THEY SET FOR THE 1/4 CORNER BETWEEN SECTIONS 22 & 27-21-12
 - 2) 79.40 CHAINS EAST TO THE 24" X 16" X 3" LIMESTONE THEY SET FOR THE CORNER TO SECTIONS 22, 23, 26 & 27-21-12

- 2) J. H. HIBBEN, COUNTY SURVEYOR FROM 1875 TO 1882, IN A ROAD SURVEY FOR ROAD NUMBER 104 RECORDED IN ROAD RECORD BOOK "B" ON PAGES 2 TO 4 FOR PETITIONED BY B. WIELAND AND OTHERS FOR TWO COUNTY ROADS IN TOWNSHIP 21-12 [PACKET 346 IN THE VAULT IN THE COUNTY SURVEYOR'S OFFICE] THAT HE SURVEYED ON DECEMBER 8, 1880, WERE ESTABLISHED AT 50 FOOT WIDE FOR THE NORTH AND SOUTH ROAD AND 40 FOOT WIDE FOR THE EAST AND WEST ROAD ON JANUARY 10, 1881 AS NOTED BY J. M. GRIFFITH, CHAIRMAN OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS, AND RECORDED ON MAY 4, 1881 BY WILLIAM F. EWING, COUNTY CLERK, APPARENTLY **FOUND THE STONE** AT THE SOUTHEAST CORNER OF SECTION 21-21-12 ON THE SECOND ROAD ON THIS ROAD SURVEY.
HIS SURVEY NOTES SHOWS THE FOLLOWING INFORMATION:
 - 1) THIS SECOND ROAD EXTENDS EAST ON THE SECTION LINES FOR 1 MILE TO THE SOUTHEAST CORNER OF SECTION 22-21-12 TO COMMENCE THE SECOND ROAD ON THIS ROAD SURVEY
 - 2) THIS SECOND ROAD EXTENDS WEST ON THE SECTION LINES FOR 2 MILES TO THE SOUTHWEST CORNER OF SECTION 20-21-12 AT THE TERMINUS OF THE SECOND ROAD ON THIS ROAD SURVEY

- 2) J. H. HIBBEN, COUNTY SURVEYOR FROM 1875 TO 1882, IN A ROAD SURVEY FOR ROAD NUMBER 130 RECORDED IN ROAD RECORD BOOK "B" ON PAGES 106 TO 108 PETITIONED BY J. P. ROSS AND OTHERS FOR A COUNTY ROAD IN TOWNSHIP 21-12 THAT HE SURVEYED ON SEPTEMBER 30, 1881, WAS ESTABLISHED AS A 40 FOOT WIDE ROAD TO THE SECTION LINE AND THEN 50 FOOT WIDE FROM THE SECTION LINE SOUTH ON OCTOBER 5, 1881 AS NOTED BY J. M. GRIFFITH, CHAIRMAN OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS, AND RECORDED ON OCTOBER 14, 1881 BY WILLIAM F. EWING, COUNTY CLERK, SAID THAT **HE FOUND THE STONE** AT THE SOUTHEAST CORNER OF SECTION 21-21-12 ON THIS ROAD SURVEY.
HIS SURVEY NOTES SHOWS THE FOLLOWING INFORMATION:
 - 1) THIS 50' WIDE ROAD EXTENDS NORTH ON THE SECTION LINES TO THE 1/4 CORNER ON THE EAST LINE OF SECTION 4-21-12; THEN CONTINUES WEST ON THE 1/2 SECTION LINE AS A 40 FOOT WIDE ROAD FOR 800 FEET; THEN EXTENDS NORTHERLY TO THE 1/4 CORNER ON THE SOUTH LINE OF SECTION 33-20-12 ON THE 4TH STANDARD PARALLEL TO COMMENCE THIS ROAD SURVEY
 - 2) THEN CONTINUES SOUTH ON THE SECTION LINES AS A 50 FOOT WIDE ROAD TO THE SOUTHEAST CORNER OF SECTION 33-21-12 ON THE LYON AND GREENWOOD COUNTY LINE AT THE TERMINUS OF THIS ROAD SURVEY

- 4) J. H. HIBBEN, COUNTY SURVEYOR FROM 1875 TO 1882, IN A ROAD SURVEY RECORDED IN SURVEY BOOK "C" ON THE RIGHT PAGE 225 DATED SEPTEMBER 30, 1881, FOR A ROAD SURVEY IN TOWNSHIP 21-12 SAID THAT **HE FOUND THE STONE** AT THE SOUTHEAST CORNER OF SECTION 21-21-12 ON THIS ROAD SURVEY
HIS SURVEY NOTES SHOWS THE FOLLOWING INFORMATION:
 - 1) THIS 50' WIDE ROAD EXTENDS NORTH ON THE SECTION LINES TO THE 1/4 CORNER ON THE EAST LINE OF SECTION 4-21-12; THEN CONTINUES WEST ON

THE 1/2 SECTION LINE AS A 40 FOOT WIDE ROAD FOR 800 FEET; THEN EXTENDS NORTHERLY TO THE 1/4 CORNER ON THE SOUTH LINE OF SECTION 33-20-12 ON THE 4TH STANDARD PARALLEL TO COMMENCE THIS ROAD SURVEY

- 2) THEN CONTINUES SOUTH ON THE SECTION LINES AS A 50 FOOT WIDE ROAD TO THE SOUTHEAST CORNER OF SECTION 33-21-12 ON THE LYON AND GREENWOOD COUNTY LINE AT THE TERMINUS OF THIS ROAD SURVEY

5) COMMISSIONER'S ROAD JOURNAL BOOK "A", PAGE 116

ON FEBRUARY 20, 1931 A PETITION SIGNED BY C. R. MARTIN AND OTHERS FOR THE VACATION OF TWO ROADS IN TOWNSHIP 21-12 WAS PRESENTED TO THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS. THE ROAD WAS VIEWED ON MARCH 2, 1931, AND THE FINAL ORDER WAS ISSUED ON MARCH, 1931 THAT THE ROADS BE VACATED AS PETITIONED FOR:

- 1) BEGINNING AT THE SOUTHEAST CORNER OF SECTION 21-21-12; THENCE NORTH ON THE SECTION LINE ON THE EAST SIDE OF SECTION 21 ONE-HALF MILE, WHICH IS ALSO ALONG THE WEST SIDE OF SECTION 22, ALL IN TOWNSHIP 21, RANGE 12
- 2) ALSO BEGINNING AT THE SOUTHEAST CORNER OF THE NORTHEAST 1/4 OF SECTION 21-21-12; THENCE NORTH 1/4 MILE, TERMINATING AT THE SE1/4 [SOUTHEAST CORNER] OF THE N1/2 [OF THE NORTHEAST 1/4] OF SECTION 21-21-12 AND THERE ENDING AND TERMINATING AT THE SOUTHEAST CORNER OF THE CORNER [OF THE NORTH 1/2] OF THE NE1/4 OF SECTION 21-21-12
- 3) SAID ROAD SHOULD BE VACATED, SAME NOT BEING USED BY THE PUBLIC NOR BEING WORKED BY THE TOWNSHIP

- 6) O. D. HENRY, COUNTY SURVEYOR, IN A ROAD SURVEY FOR ROAD NUMBER 749 RECORDED IN ROAD RECORD BOOK "E" ON PAGE 109 PETITIONED BY C. R. MARTIN AND OTHERS FOR THE VACATION OF A ROAD IN TOWNSHIP 21-12 THAT WAS VIEWED BY THE COUNTY COMMISSIONERS AND THE COUNTY SURVEYOR ON MARCH 2, 1931, THE VIEWERS RECOMMENDED THAT THE ROAD SHOULD BE VACATED AS THE ROAD IS NOT BEING USED BY THE PUBLIC, NOR BEING WORKED BY THE TOWNSHIP. THIS ROAD VACATION ENDED AT THE SOUTHEAST CORNER OF THE NORTH HALF OF SECTION 21-21-12

THE FOLLOWING ROAD WAS VACATED:

- 1) BEGINNING AT THE SOUTHEAST CORNER OF SECTION 21-21-12; FROM THENCE NORTH ON THE SECTION LINE ON THE EAST LINE OF SECTION 21 FOR ONE-HALF MILE, WHICH IS ALSO ALONG THE WEST SIDE OF SECTION 22, AND ALSO BEGINNING AT THE SOUTHEAST CORNER OF THE NE1/4 OF SECTION 21-21-12; THENCE NORTH ONE-FOURTH MILE AND TERMINATING AT THE SE1/4 OF THE NORTH HALF [OF THE NORTHEAST 1/4] OF SECTION 21-21-12 AND THERE ENDING
- 2) THIS VACATED ROAD EXTENDS NORTH ON THE SECTION LINES FOR 3/4 OF A MILE TO THE SOUTHEAST CORNER OF THE N1/2 OF [THE NORTHEAST 1/4] OF SECTION 21-21-12
